- 2. Funding to support dedicated Mobile Support Teams (MST) for Sebastopol To work collaboratively with the City Police Department when responding to mental health situations.

This request is pursuant to the Measure O: Behavioral Health & Homelessness Pathways to Sustainability Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA).

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Measure O funding, approved by Sonoma County voters, provides resources for behavioral health programs and initiatives addressing homelessness. The Department of Health Services seeks applications from community-based



organizations (CBOs) and local governments with existing programs critical to the behavioral health and homelessness support network. Sebastopol's initial HEART pilot program positions the City as eligible for additional funding.

BACKGROUND:

Measure O funding, approved by Sonoma County voters, provides resources for behavioral health programs and initiatives addressing homelessness. The Department of Health Services is looking to use Measure O funding to support the community and help protect the County's investments in Behavioral Health and Homelessness services and programs. The Department of Health Services is seeking applications from a mix of community-based organizations (CBOs) and local government partners with existing projects critical to these networks that are facing funding uncertainties.

DISCUSSION:

The City has need for funding for homeless outreach services to address this critical need in the City. Although it appears the point in time count is considerably lower than the last count, the City of Sebastopol is currently experiencing a sustained and visible presence of unhoused individuals, including established encampments in key public spaces or individuals who have taken up residence in the downtown plaza and city parking lot. Routinely, unsheltered and homeless individuals are observed as living in the Sebastopol Downtown Plaza, the City/Chamber of Commerce parking lot, and along the Joe Rodota Trail within city limits to name a few of the City locations.

The City understands that several other Sonoma County jurisdictions received funding to support mobile crisis response services. Initially, Sebastopol did not apply for these funds, as the City did not have a formal program in place. However, following a recent discussion with the Department of Health Services, it is now clear that our partnership with the County – with the initial three month HEART Pilot program – makes the City of Sebastopol eligible for funding. Sebastopol should be included in the County's broader strategy and eligible for funding to support its response to homelessness by extending the Pilot program for an additional nine months as well as providing funding to help support a dedicated Mobile Support Teams (MST) for Sebastopol to working collaboration with the City Police Department when responding to mental health situations.

A shared investment between the County and City will allow us to strengthen our coordinated response to homelessness, expand access to mental health and housing services, and reduce strain on emergency and law enforcement resources; as well as be the start of a regional approach which is a key priority of all Sonoma County cities and the Board of Supervisors. I understand that the Mobile Support Team (MST) Offers round-the-clock crisis response through a 24/7 call center at 1-800-746-8181. Services include in-field crisis assessment, de-escalation, intervention, 5150 assessments, safety planning, and transportation. Teams consist of mental health clinicians, substance abuse counselors, and client support specialists and can respond independently from law enforcement when appropriate. Although the City has a contract with WCCS to outreach services, outreach workers are not licensed clinicians and are not equipped to handle acute mental health emergencies. In those cases, the Sonoma County's Mobile Support Team (MST) would be the appropriate first responder and having Sebastopol have MST services would supplement the services provided by WCCS.

As this is one of the three key priorities of the Sonoma County Mayors and Councilmembers Association, all cities should receive their fair share of the Measure O funds for services for our community.

STAFF (RESPONSIBLE DEPARTMENT) ANALYSIS:

The City was approved for a pilot "HEART" program which will provide professional outreach and support services that extend beyond what law enforcement alone can provide. The addition of dedication of Mobile Support Team services in Sebastopol would be an essential step forward. Our officers frequently encounter individuals experiencing acute mental health crises, and while we strive to respond with care, law enforcement is not always the most appropriate or effective

first responder. This would reduce pressure on patrol resources, improve outcomes for individuals in crisis, and enhance public safety for the broader community.

Interim City Manager: Extending the HEART program and adding MST support aligns with County priorities and enhances City-County coordination. Inclusion of Sebastopol in Measure O funding ensures equitable distribution of resources across Sonoma County jurisdictions.
