GOING TO BE ABOUT HOW THEY JUST FUNDED A NEW SQUARE IN -- AND A NEW POST OFFICE AND COMMUNITY ROOM IN RIO -- BUT ALWAYS SEEM TO GET IS A LOT OF FIRM HOMELESS PEOPLE ARE PEOPLE WITH PSYCHOLOGICAL PROBLEMS AND DRUG PROBLEMS AND SO ON AND SO FORTH AND THE SENIOR CENTER IS A REALLY GOOD EXAMPLE OF THIS BECAUSE MY WIFE ACTUALLY DRIVE TO THE SENIOR CENTER, SHE'S ACTUALLY GOING TO DRIVE A COUPLE PEOPLE TOMORROW BACKWARDS AND FORWARDS TO THE CITY WHICH IS GREAT BUT THERE IS NO DISTINCTION. IT SAYS SEBASTOPOL BEHIND YOU, DOES NOT SAY THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL, THERE IS THIS TOTAL BLURRING ALL THE TIME OF WHO PAYS FOR WHAT. SO, THE SENIOR CENTER IS A CASE AND POINT, I KNOW A LOT OF PEOPLE WHO USE THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL SENIOR CENTER DO NOT LIVE IN THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL. AND AS A TAXPAYER I PAY FOR IT. SO, I WOULD AGAIN SAY TO THE COUNCIL, YOU'VE GOT A PRESSURE THE COUNTY TO PUT A LOT MORE TIME AND ENERGY AND MONEY INTO THE CITY, RATHER THAN JUST USING THE CITY AS A RESOURCE AND NOT ACTUALLY CONTRIBUTING TO IT FINANCIALLY BECAUSE WE ARE GOING TO BE TALKING ABOUT THE BUDGET LATER ON TODAY AND WE ARE GETTING SWAMPED, IT IS CRAZY. AND THE PREVIOUS COMMENT BY THE OTHER GUY JUST NOW ABOUT THE WATER OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE, THINK THAT WAS DISCUSSED BEFORE, REALLY IMPORTANT AND I THINK THAT SHOULD BE BROUGHT BACK AND TAKEN A LOT MORE SERIOUSLY. I THINK CITIZENS SHOULD BE ON THAT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE BECAUSE IT HAS BEEN A MESS IN THE PAST. AGAIN, IT IS TOO MUCH PRESSURE ON THE COUNCIL, YOU KNOW, YOU GUYS HAVE TO DO TOO MUCH. SO, I GUESS THAT IS MY COMMENT, THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXTEL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM, ROBERT, CAN YOU AND YOURSELF, PLEASE? ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF? THERE YOU GO, CAN HEAR US OKAY?

I THINK SO. BE TOO GREAT, GO AHEAD WITH YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT I WILL JUMP IN WHEN YOU HAVE ABOUT 30 SECONDS LEFT.

OKAY. I'VE A QUICK COMMENT/QUESTION/SUGGESTION FOR THE CITY COUNCIL. WHAT ARE YOU GUYS DOING TO COMPENSATE MARY FOR THE EXTRA WORK THAT SHE IS DOING AS A CITY MANAGER? CLICK IT WILL BE SIX OR SEVEN MONTHS BEFORE HE IS REPLACED OR WHAT ARE YOU DOING TO MAKE HER JOB EASIER? HAS ANYBODY CONSIDERED FUNDING AT TEMP FOR SOME OF THE CITY CLERK WORK, FOR EXAMPLE, I AM NOT TELLING YOU WHAT TO DO. YOU GUYS ARE MUCH CLOSER TO THE ISSUE THAN I AM BUT YOU SHOULD BE DOING SOMETHING AND THANKS TO MARY. THAT IS IT.

THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT I WILL COME BACK INTO THE CHAMBERS.

HI, I'M GARY BATCHELOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF THE SEBASTOPOL AREA SENIOR CENTER. I'M SURE YOU'VE HEARD ABOUT THAT, ABOUT THE SENIOR CENTER AND THE ISSUE OF SPACE. SO FAR THIS YEAR 29,000 PEOPLE HAVE COME THROUGH THE SENIOR CENTER AND IT IS PRESENTING, OBVIOUSLY, SOME CHALLENGES. WE ARE MORE THAN WILLING TO WORK WITH THE CITY, TO WORK WITH OTHER NONPROFIT, TO PUT TOGETHER ANY KIND OF A PLAN THAT WE NEED TO, TO AUGMENT OUR SPACE AND TO COLLABORATE WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS. WHAT WE NEED IS A LITTLE BIT OF GUIDANCE ON WHERE TO START BECAUSE IF WE DO NOT HAVE THAT WE ARE JUST GOING TO GO OFF ON OUR OWN. SO, THAT IS ALL I HAVE TO SAY, I APPRECIATE YOUR SUPPORT AND I LOOK FORWARD TO HEARING FROM YOU. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, GARY. NEXTEL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM, IF THERE IS ANYONE ON ZOOM THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT FOR AN ITEM NOT ON TONIGHT'S AGENDA, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SINGING ON, I'LL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS. IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT ON AN ITEM NOT ON TODAY'S AGENDA. SEEING NONE, PUBLIC COMMENT IS CLOSED.

THANK YOU, MARY. WE'RE MOVING ON TO CONSENT CALENDAR CALENDAR AND THERE ARE SEVERAL. THERE WITH ME. NUMBER ONE, APPROVAL THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES, SPECIAL MEETING CLOSED SESSION, MEETING MINUTES OF MAY 19th. THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT ASSOCIATED WITH APPROVAL BESIDE HIM. NUMBER TWO, APPROVAL OF CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES, REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF MAY 20th. AGAIN NO FISCAL IMPACT. NUMBER THREE, APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION FOR JUNE 25 IS PRIDE MONTH THROUGHOUT THE CITY, REFLECTING THE CITY'S COMMITMENT TO INCLUSIVITY, AUTHORIZING THE FLYING OF THE PRIDE FLAG OVER CITY HALL DURING JUNE OF 2025 AND AUTHORIZING USE OF PRIVATE COLORS IN THE CITY LOGO AND COMMUNICATIONS DURING JUNE 2025. THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT ASSOCIATED WITH THIS ITEM. NUMBER FOUR, APPROVAL OF PERSONAL OPTIONS AS RECOMMENDED BY THE CLASSIFICATION, COMPENSATION AND STAFF ASSESSMENT STUDY REVISED APPROVING A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACTING CITY MANAGER TO REVISE THE FOLLOWING CLASSIFICATIONS OF WHICH THERE ARE FOUR. RETITLE AND REVISE CLASSIFICATIONS OF WHICH THERE ARE TWO AND C, AUTHORIZE FUTURE NON-SUBSTANTIVE REVISIONS AND CORRECTIONS. THE FISCAL IMPACT, THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT TO RE-TITLING OR REVISING CLASSIFICATION AND SPECIFICATIONS. NUMBER FIVE, APPROVAL OF ANNUAL UPDATES, SCHEDULE OF USER AND REGULATORY FEES FOR USE IN FISCAL YEAR 2025 TO 2026. THIS INCLUDES THE INFLATIONARY FACTOR OF 2.76% THAT WAS PREVIOUSLY APPROVED BY CITY COUNCIL ON SEPTEMBER 15th OF 2020. THE CITY'S FEE SCHEDULE IS A COMPILATION OF FEES OF CITY SERVICES PROVIDED TO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC. UPDATING THE CITIES USER AND REGULATORY FEES INCLUDE ASSURING FEES ARE SET BASED ON CURRENT COSTS AND APPROVED COST RECOVERY OBJECTIVES WHILE PROVIDING TRANSPARENCY IN THE FEE STRUCTURE FOR THE CITY'S DEVELOPMENT -RELATED AND OTHER MISCIBLE FEES. THE FISCAL IMPACT IS \$40,000 INCREASE TO THE GENERAL FUND. NUMBER SIX, APPROVAL OF WAIVING OF FIRST READING, INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE OF THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL FIRE HAZARD SEVERITY MAP. AND THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT ASSOCIATED WITH THIS ITEM. NUMBER SEVEN, APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET AMENDMENT FOR VIDEO SECURITY SYSTEM FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT. THIS ITEM IS THE REQUEST OF THE CITY COUNCIL TO CONSIDER AND APPROVE A BUDGET AMENDMENT REQUEST FOR THE PURCHASE AND REPLACEMENT OF ANTIQUATED VIDEO SECURITY SYSTEM FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. AND THE COST ASSOCIATED WITH THIS IS \$46,008.42, REQUESTED FOR THE REMOVAL OF THE POLICE, REQUESTED TO BE MOVED FROM THE POLICE ENDOWMENT FUND ACCOUNT TO REIMBURSED THE LINE ITEM IN THE GENERAL BUDGET AND THAT IS THE EXTENT OF THE CONSENT CALENDAR. DO ANY OF MY COLLEAGUES WISH TO PULL ANY OF THESE ITEMS, LOOKING TO MY RIGHT? LOOKING TO MY LEFT, SEEING NONE. MARY, PUBLIC COMMENT?

THANK YOU, THIS IS PUBLIC COMMENT ON CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS ONE THROUGH SEVEN. IF YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, AGAIN THE PROCESS IS TWO MINUTES, I WILL GO TO CHAMBERS FIRST AND THEN GO OUT TO ZOOM. IF

THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS I WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, SEEING NONE I WILL GO OUT TO ZOOM. ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? THANK YOU, I WILL JUMP IN WHEN YOU HAVE ABOUT 30 SECONDS LEFT. OKAY. I DON'T THINK THAT RECEIVING A HAZARD MAP SHOULD BE SOMETHING THAT IS BURIED IN THE CONSENT CALENDAR. THIS IS THE FIRST TIME IN THE HISTORY OF SEBASTOPOL WE HAVE BEEN AT AN IDENTIFIED FIRE RISK. IT IS DOWNPLAYED IN THE STAFF REPORT BECAUSE IT IS ONLY 300 ACRES AND IT IS NOT SEVERE BUT THE REALITY IS IF YOU LOOK AT THE REPORT AND THE MAP IT IS THE ENTIRE EASTERN AND WESTERN PERIMETER OF THE CITY THAT HAS UPPED THE RISK AND I AM PARTICULARLY WORRIED ABOUT THE SIDE BECAUSE WE HAVE WINDSTORMS THE WIND COMES FROM THE EAST AND NORTHEAST. THERE IS A FIRE IN THE LAGOON OR THE WOODED AREAS TO THE SOUTH OF PARK VILLAGE THERE AND THOSE FIRES START TO SPREAD. I ASSUME YOU ARE SAYING MODERATE RISK BECAUSE THERE IS MORE STUFF THERE TO BURN. THEY SPREAD TO THE CITY AND IT WON'T TAKE LONG BEFORE IT IS IN THE CITY. ACCORDING TO THAT MAP, THE FIRE RISK EXTENDS ALL THE WAY TO THE HIGH SCHOOL ON THE NORTH END AND IT EXTENDS ALL THE WAY ACROSS THE NORTHBOUND 116 IN THE SEVEN AN. I THINK THIS IS A BIG DEAL, PARTICULARLY GIVEN THAT OUR FIRE SERVICE HAS BEEN TRANSITIONED REALLY RECENTLY, I THINK IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO HAVE A, HAVE THE FIRE CHIEF EXPLAINED WHAT THIS MEANS AND HOW WILL BE DEALT WITH AND MANAGED AND IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO HAVE THE POLICE CHIEF TALK ABOUT EVACUATIONS GIVEN IF THAT HAPPENED THAT ONE 12 AND 116 PROBABLY WOULD NOT BE AVAILABLE, HOW DO WE GET PEOPLE OUT OF THE CITY? IT WOULD BE HELPFUL TO HAVE PUBLIC WORKS TALK ABOUT IT. HAS ANYBODY WALKED THAT WILDLAND PERIMETER, THAT URBAN INTERFACE DOWN THE BACKSIDE OF 116 THERE TO SEE IF WE HAVE ENOUGH CLEAR AREA TO PREVENT FIRES FROM SPREADING TO PLACES LIKE FIRCREST VILLAGE, THE MOBILE HOME PARK, THE HOSPITAL AREA.

ROBERT, YOU HAVE ABOUT 25 SECONDS.

THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT THEY WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS I WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, KYLE?

I'M GOING TO USE FLEXIBILITY, I'M COMMENTING ON THE MINUTES FROM THE LAST MEETING, I CAN MAKE SOME COMMENTARY ABOUT THE WAY THIS COUNCIL HAS CHOSEN TO NOT ACTIVELY RESPOND TO PUBLIC COMMENT FOR ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MEETING. HISTORICAL PRACTICE WOULD BE THAT THERE WOULD BE ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE FOLKS AT OF TAKEN THE TIME TO COME TO THIS MEETING AND SPEAK TO YOU ALL ABOUT ITEMS OF CONCERN THAT ARE NOT AGENDIZED. THERE ARE BROWN ACTA LIMITATIONS ON WHAT CAN BE DONE BUT THERE IS COMMON COURTESY THAT CAN BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION. WE HAD TWO FOLKS IN THE SENIOR CENTER WHO ARE PARTISAN SCARCITY COME AND SPEAK ABOUT THEIR CONCERNS AND NEEDS AND THERE IS NO RESPONSE, NO ACKNOWLEDGMENT, MOVING RIGHT INTO CONSENT. LOOK BACK AT HISTORICAL PAST PRACTICES OF THIS COUNCIL, MAYBE TALK WITH SOME MENTORS ABOUT MEETING MANAGEMENT, PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT, TRANSPARENCY, THINGS ALONG THAT NATURE, SO YOU CAN HAVE THE COURTESY OF A RESPONSE FROM THIS COUNCIL TO THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC WHO ARE COMING TO SPEAK TO YOU . I EXPECT THAT WE ARE GOING TO SEE SIMILAR BEHAVIOR THROUGHOUT THE REST OF US MEETING WHERE THERE IS

NOT ACTUAL ENGAGEMENT THE PUBLIC AND I LIKE TO SEE THAT CHANGE. UNTIL THEN I WANT TO KEEP FINDING WAYS TO COME IN HERE AND REMIND YOU TO ENGAGE WITH THE PUBLIC, COMMUNICATE WITH THE PUBLIC, BE TRANSPARENT ON THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS AND RECOGNIZE THE WAY THAT YOU ARE INCORPORATING PUBLIC COMMENT INTO THE DECISION-MAKING PROCESS. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, KYLE. NEXT I WILL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM. IF THERE IS ANYONE ON ZOOM THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS. IF THERE IS ANYONE IN THE CHAMBERS IT WOULD LIKE TO PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS. SEEING NONE, PUBLIC, AND IS CLOSED.

THANK YOU, MARY. COUNCILMEMBER MAURER?

HAVE A QUESTION, IS THIS FIRE HAZARD SAFETY MAP, IS IT TIME SENSITIVE THAT WE APPROVE THIS? COULD IT BE BROUGHT BACK FOR MORE CONVERSATION AND PUBLIC, YOU KNOW, PUBLIC COMMENT?

SO, THERE IS A REQUIREMENT TO ADOPT THEM WITHIN 120 DAYS OF WHEN THE FIRE MARSHAL PUBLISHED THEM AND I BELIEVE THAT WOULD GIVE US THROUGH THE END OF JUNE, IF I AM REMEMBERING CORRECTLY. WE COULD POSTPONE THE MEETING AND STILL MEET THE REQUIREMENTS, YOU KNOW, IT IS NOT CLEAR WHAT THE CONSEQUENCES ARE IF YOU'D BE ONE MEETING LATE, I DON'T THINK THERE WOULD BE HUGE CONSEQUENCES BUT THE DEADLINE IS BY THE SECOND MEETING IN JUNE.

COULD WE ADOPTED TONIGHT AND THEN BRING IT BACK WITH A REPORT FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT? WOULD THAT BE OKAY TO DO THAT?

YES, AND WE CAN REVISIT THE MAP AT A LATER DATE IF THE CITY DESIRES TO EXPAND THEM IN ANY WAY.

OKAY, THANK YOU.

THANK YOU COUNCILMEMBER MAURER AND COUNCILMEMBER CARTER. I JUST WANTED TO ACKNOWLEDGE OUR LAST SPEAKER WITH THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK BACK AFTER THE PUBLIC COMMENTS THAT ARE NOT RELEVANT TO THE CONSENT, MAY I DO THAT?

CAN I REFER TO ALEX?

YOU CAN ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT OF A COMMENT BUT IF IS NOT ON THE AGENDA, THERE CANNOT BE DISCUSSION ABOUT IT.

OKAY, SO, I CAN SAY, THANK YOU, GEORGE FOR YOUR COMMENT ABOUT THE -- FUNDS? WE DEFINITELY HEARD THAT IN THE SENIOR CENTER SHOULD KNOW THAT WE HEARD THAT TOO AND WE APPRECIATE YOU CONTINUING TO SHOW UP AND THANK YOU FOR THE COMMENTS ABOUT EVACUATION BECAUSE THAT IS IMPORTANT TO US.

ANY OTHER COMMENTS AND/OR A MOTION? I WILL GO AHEAD AND MOVE THE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS.

I SECOND POINT

MARY, BROKAW?

THANK YOU. MOVED BY MAYOR ZOLLMAN AND SECONDED BY VICE MAYOR McLEWIS. TO PROVE CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS ONE THROUGH SEVEN.

COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

YES.

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON?

YES.

MAYOR ZOLLMAN?

YES POINT

MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.

MOVING ON TO -- AND PRESENTATIONS, WE HAVE SEVERAL AMERICAN CORRECT ME IF I'M WRONG BUT TOTAL 10 MINUTES, CORRECT?

10 MINUTES OR LESS.

AND SOMEBODY WILL BE KEEPING TRACK OF THE TIME I PRESUME? WE HAVE A TIMER.

GREAT. THE INFORMATIONAL ITEMS, PRESENTATIONS, NUMBER EIGHT. SLEEP PRESENTATION BY THE GENERAL MANAGER OF OUR RISK-MANAGEMENT POOLS, THIS WILL BE A SHORT PRESENTATION BY THE CITY'S RISK AUTHORITY WHICH IS CIRA AND PROTECTING THE ASSETS AND MEMBERS, THE CITY IS A MEMBER. CIRA PARTNERS WITH -- TO PRIORITIZE RESOURCES, TO THOSE EXPOSURES WITH THE HIGHEST POTENTIAL FOR RISK, THE PRESENTATION WILL INCLUDE GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE ITEMS THAT AFFECT THE CITY'S PREMIUMS. AND THE REQUESTER IS MYSELF ALONG WITH COUNCILMEMBER HINTON AND THE RESPONSIBLE DEPARTMENT IS THE ACTING CITY MANAGER ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES. I WILL TURN THIS OVER TO YOU. I WILL NOTE THAT THE FISCAL IMPACT, THERE IS NO PHYSICAL IMPACT WITH RECEIPT OF THIS ITEM. HOWEVER, PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2025 TO 2026 BUDGET WILL INCLUDE INCREASED PREMIUMS FOR THE CITY AS FOLLOWS. WORKER'S COMPENSATION, 8%. GENERAL LIABILITY, 21%. I WILL TURN THIS TO MARY.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. AS YOU STATED, AMY CALMLY THE DIRECTOR FOR CIRA OUR RISK-MANAGEMENT AGENCY WILL BE DELIVERING A PRESENTATION TONIGHT. THE PRESENTATION IS AS YOU STATED TO PROVIDE A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF CIRA'S ROLE IN ITS PARTNERSHIP WITH THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL IN MANAGING OUR RISK AND INSURANCE. SOME OF THE POINTS YOU WILL COVER IS HOW OUR CLAIMS IN GENERAL LIABILITY AND WORKMEN'S COMP. EFFECTOR PREMIUMS AND OUR PAYROLL AS WELL AFFECTS THOSE PREMIUMS. PROPERTY LAWSUIT, MEDICAL/DENTAL COVERAGE AND EVEN PROVIDING AN OVERVIEW OF TOOLS AND BEST PRACTICES FOR MITIGATING AND MANAGING RISKS. BEFORE I TURN IT OVER TO AMY I WANT TO STATE THAT WE HAVE THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL HAS A GREAT WORKING RELATIONSHIP WITH CIRA, ALL OF THEIR STAFF, WE ARE IN CONSTANT COMMUNICATION AND COLLABORATION AND SO, I PERSONALLY AM GRATEFUL FOR HAVING CIRA ON BOARD. AMY, I WILL TURN IT TO YOU FOR THE PRESENTATION. DOING GREAT. GOOD EVENING, I'M AMY CALMLY THE GENERAL MANAGER OF CIRA AND I'LL GO OVER THIS PRESENTATION OUICKLY. I HAVE MY TIMER ON AS WELL. SO, CIRA STANDS FOR THE CALIFORNIA INTERGOVERNMENTAL RISK AUTHORITY . IT IS A COLLECTION OF PUBLIC AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE STATE. CIRA ITSELF IS A PUBLIC AGENCY AS WELL, I TOO AM A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE. NEXT SLIDE. THIS IS A FAIRLY FAMOUS TIME MAGAZINE COVER IN MY WORLD WHICH COMES FROM MARCH OF 1986. BACK IN THE '80s PUBLIC AGENCIES, PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS, COMMERCIAL ENTITIES, ALL OF THEM, HAD BEEN CANCELED LEFT AND RIGHT FOR THOSE, SIMILAR TO WHAT WE ARE SEEING NOW. THIS IS PROBLEMATIC FOR PUBLIC AGENCIES SUCH AS CITIES AND COUNTIES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS BECAUSE THEY NEEDED COVERAGE TO PROVIDE ESSENTIAL, BASIC PUBLIC SERVICES. THEY COULD NOT FUNCTION WITHOUT ANY SORT OF COVERAGE. SOME OF THE AGENCIES CAME UP WITH A FAIRLY INNOVATIVE AND NOVEL IDEA. RATHER THAN PURCHASE COMMERCIAL INSURANCE THEY SAID, WHAT IF WE GOT TOGETHER AND POOLED THEIR MONEY TO PAY FOR CLAIMS?

