Subject: Native American Tribes and Public Art/Consideration of the Public Arts Committee to

routinely consider opportunities to honor Pomo heritage when reviewing public art

projects.

Recommendation:

That the Public Arts Committee routinely consider opportunities to honor Pomo heritage and cultural expression in the planning and selection of public art projects.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This agenda item recommends that the Public Arts Committee incorporate routinely consideration of Pomo and other Native American cultural representation in public art planning. This aligns with the City Council's adopted goals of equity, cultural recognition, and honoring the Indigenous history of Sebastopol.

BACKGROUND

The City of Sebastopol acknowledges Indigenous Peoples as the traditional stewards of the land and that the City of Sebastopol is located within the traditional homelands of the Federated Indians of Graton Rancheria, comprised of Coast Miwok and Southern Pomo peoples. The City has proclaimed that the Southern Pomo and Coast Miwok had inhabited the land now occupied by the City of Sebastopol for thousands of years.

The Pomo maintained a harmonious relationship with the ecology of this area, including knowledgeable and respectful harvesting of animals, plants, and mineral resources; and the Pomo people have struggled to maintain health, identity, prosperity, and cultural traditions since the settling of their land by Euro-Americans. The City recognizes their wisdom and crafts traditions hold important values for our community.

Committee Member Waters had requested an agenda item for discussion at the March 2025 Public Arts Committee meeting. The item was posted for the May 2025 Public Arts Committee meeting but was not heard at that time.

Today's item is to consider the agenda item as proposed by Committee Member Waters.
