### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Measure O funding, approved by Sonoma County voters, provides resources for behavioral health programs and initiatives addressing homelessness. The Department of Health Services has issued a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) inviting applications from community-based organizations (CBOs) and local governments that operate programs critical to the behavioral health and homelessness support network.

#### BACKGROUND:

In 2023, SVdP and the City were awarded \$6.449 million from the California Department of Housing and Community Development to construct Gravenstein Commons, a 22-unit permanent supportive housing community. The project received a building permit in 2025, and foundation work is now underway. It was understood that SVdP would pursue grant opportunities to support long-term permanent supportive housing development.

### **DISCUSSION:**

The project seeks to provide permanent supportive housing for chronically homeless individuals, identified through the Coordinated Entry System, with wraparound services provided by case managers.



At a 2024 Council meeting, Sonoma County Department of Health Services Director Tina Rivera presented a commitment letter pledging \$3 million in County support as a financial backstop. While this commitment has not yet materialized, Measure O funding offers a vital opportunity for the County to demonstrate its support and ensure the project's success.

The City's letter of support will strengthen SVdP's application to help secure Measure O resources to stabilize this shovel-ready project.

# STAFF (RESPONSIBLE DEPARTMENT) ANALYSIS:

The City Manager's Office recommend Council approval of the letter of support. The Gravenstein Commons project is intended to address homelessness in Sebastopol by transitioning individuals from temporary encampments and the safe parking program into permanent supportive housing. SVdP has agreed to be monitored by the City, including the City's right to request dated bank statements at any time to transparently review available cash on hand and the rate of expenditure. The City's consultant, 8th Wave, has been instrumental in assisting with reporting requirements and oversight. Both SVdP and the City continue to evaluate operational funding opportunities as programs are changing and coming online such as this NOFA.

Dear Honorable Members of the Measure O Review Committee,

The City of Sebastopol wishes to submit this letter to you to express our support for the Gravenstein Commons permanent supportive housing community, and to urge you to award the full one million dollars that has been requested.

Our attention to this project began when we had over sixty houseless people living on Morris Street. In conjunction with The Society of St. Vincent de Paul District Council of Sonoma, Incorporated (SVdP), and Sonoma Applied Village Services (SAVS), we identified a suitable place to temporarily provide safe parking for these individuals in one, central location that would not impede the public right of way, nor put our waterways at risk of pollution from unsanctioned dumping. Most importantly, this action provided a safe place for people to park so that they could center themselves and reach for a better life. This was all done with the public understanding that SVdP would then begin applying for grants with the City's support as the co-applicant for this project, so that these folks, and people like them, could have a place to call home in the long term.

Shortly thereafter, SVdP and the City were awarded \$6.449 million from the California Department of Housing and Community Development to begin construction of a 22-unit housing community. At the time, the Sebastopol City Council had a great deal of trepidation about the project, because the City was facing a budget deficit and as co-applicant of this project, want to see the project succeed.

During a 2024 Council meeting, Department of Health Services Director Tina Rivera presented a formal letter to the Council and the public committing \$3 million to the project in the form of a financial backstop to ensure the City would not be at risk, financially. This commitment led the Council to reluctantly vote to press on. However, since then, the County has made no significant steps to follow through on their commitment to the project, the City of Sebastopol, SVdP and, most notably, the people we are collectively trying to help. Lacking this follow-through, Gravenstein Commons has become dependent on the support of the County through such venues a as this, granting of funds from Measure O.

Commitments aside, this project is very worthy of your support. As stated, it has received \$6,449,000 in funding already, a building permit has been issued, and the foundation is being poured at the time of this writing. The project seeks to serve the chronically homeless, using the Coordinated Entry System, with wraparound services provided by case managers. This project is shovel ready and worthy of your support.

We thank you for your consideration. Your support will help to ensure the viability of this project and provide rapid housing relief to people in need in our area.