INSTEAD OF PURCHASING COMMERCIAL INSURANCE THAT IS WHAT THEY DID. SEBASTOPOL HAS PARTNERED THROUGH CIRA, WITH ABOUT 56 DIFFERENT PUBLIC AGENCIES, THEY HAVE COMBINED AND POOLED THEIR MONEY TO PAY FOR CLAIMS. ALL OF THIS MONEY GOES INTO A BIG POT THAT CIRA OVERSEES AND CLAIMS ARE PAID FROM THAT POT. AT THE END OF A CLAIM CYCLE IF THERE IS MONEY LEFT OVER IN THE POT, RATHER THAN PAYING TAXES OR HAVE IT GOING TO SHAREHOLDERS IT ACTUALLY GOES BACK TO THE MEMBERSHIP ITSELF. NEXT SLIDE. RIGHT NOW CIRA HAS 53 DIFFERENT MEMBERS THROUGHOUT THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, THAT NUMBER WILL INCREASE ON JULY 1st, WE HAVE NEW MEMBERS WE HAVE ADDED. WE REPRESENT MOSTLY MUNICIPALITIES, CITIES AND TOWNS. WE DO HAVE SOME FIRE DISTRICTS AND SPECIAL DISTRICTS. OUR TOTAL PAYROLL IS ABOUT 420 MILLION, AGAIN, NEXT MONTH IT WILL BE CLOSER TO 500 MILLION. OUR LARGEST NUMBER IF YOU COUNT BY PAYROLL IS THE CITY OF WATSONVILLE WITH A PAYROLL OF ABOUT 42 MILLION. OUR LARGEST NUMBER BY PAYROLL IS THE CITY OF AMADOR CITY, WITH AN ANNUAL PAYROLL OF \$36,000, A TINY LITTLE CITY IN AMADOR COUNTY WITH A PART-TIME EMPLOYEE. ON AVERAGE, OUR MEMBERS HAVE A PAYROLL OF ABOUT 8.4 MILLION. IF YOU COUNT BY POPULATION OUR LARGEST MEMBER IS THE CITY OF RANCHO CUCAMONGA AT 200,000 AND AGAIN THIS LOSS IS THE CITY OF AMADOR CITY AND THEY ALSO HAPPEN TO BE THE SMALLEST CITY WITHIN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA. APPROXIMATELY 70% OF OUR MEMBERS HAVE PUBLIC SAFETY. THAT IS GOING TO BE EITHER POLICE OR FIRE, OR POLICE AND FIRE. NEXT SLIDE. I'M GOING TO VERY QUICKLY TALK ABOUT THE LARGER PROGRAMS THAT WE OFFER. NEXT SLIDE. THE FIRST PROGRAM THAT WE OFFER IS OUR LIABILITY PROGRAM, OUR GENERAL LIABILITY PROGRAM, THIS IS NOT INSURANCE. THIS IS POOLED MONEY FROM ALL 56 MEMBERS TO PAY FOR CLAIMS AND THOSE BLUE SLIDES THAT YOU SEE IN THE MIDDLE, THAT IS WHERE THE POOLED MONEY COMES IN, THOSE GREEN NUMBERS AT THE BOTTOM, THAT IS THE MEMBER DEDUCTIBLE. THERE ARE A COUPLE OF COMPONENT PIECES THAT MAKE UP HOW MUCH SEBASTOPOL PACE. WE HIRE AN ACTUARY TO COME UP WITH THE TOTAL AMOUNT THAT WE NEED TO COLLECT FROM OUR MEMBERS, THEN WE NEED TO FIGURE OUT HOW THEY CAN EACH A SLICE OF THE PIE GOES TO THE MEMBERS. IN SEBASTOPOL'S CASE WE TAKE A LOOK AT SEBASTOPOL'S PAYROLL. ANYTIME PAYROLL GOES UP, IN EQUAL PRO RATA AMOUNTS, THE LIABILITY COVERAGE WILL GO UP, THE LIGHT OF THE CONTRIBUTIONS OR PREMIUMS IF WE WERE AN INSURANCE COMPANY BUT THE CONTRIBUTIONS WILL GO UP. THE LOSSES MATTER AS WELL. IF SEBASTOPOL HAS A LOT OF LOSSES THEY WILL PAY MORE THAN THE AVERAGE MEMBER. IF THEY HAVE FEWER LOSSES THEY WILL PAY LESS THAN THE AVERAGE MEMBER. AND THE FINAL, MAIN PIECE THAT TAKES INTO CONSIDERATION AS THOSE GREEN NUMBERS AT THE BOTTOM THAT WE CALL DEDUCTIBLES. THE HIGHER THE DEDUCTIBLE, JUST LIKE IN YOUR PRIVATE CAR INSURANCE, THE HIGHER YOUR DEDUCTIBLE, THE LOWER THE AMOUNT YOU PAY. NEXT SLIDE. WHAT DO WE COVER? AUTOMOBILE, PUBLIC ERROR AND OMISSIONS, PERSONAL AND BODILY INJURY, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. WHO DO WE COVER? EMPLOYEES, CITY COUNCIL AND ANY VOLUNTEERS. NEXT SLIDE. JUST AS IMPORTANT AS WHAT WE DO COVER IS WHAT WE DO NOT COVER, THIS IS NOT A COMPREHENSIVE SLIDE, THESE ARE SOME OF THE MORE COMMON ITEMS THAT WE SEE THAT WE DO NOT COVER. I WILL GIVE A COUPLE OF EXAMPLES. YOU SEE EMPLOYEE INJURIES ON THIS LIST, THE REASON WE DON'T COVER EMPLOYEE INJURIES UNDER THE LIABILITY PROGRAM IS BECAUSE WE HAVE WORKERS COMPENSATION TO COVER THAT. IT IS NOT A CONFERENCE OF

LIST BUT THESE ARE THE EXAMPLES OF THE MORE COMMON ONES THAT WE DO SEE. NEXT SLIDE. WE ALSO PROVIDE THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL'S EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES. WE DO THAT THROUGH A PARTNERSHIP WITH IRMA. NEXT SLIDE. WE ALSO PROVIDE THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL'S WORKERS COMPENSATION COVERAGE. VERY SIMILAR TO LIABILITY, WE POOL OUR MONEY TOGETHER WITH ALL OF THE OTHER MEMBERS TO PAY FOR THOSE CLAIMS. THE BLUE YOU SEE ON THE SLIDE IS THE POOLED MONEY FROM ALL OF THE DIFFERENT MEMBERS. NEXT SLIDE. WE ALSO PROVIDE SEBASTOPOL'S PROPERTY COVERAGE, SPECIAL EVENTS, THE FIDELITY BOND PROGRAM THAT IS ALSO KNOWN AS A CRIME, WE PROVIDE YOUR CRIME COVERAGE. WE ALSO PROVIDE YOUR CYBER AND EMPLOYEE BENEFITS, SO, CIRA IN PARTNERSHIP WITH REMIF PROVIDES MEDICAL, DENTAL AND VISION BENEFITS FOR THE CITY. NEXT SLIDE. IN ADDITION TO PROVIDING COVERAGE WE HAVE A VERY COMPREHENSIVE RISK MANAGEMENT SERVICES THAT WE PROVIDE AND OFFER TO THE CITY, AS MARY MENTIONED WE ARE VERY COLLABORATIVE WITH THE CITY, WE LIKE TO CONSIDER OURSELVES AN EXTENSION OF SEBASTOPOL STAFF. SO, WE HAVE REFERRAL SERVICES, OSHA COMPLIANT SAFETY COURSES, WE DO ON-SITE RISK ASSESSMENTS, WE COME TO SEBASTOPOL AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR AND MEET WITH EVERYONE, DO AN ON-SITE RISK ASSESSMENT. WE HAVE A GRANT PROGRAM THAT IS WELL USED AND THE CITY DOES TAKE ADVANTAGE OF. AND THIS IS JUST THE SMALLEST OF MANY THINGS WE DO, WE PROVIDE MANY KINDS OF TRAININGS, SERVICES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT, WE HAVE ANNUAL TRAININGS FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AS WELL AS PUBLIC WORKS AS WELL. NEXT SLIDE. WITH THAT I WILL CONCLUDE, I KNOW WE ARE TIGHT ON TIME BUT I WANTED TO OPEN IT UP TO ANY QUESTIONS THAT ANYBODY MAY HAVE. THANK YOU, AMY. AND AS MARY INDICATED EARLIER IT IS A JOY TO WORK WITH YOU AND YOUR AGENCY AND THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR COMING AND TRYING TO KEEP THAT AS CONDENSED AS POSSIBLE. I WILL TURN TO MY COLLEAGUES FOR QUESTIONS, VICE MAYOR?

ONE QUESTION, AT THE BEGINNING WE TALKED ABOUT, I GUESS THE PREMIUMS THAT PEOPLE WHO HAVE CLAIMS MIGHT PAY A SLIGHTLY HIGHER FEE AND I'M JUST WONDERING, IS THAT SOMETHING THAT IS AGGREGATED OVER TIME SIMPLY BECAUSE WE CANNOT WEATHER EVENTS THAT CAUSE US TO HAVE A NUMBER OF CLAIMS AND OVER TIME YOU KNOW, WE DON'T? DOES THAT THEN ADJUST ACCORDINGLY? I WAS TRYING TO UNDERSTAND ABOUT IS FIGURED OUT. GREAT QUESTION. THAT ACTUALLY DOES NOT APPLY TO THE PROPERTY PROGRAM. THE PROPERTY PROGRAM IS BASED SOLELY ON THE VALUE OF THE BUILDINGS ITSELF, SAME WITH THE VEHICLES BUT FOR WORKERS COMP CLAIMS, FOR EXAMPLE, IT IS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME. SO, IT IS A FIVE-YEAR WINDOW THAT WE USE BUT A ROLLING FIVE YEARS. IF YOU HAVE A BAD YEAR IT GETS KIND OF STRETCHED OVER FIVE YEARS AND THINNED OUT AND THEN WHEN THE TIME PASSES THE CLAIM WILL DROP OFF, DOES THAT ANSWER YOUR QUESTION? IT DOES, THANK YOU.

ANY OTHER QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES BEFORE WE GO OUT TO PUBLIC COMMENT? NO. MARY, PUBLIC COMMENT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION FROM CIRA, YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC, IT IS TWO MINUTES AND I WILL GO TO CHAMBERS AND THEN OUT TO ZOOM. KYLE?

I HATE TO BE A BROKEN RECORD ABOUT CYBERSECURITY BUT IN LIGHT OF THE \$1.2 MILLION LOSS FROM FRAUDULENT WIRE TRANSFER, AND THE POLICE DEPARTMENT SYSTEM BREACH IN 2021 EMERGING COUNCIL TO ADOPT THE

PRIORITIZED CYBERSECURITY MITIGATION RECOMMENDATIONS THAT ARE PROVIDED TO CIRA. THIS INCLUDES MANDATORY CYBERSECURITY TRAINING FOR ALL COUNCILMEMBERS, STAFF, CONTRACTORS HANDLING SENSITIVE SYSTEMS OR FUNDS. THESE ARE NOT JUST BEST PRACTICES, THEY ARE ESSENTIAL SAFEGUARDS, CYBER THREATS ARE CONSTANT AND VULNERABILITIES ARE EVOLVING. A ONE-TIME TRAINING OR VOLUNTARY MODULE IS NOT GOING TO BE SUFFICIENT. THE PUBLIC DESERVES TRANSPARENCY ABOUT HOW THE CITY IS PROTECTING THE INFRASTRUCTURE, FINANCES AND DATA. REGULAR REPORTING ON IT LAMENTED CYBER SECURITY MEASURES AND STAFF COMPLIANCE SHOULD BE A STANDARD PART OF CITY UPDATES. SEBASTOPOL HAS ACCESS TO THE TOOLS AND SUPPORT TO IMPROVE HER DIGITAL RESILIENCE, NOW WE NEED A POLICY TO IMPLEMENT THEM. WITH THE REMAINING TIME, I'M A LITTLE CONCERNED ABOUT THE PRESENTATION THAT WE GOT TONIGHT. YES, IT IS GREAT, DOWN TO 10 MINUTES AND BE CONDENSED BUT THERE IS NO ACTUAL SUBSTANTIATIVE SEBASTOPOL SPECIFIC DATA THAT IS BEING PROVIDED IN THIS REPORT TONIGHT. WE DON'T KNOW WHAT OUR LOSSES ARE AS A RESULT OF WHAT OUR CLAIMS ARE, AS A RESULT OF LAWSUITS OR YOU KNOW, FOR ANY SORT OF CLAIM THAT WOULD BE INCREASING OUR RATES. NONE OF THAT IS BEING PRESENTED SPECIFIC TO THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL. GREAT INFORMATION ABOUT CIRA OVERALL, WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR SEBASTOPOL? HOW DOES SEBASTOPOL SPECIFICALLY? WHEN WE JOINED CIRA INDICATED CONCERNS ABOUT, DO CIRA'S, TO THE MEMBER GROUPS OF CIRA REFLECT THE SAME VALUES WE HAVE THE COMMUNITY? I THINK IT IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE IF WE ARE GOING TO GO AHEAD AND MAY, FOR EXAMPLE, QUALIFIED IMMUNITY COVERAGE FOR OFFICERS WHO ARE ACTING OUTSIDE OF THE SCOPE AND ARE UP FOR LIABILITY FOR CIVIL RIGHTS VIOLATIONS. KYLE, THAT IS TWO MINUTES.

MAY BE OUR SURROUNDING DISTRICTS SHOULD BE A PART OF THAT SAME MIND-SET.

STILL GOT TO ZOOM. ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? THANK YOU, GO AHEAD, PLEASE.

YOU'RE HITTING ON ALL MY HOT BUTTON ISSUES TONIGHT. INSURANCE, LIABILITY AND WORKS WHEN COMP ARE ALLOCATED ACROSS ALL DEPARTMENTS INCLUDING WATER AND SEWER. TYPICALLY THEY GO UP ABOUT 20% A YEAR. MEDICAL/DENTAL BENEFITS ARE LUMPED TO BENEFITS, I'M NOT SURE WHAT OTHER BENEFITS MIGHT BE INCLUDED IN THAT NUMBER BUT THEY TYPICALLY GO UP ABOUT 10% A YEAR. THE CITY'S REVENUE GOES UP ABOUT 5% A YEAR AND THAT HAS BEEN GOING ON FOR THREE, FOUR, FIVE YEARS. THESE THINGS ARE BECOMING A LARGER AND LARGER PART OF THE OVERALL BUDGET, NONSENSICALLY PERHAPS THE NOT UNREALISTICALLY AT SOME POINT WE MAY COME TO THE POINT WHERE WE PAY SALARIES, BENEFITS, WE PAY FOR LIABILITY, WORKMEN'S COMP.. AND AT THE END THE DAY WE HAVE 50 EMPLOYEES THAT CANNOT DO MUCH IS BECAUSE THERE IS NO MONEY. CIRA IS SPECIALIZED IN WORKING WITH CITIES, I QUESTION WHETHER OR NOT YOU HAVE PLANS TO HELP SMALL CITIES LIKE US ABSORB THESE KINDS OF COSTS. WE CERTAINLY NEED HELP, THAT IS MY COMMENT. THANK YOU, ROBERT, FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT THEY COME BACK TO CHAMBERS, IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS ELECTRIC A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION. SEEING NONE, I WILL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM. MARY, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? OKAY.

I CAN HEAR YOU, GO AHEAD.

I AGREE WITH KYLE. I WOULD LIKE TO HAVE SEEN SOME SPECIFIC INFORMATION FOR OUR CITY TOO. I THINK WE SHOULD UNDERSTAND MORE WHAT HAPPENED WITH THAT ONE \$.2 MILLION, IF AMY COULD TALK ABOUT THAT AND TALK ABOUT MORE SPECIFIC INFORMATION FOR SEBASTOPOL. SO WE CAN BE CLEAR AND PEOPLE CAN HAVE MORE OF AN UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT IS GOING ON IN OUR CITY. TANKS.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I'LL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS. IF THERE IS ANYBODY IN CHAMBERS THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS INFORMATIONAL ITEM. SEEING NONE WILL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM. IF THERE IS ANYONE ON ZOOM WHO WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS INFORMATIONAL ITEM, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE, NO FURTHER PUBLIC COMMENT.

THANK YOU, MARRIED THEY COULD TO THE MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC THAT SUGGESTED I SHOULD BE MORE ENGAGED, SO, I WILL BE. I TOO WANT TO KNOW IF WE CANNOT GET ANY MORE SPECIFICS BECAUSE WHEN WE DISCUSSED THIS, HAVING THIS PRESENTATION, I THOUGHT IT WOULD BE SOMEWHAT SEBASTOPOL FOCUSED AND I DID NOT HEAR A LOT ABOUT SEBASTOPOL FOCUS, MARY, DO YOU WANT TO ADDRESS THAT? BECAUSE NOW WE'VE HAD TWO MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC SAY THAT THIS IS LIKE A BIG OVERVIEW BUT NOTHING SPECIFIC FOR SEBASTOPOL.

I DON'T HAVE THE NUMBERS IN FRONT OF ME, AND HE MIGHT NOT WE WERE DOING A GENERAL INTERVIEW, OR SORRY, NOT INTERVIEW, A GENERAL PRESENTATION ABOUT HOW CLAIMS CAN AFFECT US, SO, IT IS NOT JUST SPECIFICALLY THE SEBASTOPOL AS IT STATED, ALL CLAIMS AFFECT THE CITY. AMY, I DON'T KNOW IF YOU HAVE SPECIFICS IN FRONT OF YOU, I DON'T BUT WE CAN GIVE GENERALITIES BUT CANNOT GO INTO THE DETAILS. WE CAN BRING BACK AN INFORMATIONAL ITEM ON THE NUMBER OF CLAIMS, GENERAL INFORMATION BUT NOT SPECIFICS. AND HOW THAT RELATES, WOULD THAT BE HELPFUL? I SEE COUNCILMEMBER HINTON HAND?

ONE ADDRESS BECAUSE I HAVE BEEN TO THE CONFERENCES OF CIRA AND THAT THE ENTIRE CITIGROUP SECURE ABOUT NEW MEMBERS AND THERE IS A VOTE TAKEN TO HAVE THEM JOIN THE ORGANIZATION AND THEIR RISK IS CONSIDERED WHEN YOU ARE TAKING ON A NEW MEMBER TO THE OVERALL POOL. SO, A LOT OF THAT INFORMATION IS CONFIDENTIAL, RELATED TO THEIR SPECIFIC CITY IN THEIR CLAIMS AND SO, I WILL SAY TO THE PUBLIC THAT IS DISCUSSED BY THE MEMBERS OF CIRA AND WE ARE ONE OF THE VOTING MEMBERS AND WE HAVE VOTED TO TAKE ON OR TO TURN DOWN CITIES TO JOIN THE ORGANIZATION. ALSO, ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC COMMENTED ON THE MONEY LOST IN THE CYBER SECURITY ISSUE AND I THOUGHT ANNA WOULD HAVE A NUMBER ON HAND BUT I KNOW THAT WE RECOVERED ALMOST ALL OF THAT MONEY BACK INTO THE CITY THROUGH INSURANCE CLAIMS, SO, WE ADDRESS THAT MANY TIMES AT COUNCIL. AND OF THE PUBLIC DOES NOT ATTEND ALL THE MEETINGS LIKE WE DO BUT WE HAVE RECOVERED THAT AND THAT IS THANKS TO INSURANCE COVERAGE IN ORGANIZATIONS LIKE CIRA. I WANTED TO MAKE THOSE COMMENTS.

THANK YOU, CIRA HINTON AND THANK YOU, MARY FOR BRINGING OUT WHAT IS NOT NEEDED, YOU CAN ONLY DEVOLVE SO MUCH DUE TO CONFIDENTIALITY, THAT KIND ONE OF THE REASONS WE CANNOT GET TOO SPECIFIC? WE CANNOT GET TOO SPECIFIC BUT I WILL BRING BACK A GENERAL INFORMATIONAL REPORT AT THE NEXT MEETING PRIOR TO THE BUDGET, WHERE WE CAN TALK ABOUT THE CLAIMS OVERALL AFFECTING US BECAUSE LIKE I SAID,

IT IS ALL OF THE CITIES AND IT IS NOT JUST SPECIFIC TO US BUT WE CAN GIVE YOU A GENERAL IDEA OF THE NUMBER OF CLAIMS WE HAD, GENERAL VERSUS WORKMEN'S COMP., AMY, CAN YOU AND I WORKED TOGETHER AND THEN BRING IT BACK FOR NEXT MEETING?

ABSENTLY, I WOULD BE HAPPY TO.

THANK YOU. I WANT TO STAY ONE MORE THING TO THE MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC AT AMY, CORRECT ME IF I AM WRONG, THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL DOES USE CIRA'S CYBERSECURITY PROGRAM AND WE GET MONTHLY REPORTS IF THERE IS ANY CRITICAL ALERTS WE ARE MADE AWARE OF THAT. THEY DO HAVE TRAININGS AND RESOLUTIONS AND SEND OUT REGULARLY, I JUST WANTED TO PUT THAT OUT THERE AS WELL.

THANK YOU THANK YOU TO BOTH OF YOU INTO THE OTHER PUBLIC COMMENT OR ABOUT TAKING ADVANTAGE OF CIRA'S DIRECTIONS ABOUT WHAT NEEDS TO BE APPLIED AND SO, I AM ASSUMING THAT WE DO, TO THE EXTENT THAT WE HAVE THE MONEY TO DO IT, IS THAT A FAIR ASSESSMENT, MARY?

CAN YOU REPEAT THE QUESTION? AS FAR AS THE PROGRAMS THAT THEY TAKE ADVANTAGE OF?

WHAT I HEARD FROM ONE OF THE PUBLIC COMMENTS IT WAS LIKE, WE TAKING FULL ADVANTAGE OF THEIR RECOMMENDATIONS?

AS LONG AS WE CAN WITHIN OUR BUDGET, YES. I WILL SAY FOR SOME OF OUR CYBERSECURITY IT IS VERY EXPENSIVE BUT WE ARE DOING THE BEST WE CAN WITH OUR BUDGET BUT YES, EVERYTHING WE HAVE TRIED TO INCORPORATE INTO PROTOCOLS. SPEWING GREAT, THANK YOU, MARY AND THANK YOU, AMY, ANY OTHER QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES BEFORE WE RECEIVE THIS INFORMATIONAL ITEM? SEEING NONE. WE ARE OKAY TO MOVE ALONG, RIGHT? OKAY. THANK YOU AGAIN, AMY FOR COMING AND FOR AGREEING TO WORK WITH MARY FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AS YOU MOVE THROUGH OUR BUDGET, THANK YOU.

ABSOLUTELY.

MOVING ON TO AGENDA ITEM NUMBER NINE, INFORMATIONAL ITEM AND IS IS A PRESENTATION ON SELECTING A LEADER, COMMON EXECUTIVE SEARCH PROCESS FOR CITY MANAGER POSITION AND THE REQUESTER IS OUR HR DEPARTMENT HEAD AND THE ACTING CITY MANAGER AND AS FAR AS PHYSICAL IMPACT THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT WITH THE RECEIPT OF THIS ITEM. HOWEVER PROPOSED IN FISCAL YEAR 2025 2026 BUDGET WILL INCLUDE FUNDING FOR THE CITY MANAGER RECRUITMENT OF 35,000. MARY, DO YOU WANT TO START?

I'LL KEEP THIS BRIEF. THIS WILL BE A SHORT PRESENTATION BY OUR HUMAN RESOURCES CONSULTANT DEBORAH MUCHMORE WILL GIVE AN OVERVIEW OF HOW WE WILL SELECT THE CITY MANAGER WAS IN FORWARD AND THE PROCESS GOOD EVENING MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBERS, SO, AS MARY SAID, CITY MANAGER SELECTION NEEDS TO BE DONE, IT IS TEMPORARILY BEING COVERED BY MARY GURLEY BUT IT IS AN APPOINTED BY THE COUNCIL THIS POSITION, REPORTS TO THE COUNCIL AND THAT IS A CRITICAL ROLE FOR THE CITY. SO, SLIDE ONE, PLEASE. AND I WILL CARRY THE SLIDES FOR ME, THANK YOU, ANNA. SO, THIS PRESENTATION IS ABOUT THE PROCESS OF SELECTING A CITY MANAGER. HOLD ON, DEBORAH. WHICH LIKE THIS?

