Campaign for increased use of vehicle alternatives for transportation like bicycles, buses, carpooling.

Campaign to reduce use of gas-fueled power tools

Develop ever more water-saving practices

change in hot water plumbing options to preserve water

Training community members to help out with relief services--high schoolers want to help if we have training!

Educate on water-saving practices.

Educate about need for, and find subsidies for switching to all-electric buildings.

Reduce vehicle miles traveled, buy an EV if you can, walk and bike!

The Solution to THE Problem will include City AND Citizen groups. ie. the City can't do it all.

consider containers when buying food, household items- are they recyclable? Can you minimize waste.

Transit--most students I talk with don't use public transit because it's very unreliable. I know SCT is county-wide, but are there ways the city can advocate for improvements?

consider roundabouts to minimize traffic stops= reduced pollution

What do you think the City and/or residents should do to reduce our emissions?

Each City dept should adopt Climate criteria in their operations.

digital sobriety

Educate about the need to reduce use of natural gas

publicize strategies for measuring personal energy/waste/water usage

Making sure all climate meetings and climate disaster-related info is in multiple languages.

Connect/network with organizations that focus on needs/concerns of Hispanic population, Indigenous, homeless, populations

Reach out to all members of the community, including apartment dwellers, homeless, non-English speaking folks.
