My name is Alex Freedman, and as a Sebastopol resident and American Jew, I am writing to urge city council members to support a permanent ceasefire resolution.

As a Jewish person, I find it unconscionable that the world would stand by and allow the ongoing violence and human rights violations perpetrated in Gaza. The death, starvation, and displacement of civilian non-combatants, children, and families is not justifiable, and we can act now by supporting long-term peace solutions.