THE TITLE SLIDE. OKAY. YOU SHOULD HAVE THE POWERPOINT. THAT IS OKAY, I CAN TALK A LITTLE BIT MORE BECAUSE WE ONLY HAVE 10 MINUTES. SO, IT IS PART OF A THOUGHTFUL AND DELIBERATE PROCESS, WE ARE GOOD? GOOD. BY THE COUNCIL AND SO, WE ARE GOING TO GO TO SLIDE ONE NOW. SLIDE ONE IS GOING

TO TELL US A LITTLE BIT ABOUT A COMMON SEARCH PROCESS. THANK YOU FOR REMOVING THAT. THERE CAN BE SIX OR MORE MAJOR ELEMENTS IN A COMMON SEARCH PROCESS. WE ARE GOING TO TALK ABOUT EACH PHASE OF THAT PROCESS AND BRIEFLY, SO WE CAN STAY UNDER THE TIMELINE. IF YOU WOULD MOVE TO SLIGHTLY, THE NEXT SLIDE. PHASE ONE IS USUALLY PLANNING AND PREPARATION. THAT IS WHERE WE REQUEST, WE MAY DO A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS FOR EXECUTIVE SEARCH FIRMS. WE MIGHT HIRE A PROFESSIONAL SEARCH FIRM TO HELP WITH THAT SEARCH. ASCERTAIN CURRENT AND FUTURE KEY ISSUES IN THE CITY. THE COUNCIL LOOKS AT AND THE CITY LOOKS AT WHAT THE POSITION EXPECTATIONS ARE AND THE IDEAL CANDIDATE PROFILE. AND ALSO TALK ABOUT WHAT THE COMMUNITY AND STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT STRATEGY MIGHT BE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. AT THE NEXT PHASE WE ARE GOING TO BE DOING MATERIALS DEVELOPMENT. USING THE INFORMATION THAT IS GLEANED IN THE FIRST PHASE. WE DEVELOP MARKETING MATERIALS AND A MARKETING STRATEGY. COMMUNICATION STRATEGY AND METHODS TO GET THE BEST CANDIDATES INTERESTED IN THE POSITION. THE NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. THIS IS JUST A SLIDE OF COMMON LEADERSHIP ATTRIBUTES THAT ARE FOR THIS POSITION, THAT TYPICALLY ARE LOOKED AT. THERE WOULD BE, PUBLIC COMMENT IS A GREAT WAY TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LEADERSHIP ATTRIBUTES AND INFORMATION TO YOUR COUNCIL. FOR THIS IMPORTANT SELECTION PROCESS. THERE IS ALSO PART OF THAT PHASE ONE PROCESS WILL GLEAN OUT OTHERS. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. IN PHASE THREE WE BEGIN THE OUTREACH AND MARKETING, WE OPEN THE RECRUITMENT, WE START ACCEPTING APPLICATIONS, WE START MAKING DIRECT MAIL CAMPAIGNS AND WORKING WITH CANDIDATES AT A SEARCH FIRM OR THE CITY, OR OTHER IMPORTANT STAKEHOLDERS THAT ARE AVAILABLE AND WE GET THAT TO WHOEVER THE RECRUITER IS OR THE RECRUITING AGENCY. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. INITIALLY, WHOEVER THE RECRUITER IS IS GOING TO BE SCREENING AND DOING SOME PRELIMINARY REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND CHECKS ON THE CANDIDATES, SO THEY CAN NARROW THE POOL TO A HIGHER QUALIFIED LEVEL OF CANDIDATES THAT MEETS THE CITY'S REQUIREMENTS. AND THEN WHATEVER STAKEHOLDER ADVISORY PANELS ARE CHOSEN FOR THE PROCESS WHAT OCCURS SHORTLY AFTER THAT. AND IF YOU WOULD MOVE TO THE NEXT SLIDE. THE COUNCIL WILL NORMALLY INTERVIEW THE VERY TOP GROUP OF CANDIDATES. THEY WILL SEE ALL THE APPLICATIONS. THEY MAY SEE APPLICATIONS THAT THEY ARE INTERVIEWING. THEY WILL SEE APPLICATIONS THAT WERE THE RUNNERS-UP TO THAT AND THEY WILL SEE PEOPLE WHO APPLIED BUT DID NOT ACTUALLY MAKE THE CUT. THEY WILL SEE THE NAMES AND WHO THEY ARE. AND THEN AT THIS POINT, A SELECTION MAY BE MADE AND THE NEGOTIATION AND BACKGROUND OCCURS. AFTER THAT THERE IS AN ON BOARDING AND TRANSITION PROCESS ON THE NEXT SLIDE. AND THEY RECEIVE A CONDITIONAL OFFER, THERE ARE SOME POST OFFER EXAMS THAT HAPPEN AND LET'S MOVE ONTO THE NEXT SLIDE. AFTER THAT THERE IS A CONTRACT FINALIZATION. THE CONTRACT COMEBACKS TO COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. IT IS APPOINTED AT IT REGULAR MEETING, A PERSON IS INTRODUCED TO THE COMMUNITY AND HOPEFULLY SOME OF THE COMMUNITY WAS INVOLVED AND THEY SAW THESE CANDIDATES. AND THEN THE SUPPORT FROM THE CITY AND FROM KEY LEADERS FOR THE TRANSITION INTO THE ROLE. NEXT SLIDE, PLEASE. SO, POSSIBLE SEARCH TIMELINE IS ANYWHERE FROM 6 TO 7 MONTHS, NORMALLY, WE LIKE TO SAY 4 TO 7 MONTHS BUT IDEALLY IT WILL PROBABLY BE 6 TO 7 MONTHS IF OUR INITIAL POOL IS

QUALIFIED AND A DEEP POOL OF CANDIDATES TO SELECT FROM. NEXT SLIDE. THAT CONCLUDES MY PRESENTATION.

THANK YOU, DEBORAH, QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES? LOOKING TO MY RIGHT. COUNCILMEMBER HINTON?

YEAH . I THINK I HAD MENTIONED DOING SOME PRE-TESTING, LIKE LET'S JUST SAY THE COUNTY OF SONOMA DOESN'T THEIR CANDIDATES. I DID NOT SEE IT IN THE AGENDA ITEM SPECIFICALLY, SO, I WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT WE ARE GOING TO DO A LITTLE BIT MORE AND I'M WONDERING IF NOW IS THE TIME TO WEIGH IN ON THAT? OR IF THIS IS ALL WE ARE DOING AS PRESENTED IN THIS PRESENTATION? OKAY. THAT IS PART OF THE COUNCILS DELIBERATION ON THE SELECTION CRITERIA THAT THEY WANT TO USE IN SELECTING THE CANDIDATES AND WE WILL BE COMING BACK TO COUNCIL, STAFF WILL BE COMING BACK TO COUNCIL WITH FUTURE STEPS IN THIS PROCESS. THIS WAS JUST A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF WHAT A COMMON PROCESS WOULD BE.

THANK YOU. COUNCILMEMBER MAURER?

YES. IS IT POSSIBLE THAT COUNCILMEMBERS CAN INTERVIEW A POTENTIAL CANDIDATE ONE-ON-ONE? FOR EXAMPLE, LIKE AFTER WE MEET WITH THEM, FULL COUNCIL, CAN WE ALSO HAVE TIME TO MEET ONE-ON-ONE?

THERE ARE MANY DIFFERENT ELEMENTS THAT YOU CAN PUT INTO A SELECTION PROCESS. SO, THAT COULD BE AN ELEMENT, DEPENDING ON WHERE IT FELL IN THE PROCESS AND HOW IT WAS ADMINISTERED, YES. THANK YOU.

ANY OTHER QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES? LOOKING TO MY RIGHT, MY LEFT , MARY?

THANK YOU, MAYOR. THIS IS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT, A GENERAL OVERVIEW OF SELECTING A CITY MANAGER. IF YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, I COME TO CHAMBERS FIRST. KYLE?

I REALLY APPRECIATE THE PRESENTATION ABOUT THE PROCESS AND I THINK THERE IS LIKE A GENERAL KIND OF HR FRAMEWORK THAT IS BEING BUILT AROUND THAT IDEA. BUT WHAT I REALLY HOPE THE COUNCILS ABLE TO DO IS ACTIVELY REFLECT ON THEIR RECENT EXPERIENCES WITH CITY MANAGEMENT, RECRUITMENT AND THAT ROLE. AND THE RELATIONSHIP OF COUNCIL HAS WITH THAT EMPLOYEE. I THINK IT IS IMPORTANT, SPECIFICALLY FOR THIS COUNCIL, TO TAKE ACTIVE STEPS TO REALLY, REALLY REFLECT WHAT NEEDS TO HAPPEN MAYBE IN A CLOSED SESSION SO YOU CAN BE MORE HONEST ABOUT HOW YOU ARE PLANNING TO INTEGRATE THE RELATIONSHIP, THE VERY UNIQUE, SPECIFIC RELATIONSHIP AT THIS COUNCIL HAS WITH ITS CITY MANAGEMENT. IN ORDER TO MAKE SURE THAT WE DON'T RUN INTO THE SAME SITUATION AS BEFORE AND WE ARE ACTIVELY TAKING STEPS. WHILE I THINK THE BUZZWORDS AND THE HR FRAMING AROUND THE VALUES AND QUALITIES OF A CITY MANAGER MAY BE USEFUL I THINK YOU REALLY WANT TO ABANDON A LOT OF THAT STUFF AND BE INTROSPECTIVE ABOUT WHAT YOU ARE EXPECTING A CITY MANAGEMENT RELATIONSHIP WITH A COUNCIL TO BE AND MAKE SURE THOSE THINGS ARE CODIFIED IN THE PROCESS. THANKS. VEGA, KYLE. NEXT I WILL GO BACK OUT TO ROBERT. THERE YOU GO. GO AHEAD.

IS A PROCESS. I THINK IT IS ALMOST THE SAME PROCESS YOU USED WHEN YOU SELECTED DON. OBVIOUSLY THE PROCESS ITSELF IS NECESSARY BUT DOES NOT GUARANTEE THE RESULT YOU NEED. I HAVE NOT HEARD ANY DISCUSSION SO FAR, AT LEAST, THIS IS IN PART WHAT WAS SAID TO THE PREVIOUS COMMENTS ARE KYLE, YOU KNOW EXACTLY WHAT WENT WRONG AND EXACTLY WHAT IS GOING

TO BE DIFFERENT ABOUT THIS PROCESS THAT WILL GET TO A BETTER CANDIDATE FOR THE CITY? THAT HAS NOT BEEN DISCUSSED IT, I DON'T KNOW WHERE YOU WILL DISCUSS THAT OR HOW YOU WILL FIGURED OUT OR MAYBE IS GOING TO WING IT AND HOPE FOR THE BEST. HOPEFULLY IT IS MORE DELIBERATE THAN THAT, THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS, THERE IS ANYBODY IN CHAMBERS, PLEASE?

THANK YOU. MY NAME IS THOMAS L'S AND I LIVE SOUTH OF TOWN, FOR 13 YEARS. I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO MEET THE FORMER CITY MANAGER IN REGARD TO MY WORK WITH THE SONOMA COUNTY -- FOR THE HOMELESS. WHILE HE AND I INTERFACED WITH THE COUNTY HOUSING AUTHORITY AND THERE IS A DIVISION OF THAT, WHICH IS DEALING WITH THE HOMELESSNESS AND THE DIFFERENT AGENCIES THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY AND I WAS RATHER SURPRISED WHEN HE BECAME CITY MANAGER HERE. SO, I WOULD EMPHASIZE EXACTLY WHAT YOUR PREVIOUS TWO SPEAKERS DID, WHICH IS THAT YOU PROBABLY NEED TO SEEK ALIGNMENT AND ALIGNMENTS ON YOUR GOALS. IN OTHER WORDS, HOW HAS THAT PERSON EXEMPLIFIED THE GOALS THAT YOUR CITY HAS, HOW HAVE IMPLEMENTED IN THEIR WORLD WHAT YOUR GOALS ARE? DO THEY ALIGN WITH ONE ANOTHER? BECAUSE THAT IS FUNDAMENTAL TO WHAT YOUR OUTCOMES ARE GOING TO BE. THEY HAVE A LOT OF INDEPENDENT DISCRETION IN WHAT THEIR WORK IS, PARTICULARLY THERE WERE A FEW CONFLICTING ISSUES AS INTERFACED AND SO ON.

THOMAS, ABOUT 20 SECONDS.

THANK YOU. I WOULD EMPHASIZE, FORGIVE ME, I'M A CIVIL AND ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING TO HAVE ABOUT 50 YEARS EXPERIENCE IN DEALING WITH VARIOUS PLANNING, ENGINEERING AND ADMINISTRATIVE ASPECTS, SO, I WISH YOU SUCCESS AND I THINK ALIGNMENT IS HELPFUL. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT I WILL GO OUT TO ZOOM. IF YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION REGARDING CITY MANAGER PROCESS, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE, I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS. IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS, PLEASE?

MY HEART IS BEATING, IT IS A BEAUTIFUL DAY. BEFORE I BEGIN, YOU TALK ABOUT CYBERSECURITY, I INVITE YOU TO LOOK UP MICHAEL -- EXCUSE ME, SIR. THIS IS PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE CURRENT AGENDA ITEM THAT WE ARE CALLING, CORRECT, MARY?

CORRECT, THIS IS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE CITY MANAGER PROCESS. VERY WELL. IT IS EASY NOT TO MAKE FOLLOWERS BUT LEADERS. I AM PETER, KING OF MASTERPIECE THEATRE, I'M ALWAYS WITH YOU IS I'M HERE SPEAKING TRUTH TO POWER, MY AUTHORITY COMES FROM THE HIGHNESS IN YOUR HEARTS. PLEASE DON'T INTERRUPT ME.

SIR.

UNLESS YOU ARE A MIND READER PLEASE DON'T INTERRUPT.

SIR, I'M GOING TO TAKE A PAUSE AND REMIND YOU OF THE PROCESS. WE HAVE CALLED THE ITEM WE ARE ELECTING, REGARDING THE ELECTION AND SELECTION OF OUR NEXT GENERAL MANAGER, IF YOUR COMMENTS ARE RELATED TO THAT. THEY ARE APSLEY RELATED AND HOPE I GET MY TWO MINUTES BACK AND OKAY. DEFINITELY PLEASE PROCEED IF THEY ARE RELEVANT TO THE ITEM. YOU WILL DETERMINE AT THE END.

I'M GOING TO GIVE YOU A PAUSE, NOT A CAUTION, BUT A PAUSE TO PLEASE KEEP YOUR COMMENTS RELEVANT TO THE CURRENT AGENDA ITEM, OKAY? WHERE'S MY TIMECLOCK, PLEASE?

GO AHEAD, PLEASE.

AS I WAS SHARING, WE ARE IN PLACE AND TIME IN ONE OF THE MOST BEAUTIFUL COUNTIES IN THE WORLD WHERE WE HAVE BEEN BORN INTO A WORLD OF LIES AND ALIBIS AND WE LOOK TO LEADERS TO PULL US OUT OF THESE THINGS WITHOUT REALIZING THAT WE ARE THE LEADERS. IT IS TIME FOR US TO LEAD AND CEASING ALL THE WAR, CRUTCHES AND GREED AND THAT IS DONE ON A LOCAL LEVEL BECAUSE WE CAN DO A LOT OF COMMUNITIES WITH GARDENS AND PEOPLE TOGETHER, WHICH IS ALREADY BEING DONE IN SEBASTOPOL. THE REAL LEADER IS WITH YOU, OR TO FIND SOMEONE THAT HAS THAT SORT OF MIND-SET AND THERE ARE TWO OR THREE PEOPLE IN THIS COUNTY AND THE CITY I'M AWARE OF, TWO BROTHERS IN PARTICULAR. AND AS I SAID, IN THIS NATION AND THIS COUNTY, THIS NATION AND THIS WORLD OF ALL OF THIS INSANITY, HOW DO WE LEAD IN CEASING ALL THE CORRUPTION, WAR AND GREED? I SAY, WE BEGIN AND FIND SOMEONE WHO WILL JOIN US TO WILL BE A SERVANT TO FUND GREEN JOBS AND MASSIVE GARDENS. 10,000 GARDENS, 10,000 GREENHOUSES JUST IN SEBASTOPOL, HOW DO WE FUND THAT? WE STOP AND CEASE PAYING THE VERY BANKERS, KNOWING THAT ALL WARS ARE BANKER WARS AND ALL WARS ARE BASED ON DECEPTION AND ALL MORTGAGES AND RENTS WE GET OFF THE FENCE, STOP PAYING THEM, STOPPING PT KNEE WHICH IS RUN BY ROSS CHILDS AND AS I SAID, MY AUTHORITY COMES FROM ON HIGH AND THE HIGHNESS IS IN YOUR HEART, LET IT GO AND LET IT FLOW. IT IS TIME FOR US TO BE THE SHOW.

SIR, 30 SECONDS.

WE ARE THE PEOPLE, THIS IS THE TIME, ALL TIME IS NOW NOW IS THE TIME FOR US TO STEP FORWARD AND STOP LOOKING TO SITUATIONS AND SCENARIOS THAT SIMPLY ARE VERY LIMITING. WHAT IS THE PROMISED LAND LOOK LIKE FROM ANY RELIGION FROM AROUND THE WORLD? BEAUTIFUL GARDENS, DISMISS THE LAND OF LUTHER BURBANK? IS THIS CHARLIE BROWN THE PEANUTS GANG THAT WERE PORTRAYED AS DEACONS ALL 55 YEARS? IT IS TIME FOR US TO BE WHO WE ARE. I AM PETER, I AM THE ONE SHARING THIS WITH YOU.

SIR, THAT IS TWO MINUTES. THANK YOU VERY MUCH.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT.

THANK YOU, SIR.

NEXT I WILL GO OUT TO ZOOM. IF THERE IS ANYONE ON ZOOM THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS THAT LIKED MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT. SORRY? WOULD YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT?

SIR, WOULD LIKE TO COME UP?

[INAUDIBLE]

SIR , HOLD ON. YES, PLEASE. WE DO HAVE A PROCESS AND WE ARE IN PUBLIC COMMENT, IF YOU HAVE A PUBLIC COMMENT, COME ON UP, THANK YOU, SIR. I HATE TO BE ARGUMENTATIVE , I JUST DON'T KNOW WHAT A STAKEHOLDER IS. I'M SURE IT HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH MINING. THANK YOU, WHAT IS A STAKEHOLDER?

WE WILL ADDRESS THAT AT THE END.

THANK YOU, SIR.

I'M GOING TO TRY TO FINISH PUBLIC, IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT. SEEING NONE I WILL GO BACK TO ZOOM. IF THERE IS ANYONE ON ZOOM PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE, PUBLIC, AND IS CLOSED.

THANK YOU, PLEASE IF WE COULD PROVIDE THE GENTLEMAN A DEFINITION OF STAKEHOLDER IN THIS CONTEXT.

STAKEHOLDER IN THIS CONTEXT IS THE COMMUNITY, THE CITY STAFF, ORGANIZATIONS, NONPROFITS, EVERYONE WORKING TOGETHER WITHIN THE COMMUNITY TO MAKE SURE THAT WE SELECT THE RIGHT CANDIDATE FOR THIS. EVERYONE WITHIN THIS COMMUNITY IS A STAKEHOLDER.

THANK YOU, SARAH THANK YOU, MARY, FOR THAT EXPLANATION. TO BE CONCLUDE PUBLIC COMMENT? OKAY, ARE THE QUESTIONS FOR MY COLLEAGUES BEFORE WE RECEIVE THIS ITEM AND MOVE ALONG? LOOKING TO THE RIGHT, LOOKING TO THE LEFT, SEEING NONE I THINK WE ARE CONCLUDED, THANK YOU, DEBORAH. MOVING ON TO INFORMATIONAL ITEM NUMBER 10. THIS IS THE YEAR TO DATE UPDATE FOR SECTION 115 TRUST, FOR PENSION STABILIZATION PENSION ACCOUNT AND INTERNAL PENSION RESERVE. THIS REPORT PRESENTS YEAR TO DATE BALANCES FOR BOTH THE SECTION 115 ACCOUNTS AND HIGHLIGHTS THE CITY'S CONTINUED COMMITMENT TO FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY. THE SECTION 115 TRUST ALLOWS FOR BROADER INVESTMENT OPTIONS THAN THE GENERAL FUND, OFFERING THE POTENTIAL FOR HIGHER RETURNS WHILE PRESERVING FUNDS EXCLUSIVELY FOR PENSION LIABILITIES. THIS PART I'M GOING TO READ BECAUSE IT IS STATED HERE IN REFERENCE TO FISCAL IMPACT. THERE IS, AND IF WE CAN KEEP SORT OF THE BACKGROUND DISCUSSIONS TO A MINIMUM IN THE CHAMBERS, THAT WOULD BE GREAT. THE FISCAL IMPACT, THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT WITH RECEIPT OF THIS ITEM. THE ONE YEAR RETURN SINCE THE INCEPTION OF THE PENSION TRUST STARTED ON JANUARY 19, 2024 TO JANUARY 29th, 2025. IT IS 7.0%. OUTPERFORMING THE BENCHMARK RETURN OF 5.8%, EXCUSE ME, 5.4%, OVER THE SAME PERIOD. AS OF MAY 18th, 2025, THE INCEPTION TO DATE RETURN STANDS AT 7.45%, COMPARED TO THE BENCHMARK RETURN OF 6.31%. SO, I ACTUALLY DON'T SEE, OKAY, THE REQUESTER AND THE PERSON IS ADMINISTERED SERVICES. ANNA, THANK YOU?

