EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

West County Community Services (WCCS) is submitting an application for funding under the Sonoma County Measure O NOFA program to support homelessness street outreach services. The City of Sebastopol recognizes the importance of addressing homelessness and behavioral health challenges in the community and supports collaborative efforts with organizations that provide these critical services.

A letter of support from the City demonstrates Sebastopol's commitment to community partnerships and enhances WCCS's funding application. This letter does not create a financial obligation for the City beyond the \$40,000 that is currently budgeted in the current FY 25 26 approved budget.

BACKGROUND:

Measure O funding, approved by Sonoma County voters, provides resources for behavioral health programs and initiatives addressing homelessness. The Department of Health Services is looking to use Measure O funding to support the community and help protect the County's investments in Behavioral Health and Homelessness services and programs. The Department of Health Services is seeking applications from a mix of community-based organizations (CBOs) and local

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government partners with existing projects critical to these networks that are facing funding uncertainties. WCCS is applying for funding.

DISCUSSION:

WCCS has a long-standing record of serving Sebastopol and the West County region with programs including street outreach, supportive services, and connection to housing resources. Since 2021, in response to the increasing visibility and impact of homelessness in the region, the city entered into partnership with West County Community Servies (WCCS) to deliver homeless outreach services. This was to support the City's commitment to supporting vulnerable residents while maintaining community safety and public health.

At the most recent August 5, 2025 City Council meeting, the Council approved a contract with West County Community Services in the amount of \$36,667 funding agreement for FY2025-2026 for continued Homeless Outreach Services.

By providing a letter of support, the City signals its endorsement of WCCS's efforts and highlights the alignment of their programs with the City Council's priorities for public health, safety, and community well-being. This will also enhance the newly created HEART pilot program which ensures a coordinated approach to maximizing the impact of outreach efforts. This role is not a substitute for a mobile crisis or behavioral health response team but in addition to those needs.

Additional funding will help with a more consistent presence and follow-up with individuals experiencing homelessness; expanded coverage across the week; improved coordination with County services, law enforcement, and local providers; and provide case management to support more unhoused individuals who are actively engaged and working toward housing placement

STAFF (RESPONSIBLE DEPARTMENT) ANALYSIS:

Staff has reviewed WCCS's funding request and finds that their proposed project aligns with the City's objectives in addressing homelessness and behavioral health. Supporting this application through a letter of support is consistent with the City's goal of fostering collaborative regional solutions to community challenges.
