### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

CLIMATE ACTION COMMITTEE - 2 YEAR TERM

The Climate Action Committee promotes initiatives related to climate change issues and makes recommendations to Council. There is currently one opening on the committee. Vacancies are available under the variety of experiences and/or characteristics approved for the Committee makeup at their March 18, 2025, Council meeting.

### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

The Climate Action Committee is regularly scheduled to meet the second Tuesday of each month from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the Sebastopol City Hall Conference Room at 7120 Bodega Avenue, Sebastopol, CA. This appointment is to fill the vacant position with a term ending date of December 31st, 2026.

For terms ending December 31, 2025, a separate recruitment period and appointment will be coming up at a later date.

On March 18, 2025, the City Council reviewed a proposal to reconfigure the makeup of the Committee and directed staff to update the Committee composition to include 7 members from the following backgrounds:

- 1. One City Councilmember Liaison (at large)
- 2. Six members with one or more of the following experiences/characteristics:
  - Youth representative
  - Climate Change
  - Sebastopol Business Owner
  - Local Climate Action Group
  - Environmental Justice and Equity
  - Rights of Nature
  - Energy
  - Transportation
  - Zero Waste