THANK YOU, MR. MAYOR, I DON'T HAVE ANY PRESENTATION FOR THIS ITEM BUT I DO HAVE THE ADVISORY GROUP ON THE ZOOM CALL, THE COUNCIL HAS ANY QUESTIONS. I WILL BRIEFLY GO THROUGH SOME KEY POINTS ABOUT THE 115 TRUST, WHY THIS LADY SELECTED 115 TRUST IN HISTORY. AS YOU MENTIONED, COUNCIL DID ADOPT AND APPROVE A RESOLUTION FOR THE 150 TRUST TENSION STABILIZATION OCTOBER 17th, 2023 AND THE PURPOSE IS TO CREATE THE PRE-FUNDING PENSION LIABILITY AND REDUCE LONG-TERM COST AND WHY DO WE HAVE THIS? IS TO THE LOCAL CONTROL, COUNCIL HAS THE LOCAL CONTROL AND THERE IS FLEXIBILITY IN INVESTMENT STRATEGY AND POTENTIAL HIGHER RETURN BECAUSE OF THE FLEXIBILITY AND THEN THE BENEFIT IS TO STABILIZE PENSION COST, STRENGTHEN PHYSICAL RESILIENCE AND SUPPORT THE LONG-TERM PLANNING. THE INITIAL INVESTMENT AS YOU MENTIONED WAS 1.8 MILLION TO THE TRUST AND CURRENTLY IT STANDS CLOSE TO \$2 MILLION IN THE ASSET, IT IS VERY COMPETITIVE FOR THE BENCHMARK THAT YOU MENTIONED, EVEN THOUGH WE WERE ON A VERY CONSERVATIVE INVESTMENT STRATEGY. SO, STAFF RECOMMENDS THAT THE COUNCIL RECEIVES THE STAFF REPORT WITH ALL THE UPDATE INFORMATION AND IF YOU HAVE ANY SPECIFIC INFORMATION OR SPECIFIC QUESTIONS THAT YOU NEED TO ASK REGARDING THE TRUST, I HAVE THE ADVISORY GROUP ONLINE.

THANK YOU, ANNA. LET'S GO AHEAD AND HEAR FROM THE CONSULTANT AND THEN LEAVE IT UP TO MY COLLEAGUES.

MARK, DO YOU HAVE ANYTHING TO ADD TO THIS ITEM?

THANK YOU AND GOOD EVENING MAYOR AND COUNCIL. AS ANNA HAS SHARED WITH YOU THE PORTFOLIO HAS DONE EXACTLY WHAT IT SHOULD BE DOING RIGHT NOW. YOUR YEAR-TO-DATE PORTFOLIO IS ACTUALLY UP, DESPITE AS YOU ARE ALL PROBABLY VERY AWARE, THE VOLATILITY IN THE MARKETPLACE. THE PORTFOLIO IS ACTUALLY UP 3.36 YEAR-TO-DATE. MANY FOLKS AROUND THE COUNTRY ARE WORRIED ABOUT PORTFOLIOS THAT HAVE GONE DOWN, YOUR PORTFOLIO HAS GONE UP OVER THE LAST FIVE MONTHS. IT IS VERY CONSERVATIVELY INVESTED RIGHT NOW WITH ONLY 20% EQUITIES AND 80% FIXED INCOME AND/OR BONDS. COMPARED TO CALPERS COMBINED BENEFIT PLAN WHICH IS 70% EQUITIES AND 30% BONDS. THE CITY IS DOING QUITE WELL WITH THE PORTFOLIO AND AS ANNA MENTIONED IT IS VERY FLEXIBLE AND TRANSPARENT AND VERY EXPENSIVE. THANK YOU FOR THAT AND COUNCILMEMBER CARTER.

THANK YOU, MARK, I APPRECIATE THE BALANCE AND YOU HAVE BEEN DOING, IT HAS BEEN A DIFFICULT YEAR AND I CAN TELL THAT IF YOU DID NOT HAVE INTERNATIONAL EXPOSURE YOU AT LEAST HAD VERY STABLE INVESTMENTS BECAUSE IT IS A DIFFICULT ENVIRONMENT AND I'M KIND OF WONDERING IF WE CAN SEE WHAT TYPES OF EQUITIES YOU MIGHT HAVE, JUST SAYING FOR KIND OF, I'M AN ENVIRONMENTALIST AND I PREFER NOT TO HOLD ANY OIL COMPANIES THAT I'M CURIOUS WHETHER THAT CAN HAPPEN? BUT OTHERWISE, GREAT JOB. THANK YOU. LET ME ANSWER YOUR FIRST QUESTION. REALLY BEGINNING AFTER THE SECOND QUARTER LAST YEAR, THAT I THINK ALL OF YOU THAT FOLLOW MARKETS WITNESSED THE STOCK MARKET FOR THE FIRST SIX MONTHS WENT UP EXTREMELY QUICKLY AND WONDERFULLY, DUE TO AI INVESTING, LARGE-CAP GROWTH SURGES BUT STARTED IN THE THIRD OUARTER OF 2024. WE STARTED TO SEE A PULLBACK, YOU SHOULD ALL BE VERY AWARE THAT THE FED HAVE BEEN TALKING ABOUT REDUCING INTEREST RATE SINCE NOVEMBER OF '22. WHEN IN FACT THEY DON'T REDUCE IT UNTIL SEPTEMBER OF 24 AND OF COURSE THAT HAD A MAJOR IMPACT ON ALL THE MARKETS. TO YOUR COMMENT, YES, WE STARTED SHIFTING INTO INTERNATIONAL AND VALUE, WE SAW INTERNATIONAL AS BEING UNDERVALUED. WE PUT THAT INTO THE CATEGORY OF VALUE AND STARTED SHIFTING MORE TOWARDS LARGE-CAP VALUE AND LARGE-CAP BLEND WHICH IS WHY WE HAVE THE PERFORMANCE WE HAVE HAD, VERSUS MANY LARGE-CAP GROWTH OR TARIFF TYPE PRODUCT COMPANIES THAT HAVE BEEN VERY AFFECTED BY THE MARKETS. WE DO INVEST PRIMARILY IN ETS, LOW COST. WE DON'T BUY STOCKS AND BONDS, WE USE ETF'S AND ACTIVELY MANAGED FUNDS AT TIMES IN THE PORTFOLIO GETS LARGER WE ACTUALLY CUSTOMIZED FUNDS. YOUR INVESTMENT POLICY STATEMENT, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS AN IPS, IT IS OUR DOMESTIC AND INTERNATIONAL, IT IS NOT A SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE IPS DESIGN. IT CAN BE, THAT IS SOMETHING THE COUNCIL WANTED TO DISCUSS. THERE ARE PROS AND CONS. AS YOU KNOW ABOUT SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INVESTING AND THERE HAS BEEN CONTROVERSY OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS AND IN FACT THERE HAS BEEN LAWSUITS AROUND IT, FOR UNDERPERFORMANCE BUT IS THAT SOMETHING THAT YOU CAN ALWAYS ABUTMENT INTO A PORTFOLIO AND SOMETHING WE CAN HAVE A FURTHER CONVERSATION ON. THANK YOU, ANYTHING FURTHER, COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

I HAVE SOME, ANNA, CAN YOU REFRESH MY MEMORY, WHEN WE STARTED TO CONTEMPLATE SECTION 115 WE HAD 2.6 MILLION?

2.8 MILLION IN THE INTERNAL FUND 105.

RIGHT, THEN WE ONLY PUT ONE .6 IN?

WE PUT ONE .8 IN AND LEFT WITH 1 MILLION.

LEFT WITH 1 MILLION, OKAY, IN CASE THIS COMES UP DURING THE BUDGET DISCUSSION ABOUT WHETHER WE SHOULD PUT THE FULL 1 MILLION IN, WHO IS GOING TO PROVIDE THAT ADVICE? GIVEN OUR SPECIFIC SITUATION WE ARE IN AND THE FINANCES, THE FINANCIAL SITUATIONS THE CITY CONTINUES TO BE IN, WHO CAN SAY WHETHER WE SHOULD ADD IN ALL THE MILLION, SOME OF THE MILLION, GIVEN THE CLIMATE WE ARE IN.

IT IS THAT THE COUNCIL'S DISCRETION. THE MILLION DOLLARS RIGHT NOW IS SEPARATE FROM THE GENERAL FUND. IT IS SET ASIDE, IT IS NOT PART OF THE GENERAL FUND. THE CITY IS SOMEWHAT STABLE, AS FAR AS FINANCIALLY. YOU CAN CHOOSE TO DELIBERATE TO PUT ALL THE MILLION DOLLARS INTO THE 115 TRUST OR YOU CAN DO HALF, IT IS UP TO THE COUNCIL ENTIRELY.

OKAY. MARY, MAYBE YOU CAN HELP OUT BETWEEN NOW AND WE CONTINUE OUR SECOND PART OF THE BUDGET DISCUSSION AND MAKE DECISIONS, CAN SOMEBODY TYPE SOMETHING AND SAY, GIVEN WHAT THE UNDERSTANDING DIVERSITY IS AN ECONOMIC TIMES WE FIND OURSELVES IN, WHAT WOULD BE THEIR ADVICE ABOUT THE REMAINING MILLION? IS THAT POSSIBLE?

WE CAN TALK TO MARK AFTER THIS MEETING AND DO A MEMO TO THE COUNCIL. OKAY. MARK, IS THAT POSSIBLE? I'M ASSUMING HE WOULD BE ON BOARD BETWEEN NOW AND JUNE 17th.

SORRY, I SHOULD NOT ASSUME. MARK, DO YOU HAVE ANY INPUT REGARDING THE MILLION DOLLARS THAT WE CURRENTLY HAVE?

YES, AND WE CAN MEET WITH ANNA AND THE TEAM AND PUT TOGETHER A MEMO FOR YOU AND GET THAT TO YOU IN THE NEXT 5 TO 7 BUSINESS DAYS.

THANK YOU. ANY OTHER QUESTIONS FROM MY COLLEAGUES BEFORE WE RECEIVE THIS? COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

NOT ABOUT THE PORTFOLIO BUT KIND OF ABOUT HOW WE TREAT OUR CALPERS STRATEGY. I KNOW WE ARE GETTING ADVICE FROM TILLEY LIKE HOW WE MUCH MANAGE THIS. WHAT ARE THE OPPORTUNITIES THAT WE HAVE TO ADJUST HOW MUCH WE PUT IN AND DO WE HAVE A VERY GOOD HANDLE ON WHAT ARE OBLIGATIONS OF OUTFLOW FOR THE PENSIONS ARE? LIKE ARE WE GOING TO SEE A WAVE COMING INTO RECALL THESE? HOW DOES THIS WORK?

YOU HAVE A RESPONSE TO THAT, MARK?

FIRST OF ALL, YOU HAVE YOUR ONGOING PENSION OBLIGATION, WHICH MOST CITIES PAY OUT OF THEIR CASH FLOW. AS A REMINDER, THE 115 TRUST IS IN A REVOCABLE TRUST. HOWEVER, IT CAN BE UTILIZED FOR REIMBURSING THE CITY, FOR ITS OUTLAY IN THE PREVIOUS FISCAL YEAR. IN THE EVENT THE CITY HAS AN OUTLAY OF \$2 MILLION AND THEY FELL SHORT OF LIQUID ASSETS OR NEEDED REVENUE, THEY COULD ALWAYS PULL THE MONEY OUT OF THE TRUST AND REIMBURSED IT. I THINK AN OVERALL ASSESSMENT OF YOUR CURRENT CASH FLOW, YOUR BUDGET AND YOUR EBBS AND FLOWS OVER THE 12 MONTHS FROM THE BUDGETING STANDPOINT, WILL THEN DETERMINE, DUE PUT THE MILLION IN? BUT HALF 1 MILLION IN OR NOTHING IN? AND LEAVE THE MONEY INSIDE YOUR OVERALL GENERAL ACCOUNT TO BE UTILIZED BY THE CITY.

GIVEN YOUR EXPERIENCE, DO PROVIDE ADVICE?

YES, WE DO. WE HELP ON CASH FLOW OF BOTH 115'S AND CITY ASSETS TO MAXIMIZE UNDER THE CODA 53 601 AND WHAT HAS CHANGED DRAMATICALLY AND I'M SURE YOU ARE ALL VERY AWARE, IN 2019 WE WERE LIVING IN AN INTEREST RATE WORLD OF 3.5% AND WE GET THE 2020 AND IT GOES TO ZERO, YOU GET THE 2022 AND IT GOES TO 5.5 AND TODAY YOU ARE AT 4.2 AND 4.3, WITH THE POTENTIAL CUT IN THE FUTURE. WE HAVE BEEN IN THE MOST VOLATILE INTEREST RATE ENVIRONMENT THIS COUNTRY HAS EVER SEEN OVER A VERY SHORT AMOUNT OF TIME, WHAT DOES THAT MEAN TO AN INVESTOR? IT MEANS YOU WANT TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF WHERE THE MARKET IS MOVING, AS FAR AS YOUR DURATION AND SO, YES WE HELP ANALYZE THE PORTFOLIO OF THE CITY, LET ALONE THE 115 ASSETS AS FIDUCIARIES.

AND RIGHT. ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS? SEEING NONE, WE CAN GO AHEAD AND RECEIVE AND FILE AND MOVE TO THE NEXT ITEM, MARY?

WE NEED PUBLIC COMMENT.

APOLOGIES. PUBLIC COMMENT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. PUBLIC COMMENT ON INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION ON THE 115 TRUST. IF YOU LIKE TO MAKE UP PUBLIC COMMENT, I WILL GO TO CHAMBERS FIRST. ANYBODY IN CHAMBERS, KYLE?

I'LL MAKE THIS VERY BRIEF AND FEEL FREE TO INTERRUPT ME. I WANT TO MAKE SURE IS THAT WHEN YOU DO CHOOSE TO INTERRUPT ME THAT YOU RECOGNIZE THAT THE TONE IN WHICH I'M SPEAKING IS ONE THAT IS CORDIAL AND INVITING OF CONVERSATION, THIS IS ABOUT TRUST, RIGHT? WHAT WE SAW THE PREVIOUS PUBLIC COMMENT WAS SOMEBODY WHO WAS SPEAKING WHO MAY HAVE NOT BEEN SPEAKING ABOUT THE ITEM AGENDA AT HAND BUT WHAT WE SAW AS A RESPONSE FROM A CITY EMPLOYEE, SPECIFICALLY A POLICE OFFICER WHO IMMEDIATELY CAME UP BEHIND THAT SPEAKER, THAT IS CLEAR ESCALATION, NOT THE ESCALATION OF THAT NEEDS TO BE ADDRESSED AND IT NEEDS TO BE CONSIDERED AND DISCUSSED AT A FUTURE DATE. THANK YOU. THANK YOU, KYLE. NEXT I'LL GOING TO CHAMBERS. SORRY, INTO ZOOM. PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS. IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS I LIKE TO PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS INFORMATIONAL ITEM. SEEING NONE, PUBLIC COMMENT IS CLOSED WE CAN RECEIVE THE REPORT POINT

THANK YOU, MOVING ON, ACTUALLY, I SHOULD PROBABLY TAKE A PAUSE AND CHECK THE TIME AND WHAT MY FELLOW COLLEAGUES WOULD LIKE, IS THERE A REQUEST FOR A SHORT BREAK OR SHOULD WE JUST KEEP MOVING ALONG? FIVE MINUTES? IS FIVE MINUTES OKAY WITH EVERYONE? ALL RIGHT. FIVE MINUTES. WE WILL RESUME AT 7:25. THANK YOU.

EVERYONE, WE ARE RESUMING.

RECORDING IN SEAT. OKAY. SO, CODY, TIME CHECK OR WERE IN WITH YOU? ARE YOU GOOD? WE'RE GOING TO LET MARY MAKE HER TO THE SEAT WITHOUT CAUSING TOO MUCH PAIN. OKAY. MARY, FROM YOUR END ARE YOU OKAY? DURING BREAK AND AS I SAID BEFORE THIS AGENDA IS RATHER LENGTHY AND MARY DISCUSSED WITH ME, I THINK SHE HAS IDEAS, IF WE CAN LISTEN TO MARY ABOUT HER THOUGHTS OF HOW TO MOVE THROUGH THE REST OF THIS AGENDA. NEED TO ASK ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES DIRECTOR THEY WERE ABLE TO GET A HOLD OF THE CONSULTANT?

WE HAVE THE CONSULTANT FOR THE COST ALLOCATION PLAN BUT WE HAVE HEAVY ITEMS THE FORCE TONIGHT. I'M WONDERING IF WE CAN POSTPONE THE COST ALLOCATION PLAN TO EITHER THE NEXT MEETING AND POSSIBLY HAVE THE CONSULTANT TO STAY ON FOR THE BUDGET PART IN CASE THERE ARE QUESTIONS, THAT IS MY NUMBER ONE RECOMMENDATION. NUMBER TWO, WE SHOULD DO THE INFORMATIONAL ITEM ON ELDERBERRY COMMONS. WE DO NEED TO DO ITEM NUMBER 13, VAB 2561, THE NEW LAW WE HAVE TO HAVE A PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE ADOPTION OF THE BUDGET ON THE CITY VACANCY, WE CAN DO THAT TONIGHT. THE LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT, THIS IS THE THIRD TIME WE HAVE HEARD AND THAT SHOULD BE PRETTY FAST. THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET, I WOULD RECOMMEND OPENING THAT, HEARING THE INFORMATION, OPENING THE PUBLIC HEARING, HEARING PUBLIC COMMENTS BUT THEN TABLING IT UNTIL AFTER THE DISCUSSION OF THE BUDGET BECAUSE THERE MAY BE BUDGET THAT IMPACT THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT AND THEN HEARING THE BUDGET I WOULD POSTPONE THE ITEM ON, SORRY, THE RECORDS SUPERVISOR, THE TWO ITEMS, SO, ITEM NUMBER 17, 18 AND 19 WE CAN POSTPONE BUT WE WILL NEED TO HEAR ITEM 20. SO, IF THE COUNCILS AGREEABLE TO THAT WE WILL STILL TRY TO GET A HOLD OF THE CONSULTANT THAT I WOULD GO AHEAD AND MOVE FORWARD ON THE ELDERBERRY COMMONS OF THE COUNCIL IS IN CONSENSUS WITH THAT.

IS EVERYONE OKAY WITH WHAT MARY JUST SAID? I'M SEEING YES, OKAY, MARY, YES, YOU CAN SORT OF GUIDE ME THROUGH THIS.

SURE. I WANT TO ASK THE PUBLIC IF I WAS CLEAR? WHAT WE ARE GOING TO DO FOR THE REST OF THE NIGHT. I HAVE A HAND RAISED, LET ME JUST GO AHEAD IF YOU DON'T MIND IF I CAN JUST ASK FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE RE-ORDERING? YES, THANK YOU, MARY.

IS OUR CONSULTANT, THERE GO. YOU AND I AM HERE.

BECAUSE OF OUR LENGTHY AGENDA ITEM I'M NOT SURE IF YOU HEARD WHAT OUR RECOMMENDATION WAS .

I DID.

ARE YOU AGREEABLE WITH THAT?

WE ARE AMENABLE WITH HOWEVER YOU WANT TO PROCEED.

AWESOME, THANK YOU. WE WILL POSTPONE THAT BUT IF YOU COULD BE HERE FOR THE DISCUSSION ON THE BUDGET, THERE ARE QUESTIONS REGARDING THE COST ALLOCATION, THAT WOULD BE AWESOME.

NO PROBLEM, I WILL REMAIN IN THE MEETING.

THANK YOU. WE ARE GOING TO MOVE TO THE INFORMATIONAL ITEM ON ELDERBERRY COMMONS.

THANK YOU, MARY AND THEY COULD THE CONSULTANT FOR YOUR UNDERSTANDING AND YOUR ABILITY TO STAY WITH US WHILE WE START THE BUDGET DISCUSSIONS. WE ARE MOVING ALONG TO AGENDA ITEM NUMBER 12, AN INFORMATIONAL PRESENTATION ON ELDERBERRY COMMONS, SPECIFICALLY IN REFERENCE TO THE POLICE RESPONSE. THE ITEM IS FOR COUNCIL TO RECEIVE THE REPORT ON POLICE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE CALLS AT THE NEWLY OPENED ELDERBERRY COMMONS FACILITY, LOCATED AT 6751 SEBASTOPOL AVENUE AND PROVIDE ANY FEEDBACK TO THE CHIEF OF POLICE REGARDING ANY CONCERNS OR RECOMMENDATIONS MOVING FORWARD. I WILL STATE THE FISCAL IMPACT PART. THERE IS NO FISCAL IMPACT WITH THE RECEIPT OF THIS ITEM, HOWEVER, SEBASTOPOL POLICE HAVE SPENT 48 HOURS RESPONDING TO CALLS AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS, EQUATING TO \$4149.12 AND THE COST FOR POLICE TIME

WHILE RESPONDING TO THESE CALLS AND I THINK THE RESPONSIBLE DEPARTMENT, MARY, TO GO RIGHT TO THE CHIEF? CORRECT. CHIEF?

GOOD EVENING, SHOULD I GO TO THE STAFF REPORT IS WRITTEN? HOWEVER, MARY? YES.

FOR CLARITY ON THAT. I ASKED FOR UPDATED FIGURES ON THE TIME WE HAVE SPENT THERE AS OF TODAY AND THAT IS NOW 56 HOURS AND 26 MINUTES AND THAT DOES NOT INCLUDE THE CONSTRUCTION REPORTS OR ANY FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATIONS. BUT I WOULD JUST REFER BACK TO THE STAFF REPORT. IN THE EXECUTIVE SUMMARY, ELDERBERRY COMMONS LOCATED AT 6751 SEBASTOPOL AVENUE IS A PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING COMMUNITY, DEVELOPED TO ASSIST INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. THE SITE WAS FORMALLY THE SEBASTOPOL IN AND WAS ACQUIRED BY THE COUNTY OF SONOMA THROUGH THE SONOMA COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION IN DECEMBER OF 2020, USING FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA PROJECT HOME KEY PROGRAM. CHIEF, THANK YOU FOR THAT AND WE HAVE RECEIVED THE STAFF REPORT.

OVERJOYED TO HEAR FROM YOU, SIR?

BE LIKE TO ADD ANYTHING.

MY APOLOGIES.

NO WORRIES.

IT IS QUITE CLEAR IN THE STAFF REPORT THAT WE HAVE SPENT A COPIOUS AMOUNT OF TIME TENDING TO THIS LOCATION, FOR WHAT I PERCEIVED TO BE AVOIDABLE ISSUES, THAT ARE OUTSIDE OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OR THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL'S CONTROL. I'M HOPING THAT THERE IS SOME WAY WE CAN MITIGATE THAT TIME, WORKING WITH THE RESPECTIVE STAKEHOLDERS TO INCREASE DELIVERABLES OR SOMEHOW EVOLVE OUR MI USE, SO THAT WE HAVE SOME SORT OF A STANDARD AND PEOPLE ARE HELD TO ACCOUNT WITH THEIR ACTUAL ROLES ARE. THAT IS BASICALLY THE BOTTOM LINE FOR ME. WE ARE SPENDING A HUGE AMOUNT OF TIME RESPONDING AND HUGE AMOUNT OF FOLLOW-UP TIME IS NOT ACCOUNTED FOR AND IS DIFFICULT TO ACCOUNT FOR. WE HAVE TROUBLE FIGURING OUT HOW MUCH TIME AN OFFICER MAY SPEND WRITING A REPORT OR A FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES THE POLICE DEPARTMENT RELATED TO THIS BECAUSE THEY ARE NOT NECESSARILY CAPTURED IN A FORMAT THAT WE CAN PULL THE DATA FOUR. I'M NOT SURE IF YOU GOT SPECIFIC QUESTIONS I CAN ADDRESS OR IF THAT IS WELL ENOUGH.

