SEBASTOPOL CITY COUNCIL ELECTS NEW MAYOR AND VICE MAYOR

At the opening of its October 5th meeting, the Sebastopol City Council elected Vice Mayor Diana Gardner Rich as mayor and Councilmember Stephen Zollman as vice mayor for the next year. Outgoing Mayor Neysa Hinton, who will now serve as a regular city councilmember, delivered parting remarks reflecting upon the achievements and challenges of the past year.

In Mayor Rich's incoming message as Sebastopol's new mayor she stated, "I love this city council and I will be happy to lead them into this next year...I feel like I've had incredible training being the vice mayor—thank you, Mayor [Hinton]—and also feel that it's an opportunity to take the various skills that this city has allowed me to develop in the last four years."

HELP SEBASTOPOL UPDATE ITS BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN MASTER PLAN - DEC. 14TH

The Sonoma County Transportation Authority (SCTA) is currently creating the Sonoma County Active Transportation Plan (ATP) previously known as the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan. The ATP will focus on increasing access to active transportation modes by planning for infrastructure projects and supportive programs. Active transportation comes in various forms including cycling,



walking, and rolling. SCTA is partnering with Cloverdale, Cotati, Healdsburg, Rohnert Park, Sebastopol, Sonoma, and Unincorporated Sonoma County to create a community-informed Active Transportation Plan.

The City of Sebastopol Planning Department, in collaboration with Analy High School Integrated Climate Studies & AHS Social Studies Department, Bike Sebastopol, Sebastopol Carbon Conversations, will be holding an additional outreach event to gather information from the public to include their thoughts, ideas, and recommendations for the Sebastopol specific ATP. The planning team needs your input to identify needs, barriers, and opportunities to ensure a successful ATP and extends this invitation to youth and school communities (both students and faculty) as well as the general public. *As part of the data collection we are encouraging participants to bring a smartphone or laptop for real time polling/survey input. *

She is coordinator of the residents' group, a prime mover in all art-related activities and involved in almost everything happening at BHO. One of her greatest contributions is



managing our Zero Waste Shed. We have had the Zero Waste Shed for close to two years. Lauralee personally takes most of the recyclables to be recycled. Residents bring many kinds of recyclables to the shed. They are collected in the shed and then properly recycled.

WINTER HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS



Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

HOLIDAY DECORATING

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.



HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- · Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.



Before Heading Out or to Bed

Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

FACTS

- More than one-third of home decoration fires are started by candles.
- More than **two of every five** decoration

 fires happen because

 decorations are placed

 too close to a heat source.

CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY TIPS



As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.



PICKING THE TREE

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.



PLACING THE TREE

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water



LIGHTING THE TREE

- Use lights that are listed by a qualified testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.



After Christmas

Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry. Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage, or placed outside against the

Check with your local community to find a recycling program.

Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- (!) Almost one third of home Christmas tree fires are caused by electrical problems.
- (!) Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- (!) A heat source too close to the tree causes more than one in every five of the fires.
