### New Online Tool Offers Transparent Look at Sebastopol Police Activity



The Sebastopol Police Department announces its new Citizen Records Incident Management System (RIMS) page. This platform provides a transparent look at police activity in our community, empowering you with valuable information at your fingertips. From crime statistics and missing persons

reports, to recent arrests and press releases. You can also register your security cameras to help aid investigations.

Citizen RIMS provides interested users with detailed information about police activity within the City of Sebastopol. To protect victim privacy, this feature does not provide information regarding juvenile offenders or specific information regarding calls for service that are sensitive in nature. Mapping is plotted using the general vicinity and not the exact location of an incident.

### Sebastopol Welcomed Global Guests as Part of Japan-America Grassroots Summit

Sebastopol recently hosted international guests as part of the 2025 Japan-America Grassroots Summit, celebrating the enduring friendship between Japan and the U.S. Held June 3–9



and organized by the Japan Society of Northern California (JSNC) and the Center for International Exchange (CIE), the event included a special "Local Session" in Sebastopol.

Sebastopol World Friends, a longtime promoter of international friendship and cultural exchange through its Sister Cities program with Takeo, Japan and Chyhyryn, Ukraine, partnered with JSNC and CIE to host several summit participants. For four days, local families shared their homes, culture, and community with guests, highlighting Sebastopol's creative spirit and strong values of peace and connection.

A memorable meet-and-greet at City Hall gave guests and community leaders a chance to exchange stories and learn from one another. Vice Mayor McLewis and Sebastopol World Friends' Takeo Committee Co-Chair Meg Mizutani also represented Sebastopol at the summit's opening ceremony in San Francisco.

One special guest, Kyo Nakahama, a fifth-generation descendant of John Manjiro—whose life story inspired the summit—spoke about the importance of person-to-person diplomacy and expressed deep appreciation for Sebastopol's hospitality. #### Ticks Love the Laguna Too – Don't Let Them Love You!

While ticks can be active in Sonoma County year-round, reports are that we're experiencing a bumper crop of ticks due to increased vegetation growth after our wet winter. If you're planning to be outdoors enjoying the beautiful summer weather, especially in

Then check yourself, kids, and pets for ticks after your visit. Bites from these pesky little critters cause irritation and transmit diseases including Lyme disease, Rocky Mountain spotted fever, and tularemia.