THANK YOU, THANK YOU FOR ADDING TO YOUR WRITTEN REPORT AND WE ARE DEFINITELY OPENING UP TO QUESTIONS FROM COLLEAGUES. I SAW COUNCILMEMBER MAURER FIRST AND THEN HINTON.

CENSUS IS A COUNTY PROJECT , COULD THE RESIDENCE BE DIRECTED TO CALL THE SHERIFF?

I THINK THAT IS NOT THE CASE BECAUSE IT FALLS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE CITY OF SEBASTOPOL . IT IS LOCATED IN OUR CITY.

I UNDERSTAND BUT IT IS A COUNTY PROJECT, SO, IF THE MANAGEMENT WOULD DIRECT THE RESIDENCE OF THEIR HAVING A PROBLEM TO CALL THE SHERIFF THAT IT WOULD FALL BACK ONTO THE COUNTY TO HELP.

AND THERE ARE NUMBER OF ISSUES THERE FROM A PUBLIC SAFETY STANDPOINT. IT IS OUR JOB TO PROTECT THE VULNERABLE FROM HARM, OUR PROXIMITY TO THAT LOCATION IS IDEAL TO RESPOND, IT IS WITHIN OUR CITY, WE DO THE RIGHT THING AND RESPOND, I JUST THINK THAT THERE ARE THINGS WE CAN DO OR THINGS THAT OTHER PEOPLE CAN DO OR OTHER ORGANIZATIONS CAN DO THAT

WILL GREATLY REDUCE, MAYBE NOT ELIMINATE BUT GREATLY REDUCE THE ISSUES OCCURRING AT THAT LOCATION. WE NEED EVERYONE TO COME TO THE TABLE TO DO THAT.

WHAT CAN THE COUNCIL DO? WHAT CAN WE DO?

THE COUNCIL, WILL THE TWO REPRESENTATIVES THAT WE HAVE THAT ARE FOR THE UNHOUSED, THEY HAVE BEEN VERY HELPFUL IN COMING TO THE TABLE WITH IDEAS AND HELPING US MEET WITH PROSPECTIVE STAKEHOLDERS TO TRY TO RESOLVE ISSUES BUT WE ARE STILL NOT COMPLETELY THERE YET, IT IS A LENGTHY PROCESS GETTING PEOPLE TOGETHER AT THE RIGHT TIMES AND WE'VE ALL GOT BUSY SCHEDULES. BUT THAT CONTINUES, THE CONTINUED COLLABORATION I THINK WILL BE INSTRUMENTAL IN RESOLVING ISSUES. GREAT. BEFORE COUNCILMEMBER HINTON, ALEX, CAN YOU WEIGH IN ON COUNCILMEMBER MAURER'S FIRST QUESTION ABOUT DIRECTING THE CALLS TO SOMEBODY ELSE?

THE CITY IS THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY WITHIN OUR JURISDICTIONAL BOUNDARIES. EVEN THOUGH THE COUNTY HAS SOME INVOLVEMENT IN THIS PROJECT WE ARE STILL A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY. BUT TO YOUR POINT, THE COUNTY IS A PARTNER IN THIS AND SO, THERE ARE EFFORTS OR WILL BE EFFORTS TO HAVE THEM GET INVOLVED, WE HAVE NO AGREEMENTS WITH THE OWNER OF THIS BUILDING OR ANYONE THERE REGARDING THIS BUILDING, THE COUNTY DOES, SO, THERE ARE EFFORTS TO GET THE COUNTY INVOLVED. I DON'T KNOW IF MARY WANTS TO SPEAK TO SOME OF THE OTHER EFFORTS THAT ARE ONGOING. BEFORE I GO TO COUNCILMEMBER HINTON, MARY? DO YOU WANT TO ELABORATE NOW?

I CAN, JUST YOU KNOW WE HAVE MET WITH WEST COUNTY COMMITTEE SERVICES WHO IS ALSO WORKING WITH BURBANK ON THE UNHOUSED ON THE ISSUES THAT ARE GOING DOWN THERE. WE ARE SETTING A MEETING WITH BURBANK HOUSING TO TALK TO THEM ABOUT WHAT THE ISSUES ARE GOING DOWN THERE AND POTENTIALLY AFTER THAT WE WOULD PROBABLY WANT TO SET A MEETING WITH THE COUNTY TO DISCUSS WITH THEM THE AGREEMENT THAT THEY HAVE WITH BURBANK AND THE ISSUES THAT ARE HAPPENING THERE AS WELL. A LOT OF IT IS TO ADDRESS THE AMOUNT OF HOURS AND STAFF TIME THAT OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT IS SPENDING DOWN THERE ON THIS ONE ITEM. WE ARE IN THE WORKS OF ALL THESE MEETINGS TAKING PLACE BUT WE WANTED TO BRING IT TO THE COUNCIL'S ATTENTION, THE AMOUNT OF STAFF TIME THAT HAS BEEN, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN DOWN THERE. IF YOU THINK YOU, MARY. COUNCILMEMBER HINTON?

YES, IT LOOKS LIKE AND I LOST IT, BASICALLY WHAT YOU WANTED FROM US IT STATES IN THE BOTTOM OF THE AGENDA ITEM IS THAT YOU WANT US TO RECEIVE THE REPORT AND FORWARD IT MOVING FORWARD. IT'S SOMETHING THAT IS BEING DONE, I GUESS THAT WAS MY OUESTION.

YES, THAT IS BEING DONE. IT IS REALLY TO PUT INTO THE COMMUNITY AS WELL, BEING TRANSPARENT WITH THE TIME AND EXPENSE OF US RESPONDING TO THESE REPETITIVE ISSUES THAT COULD BE ADDRESSED INTERNALLY AT THAT LOCATION. I HAVE SEEN SOME OF THE REPORTS AND YEAH. I CANNOT REALLY I GUESS, BECAUSE IT IS A PRESENTATION.

GREAT. I THINK IT WAS COUNCILMEMBER CARTER AND THEN VICE MAYOR. I AM SURE WE WOULD LOVE TO COLLABORATE AND HELP YOU FIND SOLUTIONS. AT WHAT POINT DO YOU THINK WE CAN HAVE SOME MORE INFORMATION OR CAN YOU SHARE A LITTLE BIT MORE ABOUT THE ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE

RESPONSIBLE FOR THIS? SO THAT WE HAVE IT MORE VERIFIED WITH THE OFFICERS ABILITY TO CONTROL THE SITUATION COULD BE OR OUR POSITION TO BE INVOLVED. YOU AND YOU WANT ME TO ANSWER THAT? SURE.

PLEASE, CORRECT ME IF I MESSED UP ON THIS BUT MY UNDERSTANDING IS THAT BURBANK HOUSING ARE THE RESPONSIBLE PARTY FOR THE LEASES AND THERE ARE ISSUES THAT WE GET INVOLVED IN THAT OR MUDDYING OF THE WATERS, SO TO SPEAK, WE ARE CALLED TO THE LOCATION FOR ISSUES THAT COULD BE ADDRESSED WITH ENFORCING THE LEASE AND THE TERMS OF THE LEASE, WHICH IS AN INTERNAL THING FOR BURBANK. THAT IS PROBABLY THE BOTTOM LINE FOR THEM. W CCS OFFER SERVICES TO THE PEOPLE THAT RESIDE THERE BUT WE ALSO HAVE A SIDE M.O. YOU WITH THEM WITH THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FUNDING \$40,000 A YEAR, WHICH IS BASICALLY 20 HOURS A WEEK FOR AN OUTREACH COORDINATOR, WITH W CCS AND THE SERVICES ARE TO GO PROVIDE OUTREACH SERVICES TO THE OUTHOUSE THAT THE CITY, SO, WE ARE NOT PAYING FOR THAT PERSON TO DO ANYTHING WITH ELDERBERRY COMMONS SPECIFICALLY, SO, THAT SAME PARENT ORGANIZATION W CCS HAVE A FORK IN THE ROAD AS FAR AS WE ARE CONCERNED AS THEY HAVE THEIR OWN SERVICES TO ELDERBERRY AND THEN THEY HAVE THE SERVICES THAT WE PAY FOR WHERE THEY GO OUT AND PROACTIVELY TRY TO ASSIST UNHOUSED PEOPLE WITHIN THE CITY. THANK YOU, ALEX, YOU LOOK LIKE YOU WERE LIVING IN?

--

YOU AGREE?

ABSOLUTELY.

VICE MAYOR?

SORRY, MEANT TO ASK US BEFORE BUT I WAS LOOKING FOR THEM, WE ALWAYS RECEIVE REPORTS FROM WCCS, ARE YOU STILL RECEIVING THEM? YOU MENTIONED THE FORK IN THE ROAD BUT FOR THE COORDINATOR WE USUALLY RECEIVE REPORTS ARE YOU RECEIVING ANY REPORTS AT THIS POINT FROM THEM? DON'T RECALL RECEIVING ONE FOR LIKE THE LAST MONTH OR TWO. IS THE LAST ONE IS FROM JANUARY . I WAS WONDERING IF YOU ARE. COULD NOT RECALL THE SPECIFIC DATE BUT AT LEAST A MONTH OR TWO. I REALIZE THAT LIKE AN HOUR BEFORE MEETING AND THAT'S WHY COULD NOT ASK YOU.

YOU NORMALLY GET A REPORT SAYING THEY HAVE SPOKEN WITH THIS MANY PEOPLE.

WILL SHARE WITH YOU, I PRINT OUT A WHOLE BUNCH FROM LAST YEAR. ANYWAY.

I DON'T RECALL RECEIVING ONE RECENTLY.

THE QUESTION I HAVE, ALEX, YOU INDICATED THAT WE HAVE NO OFFICIAL RELATIONSHIP WITH BURBANK HOUSING BUT IT SOUNDED LIKE YOU THOUGHT THAT WE HAD SOME TYPE OF RELATIONSHIP WITH THE COUNTY, CAN YOU ELABORATE WITH WHOM AND IN WHAT CAPACITY WOULD WE HAVE ANY RELATIONSHIP TO WORK WITH THE COUNTY AND TO HOLD THEM RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL THE SITUATION WE ARE HEARING?

WE DON'T HAVE CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP WITH THE COUNTY BUT OUR SUPERVISOR REPRESENTS US, YOU KNOW, SO, IT IS THAT SORT OF, WE HAVE A POLITICAL RELATIONSHIP OR A PERSONAL RELATIONSHIP, NOT A CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP. WITH THE COUNTY.

I WANT TO BE CLEAR THOUGH, BECAUSE THERE IS A LOT OF EXIT PEOPLE WHOSE LIVES ARE BEING AFFECTED BY THIS, ARE YOU SAYING THAT WE HAVE NOTHING TO HOLD THE COUNTY RESPONSIBLE FOR FROM A LEGAL POINT OF VIEW ABOUT ALL THE STUFF THAT IS HAPPENING AT THAT LOCATION? CORRECT.

THERE IS NOTHING TIED WITH THE CDC? THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT, COMMISSION.

NOT BETWEEN THE CITY AND THE CDC. WHAT THE COUNTY DOES HAVE OR APPEARS TO HAVE IS THAT THEY HAVE AGREEMENTS WITH BURBANK HOUSING AND SO, THERE MAY BE SOME EFFORT WE CAN MAKE TO HAVE THE COUNTY WERE ACTIVELY MONITOR AND ENFORCE THAT AGREEMENT BUT THAT IS MORE OF A, FOR LACK OF A BETTER WORD, A PRESSURE CAMPAIGN AGAINST THE COUNTY RATHER THAN ANY LEGAL AUTHORITY WE WOULD HAVE. SOON GREAT. THANK YOU. JUST WANTED TO BE CLEAR BECAUSE I'M SURE WE'LL GET LOTS OF PUBLIC COMMENT, AND RIGHTFULLY SO ON THIS ISSUE. VICE MAYOR? IT OCCURRED TO ME, GIVEN THAT WE HAVE HAD THE HOME KEY PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY THAT EVENTUALLY EVOLVED TO WHERE WE ARE AT NOW, DO YOU KNOW OF ANY OTHER CITIES THAT ACTUALLY HAVE ANY TYPE OF AGREEMENTS OR SOMETHING, YOU KNOW, BEEN IN THE SITUATION AND ARE MANAGING IT? WITH THE COUNTY.

I AM NOT AWARE OF ANY. THERE ARE CITIES WHERE THE AGREEMENT, THE CITY IS THE PARTNER IN THE HOME KEY. BUT NOT IN THE SITUATION.

THIS LEADS ME TO ANOTHER QUESTION BECAUSE I AM THE PRIMARY COUNCIL LIAISON TO THE COALITION ON THE HOMELESS, WHICH IS AN ENTITY WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ARE VICE MAYOR IS THE ALTERNATE. SO, ALEX, JEFF FAMILIARITY ON HOW THAT WORKS AND WHAT LEVERAGE WE CAN APPLY IN ORDER TO GET MORE SERVICES FROM THIS ENTITY THAT WE SERVE ON THE BOARD OF?

YOU CAN HAVE SOME ROLE IN ASSIGNING THE MONEY THAT COMES DOWN FROM HUD AND THE COULD BE EFFORTS MADE THERE TO GET MORE OF IT. THIS IS SOMETHING I KNOW THE COUNCIL IS WELL AWARE OF. FOR THE SPECIFIC PROJECT OR JUST IN OUR COMMUNITY, GETTING MORE OF THAT MONEY FOR RESOURCES HERE OR IN WEST COUNTY RATHER THAN, OFTEN PEOPLE THINK IT IS PROPORTIONAL AMOUNT IS GOING TO SANTA ROSA, FOR EXAMPLE. RIGHT. THIS IS A JPA, ALL THE REGULAR RULES OF HOW WE INTERACT WITH JPA'S WOULD STILL APPLY HERE BUT IF THERE GETS TO BE STICKY POINTS, BECAUSE I WILL SAY THAT I AM NOW MEETING AND MARY WAS IN ON THE LOOP AS WELL, A COUPLE OF THE MAYORS ARE HAVING A SITDOWN WITH THE NEW DIRECTOR FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HOUSING HEALTH AND AND I'M WANTING TO KNOW WHAT YOU WOULD SUGGEST THAT WE BRING TO THE TABLE AT THAT MEETING? YOU KNOW. I WILL HAVE TO THINK ABOUT THAT MORE BUT I THINK THAT IS MORE OF AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE LARGER ISSUE, NOT NECESSARILY THIS SPECIFIC SITUATION, I DON'T KNOW THAT THEY HAVE A HUGE ROLE IN THE SITUATION, AS OPPOSED TO THE CDC.

OKAY, VICE MAYOR?

I HAVE A QUESTION THAT IS MORE ABOUT THE BROADER VIEW. I TOOK A PROACTIVE APPROACH AND HAVE A SCANNER AND TURNED IT ON BECAUSE I WANT TO KNOW WHAT IS GOING ON AND I HAVE A BUSINESS WITHIN 100 FEET OF THIS FACILITY AND I HAVE A DAY-TO-DAY VIEW OF WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THE POLICE COMING AND GOING. I JUST WONDER, LISTENING TO THE SCANNER I'VE

HEARD WHERE, YOU KNOW POLICE OFFICERS ARE AT ONE LOCATION AND THEN THEY GET A CALL FOR SOMEBODY ELSE IN THERE LIKE WELL I WILL BE OVER THERE AND IT SOUNDS VERY MUCH LIKE PING-PONG, OFFICERS ARE BOUNCING AROUND. WHEN WE START COMMITTING THIS NUMBER OF HOURS TO ONE ENTITY, HOW DOES THAT IMPACT THE WHOLE, FOR THE WHOLE CITY? BECAUSE I KNOW WE HAVE HAD SHORT-STAFFED AND I THINK THAT WE NEED TO FIGURE THIS OUT BUT ALSO WHAT IMPACT DOES IT HAVE ON THE GREATER PART OF OUR CITY AS FAR AS PROVIDING THE SERVICES THAT WE SHOULD BE?

HAS A HUGE IMPACT. WE HAVE TWO OFFICERS ON ANYONE SHIFT, SO, IF WE ARE RESPONDING TO ELDERBERRY WE ARE NOWHERE ELSE IN THE CITY DOING ANY TYPE OF RESPONSE, CALLS FOR SERVICE OR PROACTIVE WORK TO PROVIDE PUBLIC SAFETY SERVICES TO OUR CITIZENS. SO, TO BE SPENDING SO MUCH TIME AT ONE LOCATION IS ABSOLUTELY DETRACTING FROM WHAT WE CAN PROVIDE TO THE REST OF THE COMMUNITY.

COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

THERE WAS A PUBLIC COMMENT THAT MENTIONED THAT THIS IS NOT EXACTLY WHAT WE SIGNED UP FOR AND SO, THERE MUST'VE BEEN SOME ASSUMPTIONS ON THIS CAME IN OF SOME KIND OF OUTCOME OR SOME KIND OF EXPECTATION OF WHAT SERVICES WERE PROVIDING. IS THAT SOMETHING THAT WE CAN LOOK INTO AND GOING FORWARD IF THE SITUATION EVER ARISES WITH ANY OTHER TYPE OF PROJECT, CAN WE DEVELOP A PROTOCOL TO MAKE SURE THAT WE HAVE A LITTLE BIT MORE ABILITY TO CONTROL IT?

SO, A TWO PART ANSWER. THIS IS A COUNTY PROJECT. THERE WAS NO FORMAL ROLE OF THE CITY HERE, THERE WAS NO ASKING THE CITY'S PERMISSION OR GETTING ITS BLESSING OR GETTING INVOLVED REALLY IN ANY WAY. THIS WAS COUNTY DONE, THE COUNTY HAS THE AUTHORITY TO DO THAT. WITHIN OUR JURISDICTION OR ANY CITY, YOU KNOW FOR BETTER OR FOR WORSE AND THEY ARE SUBJECT TO OUR LAND-USE RULES OR OTHER THINGS LIKE THAT. SO, THERE IS NOT REALLY A WAY TO CHANGE THAT IN THE FUTURE, ABSENT POLITICAL PRESSURE CONVINCE THEM NOT TO DO THIS TYPE OF PROJECT HERE. FOR A DIFFERENT PROJECT, WHERE THE CITY IS A PARTNER, WE WOULD BE A PARTY TO THAT AGREEMENT AND WOULD HAVE MORE ABILITY TO ENFORCE THE TERMS OR ITS YOU KNOW, THE MIXTURE OF MANAGEMENT OF BEING CONSISTENT WITH OUR AGREEMENT AND THINGS LIKE THAT BUT AS FOR A COUNTY PROJECT WHERE THERE IS NOT MUCH WE CAN DO.

COUNCILMEMBER --?

HIM A QUESTION ABOUT THE CITY'S ABILITY TO ENGAGE THE COUNTY, THERE ARE TWO AD HOC MEMBERS AND WE DON'T WANT TO BROWN AFTER ANYTHING LIKE THAT, HOW CAN THE REST OF THE CITY COUNCIL ALSO ENGAGE THE COUNTY? INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS, I MEAN YOU'RE HEARING A PRESENTATION TONIGHT, YOU HAVE THE REPORT. INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS CAN HAVE INDIVIDUAL CONVERSATIONS WITH ANYONE AT THE COUNTY, AS LONG AS YOU ARE NOT COORDINATING THOSE WITH THE OTHER COUNCILMEMBERS. SUBJECT TO THE BROWN ACT. I GUESS THAT IS THE SIMPLE ANSWER TO THAT.

GREAT. VICE MAYOR? NO. CHIEF, THANK YOU FOR YOUR REPORT. JUST SORT OF LIKE A SYNOPSIS I KNOW YOU TYPED IT HERE, IT DOESN'T SOUND LIKE WE CAN JUST ARREST OUR WAY OUT OF THIS, RIGHT? ABSOLUTELY NOT.

BECAUSE OF THE AMOUNT, WE WOULD BE CHARGED TO HAVE THEM BE BOOKED, EVEN IF THEY WOULD BOOK OUR INDIVIDUAL PEOPLE BECAUSE THEY STILL HAVE SPACE RESTRICTIONS, IS THAT RIGHT?

YES AND THERE HAS BEEN A RECENT, 400% PRICE HIKE FOR BOOKING FEES AT SONOMA COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE WAS LITERALLY DUMPED ON US BACK IN MARCH, SO, FISCAL ISSUES, BUT FROM A COMMUNITY PERSPECTIVE THAT IS NOT THE ANSWER ANYWAY. ARRESTING YOUR WAY OUT OF THE PROBLEM IS NOT THE ANSWER, AS FAR AS I CAN TELL IF EVERYBODY JUST DID THEIR JOBS AND GOT INVOLVED AND THE STAKEHOLDERS WORKS TOGETHER YOU COULD SOLVE THE PROBLEM FROM THE INSIDE OUT.

AND EVEN IF WE DID HAVE UNLIMITED AMOUNT OF MONEY, THE DECISION ABOUT WHO GETS BOOKED IN IS NOT YOURS, RIGHT?

I MEAN WE CAN STILL TAKE PEOPLE TO JAIL AND BOOKED THEM IN AND THE COUNTY CAN CITE THEM OUT. WE DON'T HAVE THAT FINAL DETERMINATION A LOT OF THE TIME AND WE ARE FINDING THAT FOR QUITE SERIOUS THINGS.

OKAY, WE CANNOT ARREST OUR WAY OUT OF THEM KENNY 5150 OUT OF IT AND CAN YOU EXPLAIN BRIEFLY WHETHER THAT WOULD APPLY TO MOST THE CASES YOU SEE OR IT WOULD NOT A PLAY TO MOST THE CASES THEY SEE?

ABOUT THE SKU WAS A QUESTION ABOUT WHETHER ALCOHOL AND DRUGS CAN LEAD TO A 5150, WHICH PEOPLE DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT IS THAT IS A MENTAL HEALTH HOLD, NO. THERE ARE CERTAIN CRITERIA THAT NEEDS TO BE MET IN ORDER TO 5150 SOMEBODY, NEED TO ENDANGER THEMSELVES OR OTHERS AND IT IS A TOUGH STANDARD TO MEET.

OKAY. COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

WHEN YOU RECEIVE THESE CALLS, DO YOU ALSO IMMEDIATELY CALL IN THE RESPONSIBLE PARTIES AT THE ELDERBERRY, WHOEVER IS MANAGING?

NO BECAUSE TYPICALLY IS A COMPLAINT ABOUT DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE AND THEN IT LEADS INTO OTHER CONVERSATIONS ABOUT WELL, THIS PERSON HAS BEEN LURED TO THE LOCK GATE, THE SECURITY GUARD IS NOT ENFORCING I.D. REQUIREMENTS THAT THEY HAVE, THEIR ISSUES THAT ARE NOT OURS, WE DON'T GET INVOLVED IN CIVIL MATTERS LIKE THAT OR CONTROLLING LEASE TERMS OR ENFORCING LEASE TERMS.

RIGHT, I WAS JUST THINKING THAT WHEN YOU GET A CALL, YOU CALL THEM TO MAKE SURE THAT THEY KNOW YOU'RE GOING OUT THERE ALL THE TIME? LIKE IT IS A SQUEAKY WHEEL GETS THE GREASE KIND OF A THING.

NO, BECAUSE THE SERVICES THEY OFFER DO NOT RELATE TO THE CALLS FOR SERVICE THAT WE ARE RESPONDING TO, WE ARE RESPONDING TO TERMINAL COMPLAINTS OR DISTURBANCE OF THE PEACE AND THEY ARE PROVIDING OUTREACH TYPE SERVICES. TO THE PEOPLE THAT LIVE THERE, THEY ARE COMPLETELY SEPARATE. ISSUES.

ANYWAY, THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE.

I'VE A FEW ANSWERS FOR THAT. PART OF THE ISSUE IS THAT WHEN THEY OPENED THE FACILITY, THE BANK HAD NO PROPERTY MANAGER, A VERY CLEAR AND IS IN A LOT OF DIFFERENT THINGS THEY DON'T HAVE ANYONE ON SITE TO MANAGE AND SECONDLY, WEST COUNTY SERVICES HAS MADE IT CLEAR THEIR JOB IS TO MANAGE SOCIAL SERVICES AND NOTHING ELSE. NOTHING RELATED TO ANY OF THE PROPERTY MANAGEMENT, SO, IN ABSENCE OF THAT, IS WHAT YOU GET. AND NOW APPARENTLY THEY DO HAVE SOMEONE, SO, OR AT LEAST THAT IS WHAT I'VE HEARD, I HAVE NOT HAD A DISCUSSION WITH THEM BUT IT IS ALL HEARSAY THIS POINT, UNTIL WE HAVE A MEETING WITH BURBANK.

AND WE HAVE THAT COMING UP TOMORROW.

TOMORROW, GREAT. ABOUT SECURITY, CHIEF, CAN YOU REFRESH YOUR MEMORY, WHAT SECURITY DO THEY HAVE? BECAUSE WHEN WE DID, WE MOVE PEOPLE OFF OF MOTOR STREET, THE PROBLEM THEY HAD WAS THE BACK WALL WAS NOT FENCED AND PEOPLE WOULD CLIMB OVER THE WALL TO DO SOMETHING WITH THE PEOPLE THAT WERE STAYING THERE, IS THAT WHAT IS HAPPENING HERE? LIKE THEY ARE CRAWLING OVER THINGS TO GET INTO THE FACILITY? BECAUSE THERE IS NO SECURITY, THERE IS NO FENCING, CAN YOU EXPLAIN?

I HAVE NOT HEARD ANYTHING SPECIFIC ABOUT PEOPLE JUMPING FENCES WHILE DISTRACTING A SECURITY GUARD, IT COULD WELL BE HAPPENING AND PROBABLY SOME RESIDENTS HERE TONIGHT CAN SPEAK TO THAT. I PERSONALLY HAVE RESPONDED TO CALLS OUT THERE OR JUST DRIVEN UPON THEM WHEN I'VE BEEN DOING ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AREA AND I HAPPENED UPON THEM, SECURITY NOT DOING THEIR JOB AND HAD WORDS WITH THEM ABOUT IT WHERE THEY ARE NOT DOING ANYTHING ABOUT THE ISSUE BEFORE BECOMES AN ISSUE. AND THEN THERE IS THE SIDE ASPECT OF THEIR WORK, AS I UNDERSTAND THEY'RE SUPPOSED TO BE REGULATING WHO COMES IN AND OUT OF THE FACILITY AND THEY ARE NOT DOING THAT. THEY ARE SOMEWHAT SCARED OF CERTAIN OCCUPANTS OR EVEN PEOPLE THAT DON'T LIVE THERE, THAT FREQUENT THE LOCATION, SO, THEY'RE JUST NOT CHECKING THEM AND JUST GIVING THEM A FREE PASS. SO WE START SNOWBALL.

OKAY. NOT SINGING OF EXTRA TIME TO DOCUMENT WHAT IT IS YOU ARE HEARING ABOUT SECURITY FROM YOUR PERSPECTIVE NOT DOING WHAT YOU EXPECT ANY OTHER SECURITY OUTFIT TO DO, IS THERE A WAY, LIKE I'M SAYING THIS BECAUSE WHEN WE HAVE THE MEETING TOMORROW WITH THEM I WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO HAVE SOMETHING TO CONVEY THAT WHAT HE SAID TONIGHT WAS THAT THEY ARE REALLY NOT DOING WHAT YOU WOULD THINK SECURITY PEOPLE SHOULD BE DOING.

THROWING UP ONCE I HAVE SEEN. THERE MAY BE SOME THAT ARE VERY WELL DOING THE JOB BUT I HAVE HAD WORDS WITH A COUPLE OF THEM RELATING TO THEIR JOB FUNCTIONS AND WHILE THEY DO NOT WORK FOR ME, IT DOES NOT TAKE A PARTICULARLY INTELLIGENT PERSON TO WORK OUT WHAT THEIR ROLE ACTUALLY IS OUT THERE AND I CAN JUST SEE THAT THERE IS A WAY THAT IF THEY WERE DOING MORE ABOUT REGULATING ENTRY INTO AND OUT OF THAT PROPERTY THAT A LOT OF THESE ISSUES WOULD BE TAKEN CARE OF BEFORE THEY BECAME A POLICE ISSUE.

THANK YOU. I THINK I SAW VICE MAYOR.

HAVE A QUESTION ABOUT WHAT IS ALLOWED AND NOT ALLOWED IN A PRIVATE PARKING LOT LIKE THAT BECAUSE ONE OF THE OTHER BUSINESS OWNERS THERE, EVERY TIME I SEE HER SHE EXPRESSES GREAT CONCERN THAT WE HAVE HAD SOME PEOPLE LIVING IN THEIR VEHICLES AND AS SHE SAID, SHE WENT AND APPROACH THEM, SHE SAID THEY WERE DRUG DEALERS, I HAVE NO IDEA IF THAT IS TRUE OR NOT. SHE SAID SHE HAS HAD TO ASK THEM TO LEAVE, THEY WERE LIVING THERE FOR A WEEK AT A TIME, I AM WONDERING WHAT CAN I TELL HER THAT SHE CAN DO? IS IT TO CALL YOU? OR THE PROPERTY MANAGERS? I KNOW SHE REACHED OUT TO -- AS WE SHARE THE SAME PROPERTY MANAGER BUT I'M NOT CLEAR ON WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU HAVE THAT KIND OF PARKING LOT.

MY UNDERSTANDING IS YOU NEED TO CONTACT THE PROPERTY MANAGER AND HAVE THEM REACH OUT TO US ABOUT REMOVING SOMEBODY FROM THE PROPERTY.

I KNOW THEY SIGNED THAT FORM BECAUSE I HAD TO HAVE THAT DONE A FEW YEARS AGO WHEN THIS PROJECT STARTED BEFORE SLEEPING ON MY STOOP AND YOU KNOW AT NIGHT MISBEHAVING. SO, THEY WOULD STILL NEED, THE PROPERTY MANAGER NEEDS TO CALL YOU BEFORE SOMEONE CAN BE REMOVED? IF THERE IS A FORM THAT IS SIGNED AND CURRENT, THAT MAY ALLOW US TO TAKE SOME SORT OF ACTION BUT I WOULD HAVE TO CHECK THAT THAT IS CURRENT AND WHICH DOCUMENT THEY SIGNED AS I BELIEVE THERE HAVE BEEN A COUPLE OF VERSIONS.

CORRECT ME IF I'M WRONG BUT IT WOULD NOT BE ADVISED FOR THE PUBLIC TO GO OUT AND CONFRONT QUESTIONABLE PEOPLE.

PLEASE DO NOT DO THAT, WE ARE HERE TO TAKE CARE OF YOU. IF THERE ARE ANY ISSUES JUST PLEASE CALL US.

I KEEP SAYING THAT, I THINK THE FRUSTRATION IS HIM FEELING IS BUBBLING OVER.

YES, SOME OF THE RESIDENCE WE SPEAK WITH REGULARLY AND THEY'RE CLEARLY FRUSTRATED. HER SCARE A LOT OF GOOD PEOPLE THAT LIVE THERE. PROBABLY A MINORITY THEY'RE NOT, IT IS THE NATURE OF THE BEAST. BUT THERE ARE WAYS WE CAN ADDRESS IT I THINK.

HAVE A QUESTION FOR YOU, ALEX. UNDER HOUSING FIRST YOU HAVE TO TAKE EVERYONE IN, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THEY ARE ACTIVELY USING SUBSTANCES OR NOT, RIGHT? IT IS CALLED A WET FACILITY IS THAT YOUR UNDERSTANDING?

I DON'T KNOW HAVE TO LOOK FOR THE SPECIFIC POLICIES, I DON'T KNOW THEM OFF THE TOP MY HEAD.

OKAY. RIGHT NOW THOUGH THERE IS NOTHING TO KEEP ANYONE OFF THE PROMISE TO THE ACTIVE DRUG OR ALCOHOL USE, CORRECT?

DO NOT QUOTE ME ON THIS BUT MY GENERAL UNDERSTANDING OF THOSE POLICIES IS THAT THEY USE ALONE IS NOT GROUNDS FOR TERMINATING THE LEASE BUT RELATED BEHAVIOR COULD BE AND SELLING DRUGS COULD BE BUT SOMEONE SIMPLY USING SUBSTANCES IN THE ROOM WOULD NOT BE, THAT IS MY GENERAL UNDERSTANDING OF HOW THOSE HOUSING FIRST POLICIES WORK. THANK YOU. THANK YOU FOR BEARING WITH ALL OF MY QUESTIONS, ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

SORRY FOR ALL THE QUESTIONS BUT I AM A REAL FAN OF THE -- TRAIL AND MY KIDS AND ME GO UP AND DOWN IT AND I AM MILDLY CONCERNED ABOUT THAT BEING A BIT OF A HIGHWAY. I AM WONDERING LIKE IF YOU ARE ABLE TO OFFER TRAINING TO THE OTHER SECURITY GUARDS OR IF WE ARE ABLE TO DO SOMETHING OUTSIDE THE BOUNDS OF THIS PLACE TO MAKE IT A LITTLE BIT MORE APPARENT THAT YOU KNOW, FOR BETTER BEHAVIOR AND PROTECTING THAT LITTLE CORRIDOR.

I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE GOVERNING POLICIES ARE OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SECURITY COMPANY IN BURBANK, I'M ASSUMING BURBANK IS THE HIRING AUTHORITY FOR THE SECURITY COMPANY. I DON'T KNOW WHAT THEY'VE ASKED THEM TO DO, I JUST MADE ASSUMPTIONS BASED ON WHAT I WOULD EXPECT SECURITY TO DO AND WHAT RESIDENCE THAT RESIDE THERE HAVE TOLD ME THEIR DUTIES ARE. BUT I GUESS THAT COULD BE PART OF THE GREATER CONVERSATION WHEN WE MEET WITH BURBANK.

GREAT. COUNCILMEMBER MAURER?

YES, I JUST WANTED TO CLARIFY THAT I WAS AT THE OPENING FOR ELDERBERRY COMMONS AND I WAS SHOWN THAT THERE IS EXTENSIVE FENCING IN THE BACK

AND THAT IT WAS A PRIORITY FOR THEM TO INCREASE THE FENCE ALL AROUND THE PROPERTY, SO, FOR SAFETY. AND THAT IS TO KEEP PEOPLE OUT, NOT TO THE PEOPLE IN, TO KEEP PEOPLE OUT.

THANK YOU. VICE MAYOR?

I WAS GOING TO SAY THAT IS TRUE BUT WHAT I HEAR FROM RESIDENCES THAT THEY ARE JUST GIVING THE CODE OUT TO EVERYBODY. YOU CAN HAVE A 50 FOOT FENCE BUT IF THE CODES AND EVERYTHING ELSE IS NOT PROTECTED THEN FENCES ME NOTHING, THAT IS ONE OF THE THINGS I KEEP HEARING FROM THE RESIDENCE THERE.

YOU ARE RIGHT, SOME RESIDENTS ARE HANDING OUT --

I'M SHARING BECAUSE I'VE HEARD THAT FROM A LOT OF PEOPLE.

SOME RESIDENTS ARE HANDING UP THE CODE AND SECURITY NOT DOING DUE DILIGENCE IN CHECKING PEOPLE TO GATE AND SAYING THEY DON'T RESIDE HERE OR YOU'RE NOT A REGISTERED VISITOR OR WHATEVER THE POLICY IS, SO, THAT IS PART OF THE ISSUE THAT I'M AWARE OF AT LEAST.

THERE ARE SOME PEOPLE WHO HAVE BEEN FOUND SLEEPING OUTSIDE IN THE GRASS AND I SEE THAT MYSELF BECAUSE I'M THERE EVERYDAY, SO, YEAH. COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

JUST ADD TO THAT, I HAD SPOKEN WITH A PERSON THAT WORKS DOWN THERE WHO MIGHT BE FOR THE NAMED FOR THEIR OWN PROTECTION AT THIS POINT BUT THEY SUGGESTED THAT A LOT OF THE COMPLAINTS THAT THEY ARE TRYING TO DO THINGS TO RECTIFY THE ISSUES INTERNALLY BUT THEY ARE BEING REQUIRED TO SOME INFORMATION TO MANAGEMENT AT BURBANK AND THAT IT PROBABLY ENDS UP IN SOME SORT OF LEGAL LOOPHOLE OR SOME SORT OF CONSIDERATION PROCESS THAT TAKES A LONG TIME. THERE IS NO QUICK WAY TO ADDRESS ISSUES, THEY ARE NOT EMPOWERED OR HAVE THE ECONOMY TO TAKE CARE OF ISSUES AS THEY ARISE AT A THINK THAT IS PART OF THE ISSUE TOO BECAUSE IF YOU GET AWAY WITH IT TODAY THAN YOU DID AGAIN TOMORROW AND THE PROBLEM GETS BIGGER AND BIGGER.

THANK YOU, THERE ARE NO MORE QUESTIONS FOR MY COLLEAGUES THEN YOU WILL GO OUT TO PUBLIC COMMENT.

THANK YOU, MAYOR. THIS IS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE INFORMATIONAL ITEM ON ELDERBERRY COMMONS. IF YOU LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT, THE PROCESS IS WE DO TWO MINUTES IN CHAMBERS FIRST, THEN ZOOM AND THEN COME BACK. GO AHEAD.

THANK YOU, CHIEF. I THINK EVERYTHING HE SAID WAS SPOT ON AND I WANT TO THANK HIM AND THE SEBASTOPOL POLICE DEPARTMENT FOR GOING ABOVE AND BEYOND DURING THIS CHALLENGING TIME. I ALSO WANT TO APOLOGIZE FOR MY REACTIONS TO A LOT OF THE THINGS GOING ON. IT MAY BE QUITE ANGRY, TO BE HONEST AND I'VE ESCALATED SOME THINGS AND BEEN QUITE HOSTILE. THE REASON BEING IS I WAS TOLD THIS WAS A FAMILY-FRIENDLY PROPERTY, MY DAUGHTER IS REPEATEDLY EXPOSED TO PROSTITUTION, CRYSTAL METH, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, ROBBERY AND IN GENERAL JUST OVERALL HOMELESS STUFF THAT COMES WITH THAT, YOU KNOW, SHOPPING CARTS, THEIR FRIENDS IN THE PARKING LOT LINGERING, LIKE AT ALL HOURS OF THE NIGHT, MY DAUGHTER GOING HOME AND REPEATING TO HER MOM, ASKING WHAT SEXUAL ACTS ARE, I'M THE FIRST PERSON TO MOVE INTO ULTRA COMMENTS, THE SECURITY GUARD WAS SMOKING METH FOR TWO MONTHS WITH RESIDENCE THERE AND I REPORTED. THEY GAVE THE REPORT TO THE WOMEN WITH ME AND MY DAUGHTER'S NAME ON IT AND CONTINUE TO LET HER WORK THERE. THERE WAS NO PROPERTY

MANAGEMENT UP UNTIL TWO WEEKS AGO. THEY KNEW THAT THE WHOLE TIME WHILE THIS WAS GOING ON AND I WAS PROMISED THIS WOULD NOT BE LIKE ST. VINCENT COMMONS IN SANTA ROSA, BEFORE I MOVED IN, FOR SIX MONTHS I WAS REPEATEDLY PROMISED, WEST COUNTY SERVICES SITS IN THE OFFICE WITH THE WINDOWS CLOSED, THE BLINDS CLOSED, TURNS A BLIND EYE TO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, CRYSTAL METH, DRUG DEALING, FENTANYL. ALL OF THESE THINGS ARE AGAINST THE LEASE. IF YOU READ OUR LEASE, I WILL PROVIDE A COPY TO ANYONE WHO IS CURIOUS, EVERY ONE OF THESE THINGS IS A LEASE VIOLATION, THEY ARE NOT REPORTING, THEY'RE TURNING A BLIND EYE TO IT, IF THEY WOULD JUST FOLLOW THE LEASE, IF SOMEONE HE WAS ENFORCING THE LEASE, EVERYTHING WOULD TAKE CARE OF ITSELF. AND THANK YOU AGAIN TO THE POLICE CHIEF AND ALL OF YOU GUYS FOR ALL OF YOUR SUPPORT AND I APOLOGIZE AGAIN. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT I WILL GO OUT TO ZOOM. ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? YES, HELLO.

GO AHEAD WITH YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT.

THIS IS A GOOD DISCUSSION. I THINK IT SHOULD BE A STANDING AGENDA ITEM EVERY MEETING UNTIL THE SITUATION STABILIZES IN PART BECAUSE IT SOUNDS LIKE EVERYONE OF THE COUNCILMEMBERS AND CITY STAFF INVOLVED IN THIS HAVE DIFFERENT BITS OF INFORMATION THAT YOU ARE NOT SHARING WITH EACH OTHER. LARGELY BECAUSE OF THE BROWN ACT OF COURSE. I GUESS WE HAVE TO DO IT IN PUBLIC MEETING. BUT THAT HELPS ALL OF US TO UNDERSTAND ALSO. SECOND, I'M NOT A LAWYER BUT AND GOT A LAWYER THERE BUT THIS WAS A COUNTY PROJECT ORIGINALLY. THEY BOUGHT THE HOTEL FROM US AND WE HAD NO CHOICES, APPARENTLY. I THINK MOST OF THE COUNCILMEMBERS AT THE TIME SUPPORTED, SO, I DON'T THINK ANYONE IS GOING TO QUESTION IT. NOW THE COUNTY HAS TURNED IT OVER TO BURBANK. BURBANK IS A BUSINESS THAT OPERATES IN SEBASTOPOL. THE COUNTY DOES NOT OWN IT, BURBANK ONSET, IT SEEMS LIKE THAT CHANGES THE LEGAL SITUATION FAIRLY DRAMATICALLY. THE COUNTY HAS A CONTRACT OR THROUGH SOME -- PROVIDING \$1900 -- BANK I GUESS IS PAYING WEST COUNTY FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE OPERATION BUT THAT DOES NOT SOUND LIKE REALLY THE COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITY, ALTHOUGH IT WOULD NOT HURT TO PUT A SHARP STICK IN THAT DIRECTION. THE LAST COMMON, I THINK THE ROOT CAUSE OF THIS PROBLEM IS THAT THE SONOMA COUNTY COORDINATOR ENTRY SYSTEM IS SENDING US FELONIES, DRUG USERS, PROSTITUTES, AS WELL AS IN THE SAME BATCH OF NEW PEOPLE, A FATHER WITH A DAUGHTER, THAT MAKES NO SENSE. THAT IS NONSENSICAL. AND SENDING DRUG USERS AND FELONS AND PROSTITUTES TO A LITTLE TOWN LIKE US IS NOT GOING TO WORK. IT IS NOT GOING TO FIT.

YOU HAVE ABOUT 20 SECONDS.

YEAH. THE COORDINATOR ENTRY SYSTEM IS GETTING CREDITED WITH THIS, THE HOMELESS COALITION BOARD APPEARS TO BE THE GOVERNING ORGANIZATION FOR THE COORDINATED ENTRY SYSTEM AND I BELIEVE STEPHEN AND -- ARE REPRESENTATIVES TO THAT BOARD, SO, IT SEEMS LIKE THAT IS ONE PLACE WE COULD PROVIDE SOME PRESSURE. INKY.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR COMMENT. NEXT I WILL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS. HI, I'M KRYSTAL, I'M A RESIDENT AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS OF MY 11-MONTH-OLD DAUGHTER. ELDERBERRY COMMONS HAS BEEN A BLESSING IN A LOT OF WAYS BUT THE ONLY WAY HE CAN CONTINUE TO BE A BLESSING FOR MY FAMILY AND FOR THOSE WHO CALL IT HOME AS IF BY BURBANK OR WHOEVER CAN BE

HELD ACCOUNTABLE TO ENFORCE THE RULES THAT WERE AGREED UPON WITH THE LEASE SIGNING. SINCE THINGS WE WERE TOLD HER NOT TRUE, WE WERE TOLD THERE WOULD BE A PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE STAFF MEMBER ON-SITE 24/7 AND THERE IS NOT ONE. I ALSO TRY TO PUT UP SIGNS SAYING THAT THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING IS GOING TO HAPPEN TODAY AND THE BURBANK STAFF PERSON, TELL YOU, SKIP MOVING MY SCIENCE THING THE CANDIDATE BECAUSE OF LEGAL PURPOSES WHEN IT IS FREEDOM OF SPEECH, YOU KNOW, SO, LIKE, FOR EXAMPLE. WE ALL, WE ALL LOST HER COMMUNITY BECAUSE OF BEING OUT ON THE STREET, A LOT OF US ARE RUGGED AND THAT STUFF AND WE ALL NEED TIME TO COME BACK TOGETHER AND THAT IS WHY THE SUPPORTIVE STAFF MEMBER SHOULD'VE BEEN THERE FOR US TO MAKE EVERYBODY'S LIFE EASIER. I UNDERSTAND THAT SEBASTOPOL BASICALLY HATES US A SENSE THERE WAS NO DANGER IN SEBASTOPOL UNTIL WE ALL SHOWED UP AND THERE ARE FIVE FAMILIES INCLUDING MYSELF THAT JUST WANT TO BE ABLE TO RAISE OUR FAMILIES IN THIS WONDERFUL TOWN OF SEBASTOPOL WITH ALL OF ITS RESOURCES AND ITS COMMUNITY AND LIKE THERE SOME GREAT THINGS HERE. WHEN I WAS AT THE FIRE AND EARTHQUAKE EXPO I ASKED THE SANTA ROSA POLICE DEPARTMENT WHY THEY DON'T SEND PEOPLE OUT HERE TO HELP SEBASTOPOL POLICE BECAUSE THEY HAVE 133 PEOPLE IN THE DEPARTMENT AND SEBASTOPOL ONLY HAS EIGHT PEOPLE. THEY SAID IT WOULD BE UP TO THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE TO COME OUT HERE. MY IDEA TO MAKE OUR COMMUNITY SAFER IS TO HAVE AN OFFICER, LIKE A SHERIFF POSTED AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS TO EASE THE BURDENS ON SEBASTOPOL POLICE FORCE AND TO MAKE EVERYONE'S LIFE EASIER. ABOUT 20 SECONDS.

I DON'T KNOW, LIKE OTHER THAN THAT LIKE IT IS JUST, IT IS JUST, WE LIKE, THERE IS JUST SO MUCH THAT I WISH EVERYBODY, THE DRUGS AND STUFF, NOBODY WANTS TO BE HELD ACCOUNTABLE, NOBODY WANTS TO ENFORCE THE RULES AND THEY ALL WANT TO LIKE MAKE THE COPS DO IT AND IT IS NOT THEIR FAULT, THEY DON'T HAVE ENOUGH ANYWAY. IT IS UP TO BURBANK, IT IS UP TO WCCS. THAT IS YOUR TWO MINUTES.

TO JUST DO THEIR JOBS. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC, , NEXT I WILL GO TO ZOOM, MARY, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? THANK YOU, GO AHEAD. THANKS. THIS IS FRIGHTENING TO ME AS SOMEONE WHO HAD TO CALL 911 WHEN SOMEONE IS TRYING TO GET INTO MY HOUSE IN THE MIDDLE THE NIGHT. TWO OFFICERS SHOWED UP WITHIN PROBABLY 1 TO 2 MINUTES AND NOW THAT OUR OFFICERS ARE AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS ALMOST CONSTANTLY, I AM WONDERING AND OTHER TAXPAYERS ARE WONDERING, WHAT CAN WE EXPECT WHEN WE CALL 911? I GUESS PRIVATE SECURITY FIRMS WILL DESCEND ON SEBASTOPOL, AS A MATTER FACT, ONE OF MY NEIGHBORS JUST SIGNED UP WITH ONE ABOUT THREE DAYS AGO BUT I AGREE WITH THE WOMAN WHO JUST SPOKE AND THE MAN BEFORE HER. IF LUTHER BURBANK AND WCCS WHAT IS JUST DO THEIR JOBS, A LOT OF THIS WOULD BE TAKEN CARE OF. THANK YOU. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I WILL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS.

I'VE GOT A TIMER. SO, SONOMA COUNTY HAS, HOUSING AUTHORITY AND BURBANK HOUSING ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR DETERMINING WHO RESIDES AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS AND THEN DEBBIE CCS IS SUPPOSED TO BE PROVIDING RENTAL SERVICES. IS THERE ANYBODY HERE FROM EITHER THOSE ORGANIZATIONS?

[INAUDIBLE]

SHE IS ON THE CALL. I MEAN I'M SURPRISED WITH THE POLICE GIVING A REALLY GOOD REPORT OUT, I DON'T KNOW I HAVE NOT, HAVE NOT SEEN REPORTS WOULD ONLY KNOW WHAT IS GOING ON BUT MY INITIAL COMMENT AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MEETING, THE COUNTY IS NOT PROVIDING ANYTHING FOR US EXCEPT PROBLEMS. WE JUST HEARD FROM THE POLICE CHIEF IT IS COSTING A FORTUNE FOR THE CITY, IF HE DOES ARREST SOMEBODY AND TAKE THEM TO THE COUNTY WHO ARE RUNNING THIS PLACE WE GET CHARGED FOUR TIMES AND THEN THEY KICKED THEM OUT OF THE PRISON. THESE PEOPLE ARE HAVING TO SURVIVE WITH THESE, WITH RANDOM PEOPLE APPARENTLY BEING PUT IN THROUGH CHLORINATED ENTRY, THE TOP OF THE FOOD CHAIN, COORDINATED ENTRY IS THE PROBLEM, WHAT IS THE COUNTY DOING? THEY ARE JUST SHIPPING RANDOM PEOPLE INTO IT SEBASTOPOL, WE HEARD ORIGINALLY THIS FIASCO SINCE 2019, THEY ARE SHORTNESS THE FIRST OF THE KICKED OF THE PEOPLE OUT FROM THE FIRST ROUND FOR THE SEBASTOPOL INN TO THE SAID THEY HAD TO PROVIDE FOR THE MOST NEEDY PEOPLE IN THE COUNTY. I MEAN, YOU KNOW, WE ARE HEARING ALL SORTS OF BIZARRE STORIES ABOUT RANDOM PEOPLE INVITING THEIR FRIENDS IN AND GIVING THEM ENTRY KEYS AND SO ON AND SO FORTH. THESE ARE NOT THE MOST DESERVING PEOPLE IN THE COUNTY, THIS IS RIDICULOUS. YOU GOT A BUNCH OF PLEASANT LOOKING PEOPLE HERE WHO ARE CLEARLY JUST NEED TO HAVE A QUIET LIFE AND THAT IS GREAT, THAT IS WHAT IT IS FOR BUT THIS IS SO EXPENSIVE AND SO INCOMPETENT. SOMEBODY NEEDS TO GET INTO THE COUNTY AND START BANGING SOME HEADS TOGETHER, SPECIFICALLY AROUND COORDINATED ENTRY. WHO THEY THINK THEY ARE ACTUALLY PUTTING IN HERE, THAT IS MY TIMER. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I'LL GOT TO ZOOM. KATE, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF? THANK YOU. GO AHEAD WITH YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. I JUST WANT TO THANK THE CHIEF FOR ALL THE WORK HE HAS DONE ON BEHALF OF SEBASTOPOL . I KNOW IT IS THE FIRST FEW MONTHS ON THE JOB AND YOU GOT DUMPED INTO A PRETTY INTENSE SITUATION WITH ELDERBERRY COMMONS, SO, THANK YOU FOR TAKING THIS ON. I AGREE WITH THE PREVIOUS CALLERS THAT THE SITUATION IS NOT SUSTAINABLE FOR CITY NOR FOR OUR POLICE DEPARTMENT. I WANT TO THINK THE RESIDENT THAT SPOKE TONIGHT, FOR SPEAKING ABOUT THEIR EXPERIENCE AND IT IS CRIMINAL THAT CHILDREN ARE COHABITATING WITH DRUG ADDICTS AND PROSTITUTES, THAT IS TOTALLY UNCONSCIONABLE AND THAT IS COMPLETELY UNACCEPTABLE. I WOULD SUGGEST THAT IN YOUR DISCUSSIONS WITH THE COUNTY THAT YOU MAKE ELDERBERRY COMMONS A FAMILY HOUSING, FOR PEOPLE WHO ARE SOBER. I CANNOT, AS A PARENT, THE IDEA THAT MY CHILD WOULD BE EXPOSED TO ALONG WITH WHAT BOTH SPEAKERS PRESENTED IS ABSOLUTELY TERRIFYING. SO, AND THIS GOES TO MY NEXT PART OF MY COMMENT, AS A PARENT IN OUR COMMUNITY, I AM VERY CONCERNED THAT DRUGS ARE FLOWING IN AND OUT OF THE FACILITIES, DRUGS LIKE CRYSTAL METH AND FENTANYL, WHICH ARE BOTH LETHAL AND CAN HAVE PERMANENT EFFECTS ON PEOPLE POP A SPRAIN, ESPECIALLY YOUNG PEOPLE. WE HAVE A HUGE HIGH SCHOOL IN SEBASTOPOL, WHAT IS BEING DONE TO MAKE SURE THAT OUR YOUNG PEOPLE ARE NOT BEING EXPOSED TO DRUG DEALERS WHO ARE HANGING OUT AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS.

YOU HAVE ABOUT 20 SECONDS.

HAVE TO SAY THAT THIS PROJECT WAS UNANIMOUSLY APPROVED BY THE SEBASTOPOL CITY COUNCIL, EVEN THOUGH PEOPLE, LIKE MYSELF, SAID THAT HOUSING FIRST WAS NOT A FIT FOR OUR COMMUNITY BECAUSE WE DO NOT HAVE THE RESOURCES TO MITIGATE THESE PROBLEMS. THANK YOU.

THANK YOU, KATE, FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I WILL COME TO CHAMBERS.

THANK YOU. TWO YEARS AGO TODAY ON THIS EXACT DAY I WAS ADMITTED TO A PSYCH WARD. I WENT TO THE PROCESS OF HEALING MYSELF AND RECOVERING MYSELF IN ORDER TO BE PLACED INTO SAM JONES HOMELESS SHELTER. I WAITED IN SAM JONES AROUND TONS OF METHODS SMOKE, DRUG SMOKE, SO MANY ILLICIT ACTIVITIES AND I WENT TO SLEEP IN MY CAR INSTEAD FOR ABOUT A YEAR AND AFTER THAT YEAR I WAS PROMISED ELDERBERRY COMMONS, JUST TO BE BACK IN THE SAME EXACT POSITION THAT I WAS IN BEFORE. THIS IS UNACCEPTABLE AND THERE HAS GOT TO BE SOME KIND OF SOLUTION BECAUSE THERE ARE PEOPLE SUFFERING TRYING TO START A NEW LIFE, LIKE ME, I AM 20 YEARS OLD, I DON'T HAVE KIDS BUT I'M TRY TO START A NEW LIFE AND I DON'T WANT TO BE AROUND METH AND WHEN I INHALE THAT WALKING UP TO MY ROOM IS A DANGER TO ME. IF IT IS NOT ILLEGAL, IT IS, BECAUSE IT IS A DANGER TO MY LIFE. THAT IS ALL I HAVE TO SAY. I'M APPALLED.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I WILL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM. GEORGE, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? THANK YOU.

I THINK I AM UN-MUTED. THE ONE YOU ARE., GO AHEAD WITH YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, PLEASE.

AFTER PREACHING THIS DISCUSSION ON THE EFFORTS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT I JUST WANTED TO POINT OUT THAT IF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS ALREADY HEAVILY BURDENED BY THE PRESENCE OF ELDERBERRY COMMONS, IN THE NEXT COUPLE OF YEARS WE ARE PROBABLY GOING TO DOUBLE DOWN ON THAT. WE ARE GOING TO OPEN A NEW FACILITY THAT IS SIMILAR TO IT OUT HERE ON, THE GRAVITY AND COMMENTS ON HIGHWAY 116 AND I THINK THAT POINT IT MAY EAT UP WHATEVER HEADROOM WE HAVE AS FAR AS MAKING POLICE AVAILABILITY TO PROVIDE GENERAL SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY AND I WONDER WHAT THE COUNCIL MIGHT BE ANTICIPATING IN THAT REGARD AND WHAT PLANS THEY HAVE IN PLACE TO DEAL WITH THAT WHEN THAT KIND OF SITUATION DEVELOPS. THAT IS ALL, THANKS.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, NEXT I WILL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS, THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS THAT WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT.

I'M A LITTLE EMOTIONAL, I'VE GOT TO REGULATE MY EMOTIONS. I JUST USE THAT PART OF MY TWO MINUTES. PHEW. JEESH. I WASN'T GOING TO CRY. GOOD EVENING. I WANT TO THANK THE SEBASTOPOL POLICE FORCE, I'M GOING TO SKIP SOME MORE THE FIRST PARAGRAPH, I AM DE JURE AND I HAVE WORKED AND PAID TAXES SINCE I WAS A TEENAGER, AS A YOUNG ADULT I BECAME ADDICTED TO DRUGS BUT THROUGH THE 12 STEP PROGRAM I'VE BEEN CLEAN FOR 27 YEARS. -- MOOD ALTERING SERVICES AND I WORKED A RIGOROUS PROGRAM OF RECOVERY AND I'M NOW 64. AND I'M DEALING WITH A COUPLE OF DISABILITIES. I WAS OFFERED A PLEASANT ELDERBERRY AND I THOUGHT IT WAS GOING TO GET A REPRIEVE FROM LIVING IN MY VEHICLE AND HAVING A STABLE PLACE TO LIVE. A STABLE PLACE TO HEAL AND START OVER, UNFORTUNATELY THAT HAS NOT BEEN THE CASE, I AM MORE STRESSED, EXHAUSTED AND ON HIGH ALERT THEN WHEN I WAS LIVING IN MY VEHICLE. AT LEAST IN MY VEHICLE I COULD GENERALLY STAY AWAY FROM CRIMINAL ACTIVITY AND THE CHAOS OF PEOPLE AND PLACES WHERE DRUGS WERE USED AND SOLD. THIS IS IMPOSSIBLE AT ELDERBERRY COMMONS. ALTHOUGH I APPRECIATE THE HOUSING FIRST PHILOSOPHY, IT JUST DOESN'T WORK IF PEOPLE ARE ALLOWED TO RUN WILD WITH COMPLETE DISREGARD FOR THE OTHER

RESIDENTS AND THE RULES. SECURITY IS PROVIDED BY BURNING HOUSING AND MOST OF THE SECURITY GUARDS, I HAVE SPOKEN TO, THEY WANT TO DO THEIR JOB WELL BUT FEEL LIKE THEY ARE UNABLE TO DO SO. BURBANK HOUSING IS NOT ENFORCING THE RENTAL AGREEMENTS. THE REGULATED ENTRY IN AND OUT OF THE ELDERBERRY COMMONS IS ANYTHING BUT REGULATED AND SECURE. PEOPLE ARE USING AND SELLING DRUGS, THERE HAVE BEEN STABBINGS, PHYSICAL ABUSE, PROSTITUTION AND PEOPLE LIVING HERE WITHOUT A LEASE. I'M USING UP ANOTHER FEW SECONDS OF MY TWO MINUTES HERE. CURRENT TENANTS REGULARLY GIVE OTHERS THE CODE TO GET IN AND OUT, I'VE BEEN THREATENED SEVERAL TIMES AT THE COMPLEX. BECAUSE THERE HAVE BEEN NO REPERCUSSIONS OF THE PEOPLE ENGAGING IN CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES AT ELDERBERRY GET COCKY. SPOON IN TWO MINUTES.

THAT IS MINTED MINUTES, OKAY, I ENDED WITH COCKY.

I'LL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM. PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. I WILL COME BACK INTO CHAMBERS, THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS AND LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT. SEEING NONE, PUBLIC COMMENT IS CLOSED.

BRING IT BACK UP TO THE DAIS AND BUT FIRST, THANK YOU, ALL FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT, I DEFINITELY FELT IT, I HEARD IT AND I WILL BE THE ONE TO KICK THIS OFF BECAUSE THE MEETING THAT I REFERRED TO IS IN CONNECTION WITH A COUPLE OF OTHER MIRRORS, CONNECTED TO THE HOMELESS COALITION BOARD, PARTICULARLY AROUND WHETHER THE COUNTY SHOULD REMAIN THE LEAD AGENCY FOR THE HOUSING COALITION. I ACTUALLY BROUGHT AN AGENDA ITEM. THE MEETING IS TO FIGURE OUT WHAT TO DO WITH MY AGENDA ITEM, WHICH IS SPECIFICALLY TO REPLACE THE COUNTY AS LEAD AGENCY FOR COORDINATE ENTRY. BECAUSE OF ALL THE ISSUES THAT WE HAVE BEEN HEARING ABOUT, OUR PREDECESSOR, FORMER MAYOR, FORMER GENERAL MANAGER, IT IS JUST NOT MY OBSERVATIONS, IT HAS BEEN YEARS OF OPERATIONS AND CONCERNS ABOUT THE COUNTY NOT BEING ABLE TO PROVIDE WHAT THEY NEED TO PROVIDE TO RUN THIS AGENCY. I JUST WANT TO PUT THAT OUT THERE AND COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

I'VE A SMALL STATEMENT THE FIRST, I WANT TO SUPPORT YOU GUYS LIKE CRAZY, I LOVE YOU GUYS FOR GETTING IN CONTROL AND I FEEL SAD THAT IT IS LIKE THIS FOR YOU GUYS. A SMALL POINT, CAN WE SUGGEST THAT THESE BIOMETRIC ENTRY AND NOT A KEYCODE?

I DON'T KNOW, I WILL POINT THAT OVER TO ALEX.

WE CAN MAKE ANY SUGGESTION TO THEM WE WANT. WE DON'T HAVE A MECHANISM TO FORCE THEM TO DO THAT.

I THINK I SAW COUNCILMEMBER HINTON?

I WANT A COUPLE COMMENTS TO ADDRESS THE SPEAKERS. FIRST OF ALL, SOMEBODY SAID, YOU MUST HATE US AND I'M HERE TO TELL YOU WE DO NOT HATE YOU. WE TRY TO EMBRACE THIS COMMUNITY, EVEN THOUGH AS WAS POINTED OUT EARLIER THE COUNTY CREATED THIS WITH THE HOME KEY PROJECT AND WE HAVE NO JURISDICTION. I ALSO WHEN I WENT TO THE OPEN HOUSE DID NOT REALIZE THEY DID NOT HAVE A PROPERTY MANAGER TO KICK OFF DAY ONE, SO, THAT WAS NOT PRESENTED TO US THAT DAY. I WAS THERE. IN FACT I THOUGHT I MET SOMEONE SAID THEY WERE IN CHARGE OF THE PROJECT, I'M SURE I DID. SO, I JUST WANT TO SAY THAT WITHOUT YOU COMING WE WOULD KIND OF BE IN THE DARK. AND THEN, SINCE WE ARE BROWN ACTED AND WE HAVE REPRESENTATIVES THAT ARE GOING TO SPEAK ON OUR BEHALF, I THINK IT IS REALLY IMPORTANT. I DID READ THE NEWSPAPER ARTICLE THAT WAS PUBLISHED ABOUT THE HOUSING

FIRST BUT I THINK THE PEOPLE NEED TO UNDERSTAND THAT IF THAT IS THE MODEL WE ARE GOING TO GO BY THEN WE NEED TO REALLY RAMP UP EXTRA MONEY IN THE BEGINNING BECAUSE THERE IS ALWAYS AN ADJUSTMENT IN THE MONITORING PROCESS THAT HAS TO BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION BECAUSE IT IS A BRAND-NEW PROJECT, IT IS GOING TO COST MORE AND IT IS GOING TO NEED MORE HANDS, RIGHT? SO, WHETHER THAT IS PEOPLE BREAKING LEASES AND THEN THEY NEED TO BE KICKED OUT AND OTHER PEOPLE NEED TO BE ALLOWED IN, THAT WILL NOT BREAK THE RULES. SO, IN OUR FEEDBACK, AND I LIKE THE BIOMETRIC, WITH THE THUMB PRINT, HAPPENS ALL THE TIME WITH TIMECARDS, WE HAD ONE IN MY PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT. I WOULD ASK FOR THAT, THANKS. THANK YOU, COUNCILMEMBER MAURER.

I WANT TO ECHO SOMETHING ONE OF THE SPEAKER SAID EARLIER. THAT THEY WERE TOLD THAT THIS WAS GOING TO BE A FAMILY ORIENTED PLACE, FAMILY CENTERED PLACE AND I LIKE TO STRESS THE IMPORTANCE OF THAT AND ASK FOR OUR LIAISON TO STRESS THE IMPORTANCE OF THAT, THAT THIS IS A FAMILY-FRIENDLY, FAMILY CENTRIC, FAMILY ORIENTED PROPERTY PERIOD. JUST PERIOD AND THANK YOU.

VICE MAYOR?

GOOD GRIEF, I'VE HAD A LOT TO SAY ABOUT THIS OVERTIME. I JUST WANT TO SAY THAT I TRULY APPRECIATE ALL OF YOU COMMUNICATING, COMING HERE TONIGHT. I RECEIVED EMAILS FROM ALL OF YOU. I RECEIVED PHOTOS AND VIDEOS AND I'VE WITNESSED IT MYSELF, BEING SO CLOSE AND WE DO NOT HATE YOU. WE HATE THE SITUATION THAT YOU ARE PUT IN RIGHT NOW, WHICH IS NOT WHO WE ARE AS A COMMUNITY. I KNOW THAT OUR POLICE OFFICERS ARE TRYING TO DO EVERYTHING THEY CAN. EVERY TIME I HEAR FROM ONE OF YOU IT IMMEDIATELY GOES TO OUR CITY MANAGER AND OUR POLICE CHIEF, NEARLY INSTANTLY. I RECEIVE A LOT OF MEDICATIONS FROM EVERYONE THERE AND YOU KNOW, I JUST, IT IS SUCH A CONUNDRUM BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW THE ANSWER TO THIS BECAUSE IT FEELS LIKE SUCH A BIG PROBLEM. WE ARE TRYING TO SORT IT OUT AND FIGURE OUT HOW WE CAN MAKE THAT DIFFERENCE HERE BECAUSE CLEARLY THERE IS A MUCH BIGGER ISSUE, WE NEED THE COUNTY TO COME IN, AT LEAST WITH THE FUNDS TO SUPPORT US AND WE HAVE TO FIGURE ALL THESE THINGS OUT BUT I JUST WANT TO COMMIT TO YOU ALL THAT WE HEAR YOU AND I TRULY FEEL FOR ALL OF YOU. I'VE WORKED IN HEALTHCARE FOR A LONG TIME, I WORKED WITH A LOT AND DEIRDRE AND I'VE HAD A LOT OF CONVERSATIONS RUNNING INTO EACH OTHER AND WE ARE GOING TO DO WHAT WE CAN TRADE SOMETIMES IT FEELS A BIT DAUNTING BUT WE ARE GOING TO KEEP PRESSURING AND PRESSURING AND TRYING TO FIGURE THIS OUT AND WE ARE HAVING MEETINGS. IT FEELS LIKE A LOT OF MEETINGS THAT THERE IS A LOT OF DIFFERENT PLAYERS IN ALL OF THIS AND JUST TRYING TO BRING ALL OF THAT TOGETHER, SO THAT WE HAVE THE CITY CAN FIGURE OUT WE CAN DO TO HELP YOU ALL AND HONESTLY. SHAME ON BURBANK FOR NOT HAVING A PROPERTY MANAGER. I'M JUST GOING TO SAY IT, WHO OPENS A PLACE LIKE THIS ABOUT SOMEBODY IN CHARGE? THAT IS UNCONSCIONABLE AND I'M JUST SAYING PUBLICLY, I THINK IT IS ABSOLUTELY RIDICULOUS. I ALSO WANT TO JUST SAY VERY FIRMLY THAT THE FOLKS HERE WHO ARE SPEAKING OUT. I WANT TO SAY PUBLICLY THAT I WOULD NOT WANT TO HEAR THAT ANY OF THEM WOULD BE CALLED OUT OR PUNISHED OR EVICTED AND SEEN AS CAUSING PROBLEMS, QUOTE UNQUOTE, AS THEY'RE ACTUALLY SPEAKING OUT ABOUT WHAT IS HAPPENING. I'M SAYING PUBLICLY RIGHT NOW THAT HAPPENS, I MEAN IT IS UNCONSCIONABLE. THESE ARE THINGS THAT WE ALL NEED TO CONSIDER WHEN

WE HAVE THESE CONVERSATIONS BECAUSE IT ISN'T RIGHT, IN MY OPINION. ANYWAY, I FEEL FOR YOU. THANK YOU FOR SPEAKING, I KNOW IT'S HARD BUT WE NEED TO CONTINUE TO HAVE THESE CONVERSATIONS BECAUSE THAT IS THE ONLY WAY WE CAN FIGURE THIS OUT.

THANK YOU, VICE MAYOR. AND I HEAR FROM THE PUBLIC COMMENTOR ABOUT REGULARLY AGENDA RISING THIS AND THAT IS MY REQUEST, WE KEEP THIS STANDARD GENDERIZED EVERY TWO WEEKS BECAUSE BY THEN WE CAN REPORT, VICE MAYOR AND I ARE MEETING WITH BURBANK AND THEN THE MULTIPLE MAYORS SITTING DOWN WHETHER THE COUNTY SHOULD REMAIN THE LEAD AGENCY WOULD PROBABLY BE AND CAPTURED BY THE NEXT TIME YOU BRING THIS BEFORE COUNCIL. I WILL SAY THE FACT THAT THERE IS MOVEMENT BECAUSE THE INPUT OF ALL THE COUNCILMEMBERS THE COUNTY, WHICH DO WE PRIORITIZE FIRST? HOMELESS OR MENTAL HEALTH? THINK IT WOULD BEHOOVE US OF THE CITY TO KEEP HAVING THE DISCUSSION, KEEP MEMORIALIZING THINGS BECAUSE MARY ULTIMATELY HAS TO TO SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE MAYOR MEETING, THE NEXT IS ON JUNE 12th AND I THINK HAVING THESE DISCUSSIONS AND MEMORIALIZING WHERE WE ARE TO FUNNEL IT UP TO ALL THE OTHER MAYORS, SO THAT ACROSS THE COUNTY WE CAN ASSERT PRESSURE ON THE RESPECTIVE AGENCIES AND THIS PARTICULAR ONE DEPARTMENT HEALTH SERVICES. THAT IS MY REQUEST AND I DON'T KNOW IF I NEED MORE.

I SECOND THAT REQUEST.

OKAY, WE JUMPED AHEAD BECAUSE USUALLY DON'T PUT THIS ON UNTIL LATER IN THE AGENDA.

YES, YOU CAN IF YOU WANT TO DO IT NOW, JUST CONTINUE THIS ITEM UNTIL THE NEXT AGENDA, IT WOULD TAKE A MAJORITY VOTE BUT CENSUS IS AN ITEM ON THIS MEETING'S AGENDA.

OKAY, IS EVERYONE ELSE RELATIVELY COMFORTABLE WITH KEEPING THIS IS A STANDING ITEM? I THINK AS FAR AS UPDATES IT COULD HURT MARY? TWO THINGS TO DO. ONE, THE END THE AGENDA WE ALSO HAVE THE ITEMS WHERE COUNCIL MEMBER CAN BRING THIS BACK OR WE CAN DO IT AS A REPORT OUT. WE CAN WORK WITH THE GENDER REVIEW COMMITTEE HOW TO BRING THIS REPORT BACK. SPOON OUT BE GOOD, THANK YOU, MARY AND ALEX. ANYTHING MORE BEFORE WE RECEIVED THIS AND MOVE ON TO OUR NEXT ITEM? ANYTHING ELSE? LOOKING TO MY RIGHT. TO MY LEFT. NO. MARY, WE CAN MOVE ON. MARY, WHICH ITEM ARE YOU MOVING TO NOW?

ITEM NUMBER 13, THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE A.B. 2561, THE STATUS OF CITY VACANCIES PER THE NEW LAW THAT CAME INTO EFFECT. IT WILL BE PRESENTED BY OUR HUMAN RESOURCES CONSULTANT DEBORAH MUCHMORE.

WE ARE MOVING ONTO THE PUBLIC HEARING, NUMBER 13, PUBLIC HEARING TO CONDUCT A PUBLIC HEARING ON A.B. 2561. WHICH REQUIRES PUBLIC AGENCIES TO PRESENT THE STATUS OF THEIR VACANCIES IN A PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE THE GOVERNING BODY AT LEAST ONCE PER FISCAL YEAR AND PRIOR TO ADOPTING THE FISCAL YEAR BUDGET, THIS ITEM IS FOR THE CITY COUNCIL TO RECEIVE A PRESENTATION ON CITY VACANCIES FOR 2025. I CAN SKIP AHEAD. AS OF THE DATE OF THIS POSTING OF THIS AGENDA THE CITY HAS NINE VACANCIES, 53 TOTAL CITY POSITIONS, THE CURRENT NUMBER OF VACANCIES OUTLINED BELOW IS JUST UNDER 6%. WHICH IS WELL BELOW THE 20% THRESHOLD SET BY LAW AND YES, THE RESPONSIBLE PARTY'S HUMAN RESOURCES CONSULTANT, DEBORAH? THANK YOU AND I WILL MAKE THIS REALLY BRIEF BUT BEFORE I DO I WANTED TO

SAY HOW HUMBLED I WAS BY THE COURAGEOUS AND ARTICULATE

PRESENTATIONS BY OUR SPEAKERS. THANK YOU TO THEM. THIS WAS BORN IN NOVEMBER OUT OF THE LEGISLATURE. AND SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR IN JANUARY AND TOOK EFFECT, SIGNED BY THE GOVERNOR SHORTLY AFTER THAT AND TOOK EFFECT JANUARY 1st. THE REASON IT WAS BORN IS BECAUSE THERE WERE LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS THAT THERE WAS WIDESPREAD VACANCIES IN PUBLIC ENTITIES, COMING OUT OF COVID. THAT POSITIONS WERE PURPOSELY LEFT UNFILLED TO ALLOW MONIES TO BE USED FOR OTHER PURPOSES, THAT SALARY AND BENEFIT PACKAGES WERE NOT ATTRACTIVE TO COMPETITIVE CANDIDATES IN ALL CASES. AND THAT SLOWER COMMERCE IN HIRING PRACTICES AND LOSS OF GOOD CANDIDATES WERE OCCURRING. THEY WANTED TO PROVIDE A WAY THAT THE GOVERNING BODIES COULD BE PRESENTED WITH VACANCY INFORMATION ON AN ANNUAL BASIS BEFORE THE ACTUALLY VOTED ON THEIR BUDGET. THE LEGISLATOR THEN TOOK THE FACTS THAT THEY HAD AND SURMISED THAT IT MIGHT BE THAT PUBLIC ENTITIES HAVE BECOME OVER-WORKED AND DEMORALIZED FROM THE GREAT VACANCY AMOUNT THAT THEY HAD AND THAT THEIR WORKLOAD IS TO BE DISTRIBUTED AMONG THE LARGER NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES IS NOW DISTRIBUTED AMONG FEWER. AND THAT SOMETIMES PUBLIC ENTITIES MAY USE UNFILLED POSITIONS AS AN EXCUSE TO HIRE A TEMPORARY PUBLIC EMPLOYEES OR CONTRACT OUT BARGAINING WORKS. SO, WE BRING THIS BEFORE THE PUBLIC IN HEARING, SO WE CAN PRESENT OUR VACANCIES AND TALK ABOUT WHAT WE ARE DOING. THANK YOU FOR THE VACANCY NUMBERS, THAT IS CORRECT. WE HAVE ONE, ONE OF OUR BARGAINING UNITS HAVE A CELLY HIGHER THAN 20% VACANCY FACTOR. SO, FOR THAT ORGANIZATION WE PRESENT A LITTLE BIT MORE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AROUND THE VACANCIES THAT WE HAVE HAD AND WHAT WE ARE DOING. THOSE ARE PRESENTED IN THE REPORT. WE HAVE FOUR VACANCIES, THE CEI YOU ASSOCIATE PLANNER, PLANNING TECHNICIAN, LABOR AND MANAGEMENT ANALYST AND WE HAVE TALKED IN THE REPORT ABOUT THE ACTIVE RECRUITMENT ACTIVITIES THAT ARE GOING ON AND THE OFFERS THAT ARE BEING MADE IN THOSE EFFORTS TO FILL THOSE POSITIONS. BECAUSE ANYTIME WE DO THIS REPORT WE OFFER AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE LABOR ORGANIZATIONS TO SPEAK, I AM NOT SEEING ANY OF THEM PRESENT, I DON'T SEE ANY OF THEM ON THE BOARD BUT I WILL ASK, MARY, OR ASK IF THEY COULD RAISE THEIR HAND IF THEY ARE HERE, FOR US.

SURE, LET ME GO TO ZOOM TO SEE IF ANYONE IS FROM SEIU, IF YOU'D LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS ITEM? I'M NOTHING ANYONE RAISING THEIR HAND.

OKAY I DON'T BELIEVE THERE IS ANYONE HE WANTS TO PRESENT FROM THE ASSOCIATION FOR THE POLICE ASSOCIATION. SO, WITH THAT THAT WOULD CONCLUDE THE HEARING PRESENTATIONS.

THANK YOU, DEBORAH. ANY QUESTIONS OF DEBORAH BEFORE WE MOVE ALONG? NOT SEEING ANY, WE GOT A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS, CORRECT? CORRECT, WE WILL BE GOING OUT FOR PUBLIC HEARING. PUBLIC COMMENT FOR THE PUBLIC HEARING ON THE VACANCIES IN THE CITY STAFF, IF THERE IS ANYONE IN CHAMBERS THAT LIKE TO GO PUBLIC,. KYLE?

I THINK IT IS GREAT WE HAVE THIS AND THAT THERE IS THIS REPORTING MECHANISM THAT ALLOWS US TO TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY TO REFLECT ON VACANCIES THAT WE HAVE IN THE CITY AND JUSTIFICATION BEHIND THIS. ABOUT ORGANIZATIONS USING VACANCIES AS A MEANS TO DODGE THE LABOR UNIONS FOR DOING TEMPORARY HIRES, THAT IS IMPORTANT TO RECOGNIZE. ADDITIONALLY, TALKING ABOUT WORKLOAD VACANCIES AFFECTING REMAINING

EMPLOYEES FOR PICKING UP THE WORK THAT STILL NEEDS TO GET DONE. I THINK WHAT THIS ALSO SPEAKS TO, WHICH BRINGS US BACK TO BUDGET HERE, WHAT IS THE PRIORITY THAT HER CITY IS MAKING IN TERMS OF THESE HIRES AND VACANCIES. ESPECIALLY IN A CITY SUCH AS SEBASTOPOL THAT IS VERY TOP-HEAVY WHEN IT COMES TO MANAGEMENT, SALARIES AND BENEFITS, AS OPPOSED TO THE RANKING FILE AND EMPLOYEES THAT ARE NOT IN THE UPPER MANAGEMENT. WE HAVE SEEN RADICAL INCREASES TO MANAGEMENT SALARIES OVER THE LAST 5 TO 6 YEARS AND IT SEEMS LIKE EVERY TIME THERE IS A VACANCY IN A MANAGEMENT POSITION AND GETS REPLACED WITH A MUCH LARGER SALARY BASE. WHAT DOES THAT DO? THAT TAKES MONEY OUT OF OUR BUDGET, OUR GENERAL FUND BUDGET THAT COULD BE GOING TO FILL THOSE VACANCIES FOR THE PEOPLE TO BE DOING THIS WORK. A BIG ISSUE WE RUN INTO IS WE DO NOT HAVE A LOT OF WELL-TRAINED, CROSS TRAINED EMPLOYEES BEING ABLE TO DO A LARGE SCOPE OF WORK, AS A RESULT OF THAT WE END UP WITH A LOT OF CONSULTATION HIRES HAPPENING AT AGAIN, DODGING THE UNION PRACTICES, HIRING PEOPLE OUTSIDE OF OUR CITY TO BE DOING THE WORK OF OUR CITY. SO, CLASSIC EXAMPLE IS IF YOU LOOK AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT STRUCTURE WE HAVE GOT ONE CHIEF, ONE LIEUTENANT, FOUR SERGEANTS AND THE EIGHT POLICE OFFICERS BELOW THAT.

YOU HAVE ABOUT 20 SECONDS, KYLE.

IS OUTSIDE OF THE NORM THAT YOU WOULD EXPECT IN THE CITY OF OUR SIZE WITH A NUMBER OF FTES WE HAVE, MORE APPROPRIATELY BE SOMEWHERE IN THE REALM OF TWO SERGEANTS, NOT FOUR. SO, TO THINK ABOUT PREVIOUS AGENDA ITEM SITE AND THE AMOUNT OF TIME AND LABOR THAT IT TAKES TO DO THOSE TYPES OF REPORTS I THINK WE NEED TO START DOING SOME ACCOUNTING OF THE TYPE OF WORK THAT IS BEING DONE BY THOSE OFFICERS BECAUSE IF THERE IS A LARGE AMOUNT OF LABOR OF THE RESULT ELDERBERRY COMMONS IT IS NOT DOCUMENTED JUST THE HOURS OF PATROL THE NEED TO CAPTURE THAT. KYLE, THAT IS TWO MINUTES. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I WILL GO OUT TO ZOOM. ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? ROBERT, CAN YOU UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE? THANK YOU. GO AHEAD. SORRY. YEAH. SORRY, KYLE, I AM NOT A UNION GUY. A COUPLE OF COMMENTS. BENEFITS HAVE BEEN GROWING, EMPLOYEE BENEFITS NOT JUST MANAGEMENT BENEFITS, EMPLOYEE BENEFITS HAVE BEEN GROWING AT DOUBLE-DIGIT RATES FOR SOME TIME. AFTER COVID THEY WENT UP LIKE 20% IN ONE YEAR. EVERY YEAR WE PAY MORE FOR BENEFITS WE HAVE LESS MONEY TO HIRE MORE WORKERS. THE CITY DESPERATELY NEEDS MORE WORKERS, THE CITY IS NOT LOOKING TO HIDE FROM MORE WORKERS, WE NEED MORE WORKERS. BUT THE INCREASES IN SALARIES AND BENEFITS ARE CUTTING DOWN OPPORTUNITIES TO DO THAT. SOMEHOW WE HAVE TO GET BENEFIT INCREASE COST BELOW THE INCREASE IN REVENUE IN THE CITY IN ORDER TO SUSTAIN OUR FINANCIAL SITUATION. SOMEHOW THE UNION OR NOT HEARING TONIGHT AND WILL LISTEN TO OUR PROBLEMS BUT SOMEHOW THE UNIONS HAVE TO UNDERSTAND THAT. ANOTHER THOUGHT, WE SPENT \$30,000 TO HIRE UNION NEGOTIATOR, THAT SEEMS INCREDIBLE BUT I SUPPOSE IT HAS TO BE DONE. WHAT IS HE DOING FOR US THOUGH? CAN THEY HELP US? WE HAVE ALL THESE VACANCIES, THEY MUST KNOW WHO ALL THE PEOPLE ARE THAT WORK IN THE UNION, CAN THEY HELP US RECRUIT? CAN YOU HELP US FIND QUALIFIED PEOPLE TO COME TO SEBASTOPOL? I DON'T GET THE UNION, TO TELL YOU THE TRUTH, BUT WE NEED HELP AND NEED MORE PEOPLE AND WE NEED HELP TO CONTROL THESE COSTS OR ELSE WE WILL

NOT BE A CITY ANYMORE, THAT IS ONE THING, THERE WILL NOT BE CITY OR CITY WORKERS, IT WILL BE THE COUNTY. THANK YOU. THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMIC-CON XL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS, IF THERE IS ANYONE THAT LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS PUBLIC HEARING IN CHAMBERS. I WILL GO BACK OUT TO ZOOM IF THERE'S ANYONE ON ZOOM, KATE, UNMUTE YOURSELF, PLEASE?

I AM UN-MUTED. I AM WONDERING IF IT DUE TO ELDERBERRY COMMONS AND THE INCREASE IN CRIME IN SEBASTOPOL THAT WAS DOCUMENTED IN PREVIOUS PUBLIC COMMENTS PRIOR TO ELDERBERRY COMMONS, I'M WONDERING IF WE ACTUALLY NEED TO RE-EVALUATE HOW MANY PEOPLE WE NEED ON OUR POLICE FORCE. GIVEN THE FACT THAT WE ALSO HAVE AN INCREDIBLE AMOUNT OF CARS THAT PASSED THROUGH AND THAT WE HAVE A HIGH SCHOOL AND MANY SCHOOLS WITHIN OUR CITY LIMITS. I AM WONDERING IF THE STAFFING LEVELS FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT NEED TO BE RE-EXAMINED AND PERHAPS WE ACTUALLY NEED TO HIRE MORE POLICE THEN IS CURRENTLY ON THE DOCKET? THAT IS MY PUBLIC COMMENT, THANK YOU.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PUBLIC COMMENT. NEXT I'LL COME BACK TO CHAMBERS FOR PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS PUBLIC HEARING, SEEING NONE. I WILL GO BACK TO ZOOM. IF YOU'D LIKE TO MAKE A PUBLIC COMMENT ON THIS PUBLIC HEARING PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND VIRTUALLY. SEEING NONE THE PUBLIC HEARING IS

THANK YOU, MARY. ONE OF THE PUBLIC COMMENTERS MENTIONED CROSS TRAINING AT A KNOW WE ARE DOING THAT. THANKS TO YOUR HELP AND THE STAFFING ASSESSMENT THAT WE JUST DID THAT WE ARE TRYING TO CROSS TRAINING WITHIN OTHER DEPARTMENTS, CAN WE NOT ALSO TRY TO DO THAT WITHIN THE POLICE? OR IS THERE SOME CONFIDENTIALITY PRIVACY THING THAT WE REFER TO THEM DIFFERENT TECHNICIANS, I THINK, BUT WE ARE TRYING TO CROSS TRAIN WITHIN OUR DEPARTMENT THAT ARE NOT WITH POLICE. BUT CAN WE ALSO NOT TRY TO DO THAT WITHIN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT? HONESTLY, IT WOULD DEPEND ON THE POSITIONS, RIGHT NOW THERE ARE NO POSITIONS THAT WOULD BE ABLE TO CROSS TRAIN BECAUSE THEY'RE SPECIALIZED IN THEIR FIELD, THE OFFICERS, EVIDENCE TECHNICIANS, THEY WERE NOT ABLE TO BE CROSS TRAINED. YOU AND GOT IT, THANK YOU.

TONY, I JUST WANT TO MAKE A REMINDER TO THE COUNCIL THAT WE WILL BE HEARING THE PRESENTATION AND ASKING OUESTIONS, OPENING THE PUBLIC HEARING BUT WE WILL BE TABLING IT TO HAVE IT COME BACK AFTER THE BUDGET DISCUSSION BECAUSE YOU MAY HAVE DECISIONS IN THE BUDGET THAT MAY COME BACK TO IMPACT THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN. THANK YOU, MARY FOR THE REMINDER. TONY, THANK YOU. THANK YOU, GOOD EVENING MAYOR COUNCILMEMBERS, I'M WITH THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT, WILL OVERSEE THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND HAVE PREPARED A FEW HIGHLIGHTS ABOUT THE DRAFT CIP CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM BUDGET BEFORE YOU THIS EVENING. THE FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, CIP IS A FIVE-YEAR PROJECTION OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS. FOR VARIOUS CATEGORIES. YEAR ONE IS A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025-2026, THAT IS ACTUALLY THE BUDGET THAT COUNCIL WILL BE ASKED TO ADOPT. JUST THE ONE YOUR PROGRAM. STAFF WITH THE BUDGET COMMITTEE ON APRIL 28th AND 29th AND ALSO ON MAY 5th. THE DRAFT CIP BUDGET INCORPORATES COMMENTS MADE BY THE COMMITTEE. OF NOTE ARE TWO PROJECTS THAT WERE ADDED AS REQUESTED BY THE COMMITTEE MEMBERS. THOSE TWO PROJECTS ARE THE CITYWIDE PAINTING AND REPAIRS FOR VARIOUS TAKEOUTS AND REPAIRS TO THE CITY IN THE AMOUNT OF \$500,000. HOWEVER, THE MEASURE PARK FUND SUMMARY THAT IS FOUND IN THE DRAFT CITY BUDGET, WHICH IS ON AGENDA ITEM NUMBER 16, PAGES 171 AND 172 OF 383, DOES NOT INCLUDE THIS PROPOSED PROJECT. THEREFORE, --

A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN FOR FISCAL YEAR 25-26,

CAN YOU REPEAT THAT?

IT IS TOO MANY PAGES FOR YOU TO BE FLIPPING THROUGH, SO, WE WILL BRING THAT UP ON THE SCREEN. TO MAKE IT EASIER. BUT I DID WANT TO STATE THAT THE FUND SUMMARY DUE TO THIS PROJECT IS UNDERSTATED BY HUNDRED \$80,000 RESULTING IN AN ENDING FUND BALANCE OF 168,581, WHICH IS DIFFERENT THAN WHAT IS IN THE BUDGET. WITH THAT I HAVE CORRECTED THE TWO PAGES, YOU CAN BRING THEM UP ON THE SCREEN. I WAS HOPING I COULD HAVE SOME HELP BRINGING THOSE, IF YOU COULD PLEASE BRING UP PAGE 172 OF 383 FIRST. THAT IS THE ONE THAT I HAD, YES. OKAY.

HANG ON.

IF YOU HAVE THE ACTUAL BUDGET BOOK ITSELF IT IS GOING TO BE TAB F AND PAGE 143 AND 144, IT IS MEASURE M.

THANK YOU.

NOW THAT WE HAVE IT IN FRONT OF US , CAN IT BE REPEATED? I CANNOT SEE THAT THERE.

IT IS A PDF AND I'M NOT SURE I CAN MAKE IN THE LARGER THAN THIS. THAT IS BETTER.

SO, IF YOU LOOK AT THE ITEMS THAT ARE HIGHLIGHTED IN RED. IF YOU LOOK AT THE VERY BOTTOM, THE IVES PARK PATHWAY REPLACEMENT AT 88 PROJECT FOR HUNDRED \$80,000. THAT IS WHAT WAS MISSING OUT OF HIS DETAILED WORKSHEET IN YOUR BUDGET. YES?

DOES THIS AFFECT THE GENERAL FUND?

THIS THE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND WITH NOTHING TO DO WITH THE GENERAL FUND.

THANK YOU.

TONY?

WITHOUT IF THERE ARE NO MORE QUESTIONS ON THIS PARTICULAR DISCREPANCY THAT WAS DISCOVERED, I DID WANT TO MOVE ON WITH THE REST OF THE PRESENTATION AND SO, MANY OF THE PROJECTS IN THE DRAFT FISCAL YEAR 2025-'26 ARE CONTINUED FROM THIS FISCAL YEAR, 2024 AND 2025, WE HAVE A FEW NEW PROJECTS. A LOT OF THE PROJECTS THAT ARE ON THAT LIST ARE REALLY CONTINUATION OF EXISTING PROJECTS. A COMPLETE LIST OF THE PROPOSED FISCAL YEAR 2025 PROJECTS, WHERE THEY ARE CONTINUATION PROJECTS OR NEW PROJECTS CAN BE FOUND ON PAGES 8 AND 9 OF 70 OF YOUR PACKET. AND IF YOU COULD PLEASE BRING THAT SHEET UP. IT IS PAGE, ON THE AGENDA PACKET, LET'S START WITH PAGE 8 OF 70. LET ME SEE.
