GOING TO GO AHEAD AND READ THAT THE CITY ACKNOWLEDGES WE LIVE AND WORK WITHIN THE UNSEEDDED HOMELANDS, WE PAY RESPECTS TO THE PAST PRESENT AND FUTURE GENERATIONS OF THESE PEOPLE'S INCLUDING THE FEDERATED INDIANS OF SO WE ARE HERE TO DISCUSS CITY COUNCIL GOALS AND PRIORITIES TONIGHT AND LET'S SEE. WHERE SHOULD I BEGIN WITH WHAT WE HAVE OVER HERE? IS THAT WHERE YOU WOULD LIKE ME TO START? OKAY.

SORRY WITH THE PROCESS FOR TONIGHT.

WHAT WE HAVE IS, WE DID THIS LAST YEAR AND CAME UP WITH A PROCESS SO I WANTED US TO QUICKLY TALK ABOUT WHAT WE'RE GOING TO DO TONIGHT AND AGREE ON THE PROCESS AGAIN SO WE ARE ALL CLEAR AND THAT WAY WE CAN MOVE FORWARD WITH EVERYTHING WE HAVE. THE FIRST THING WE WILL HAVE MARY INTRODUCE THE ITEM AND WE HAVE ADDITIONAL INPUT FROM COUNCILMEMBERS FOR ANYONE WHO WANTS TO ADD ANYTHING TO CURRENT GOALS YOU HAVE IN THE DOCUMENTS SENT TO US. I HAVE A FEW TO ADD AND WE WILL OPEN UP FOR PUBLIC COMMENT AND THEN AFTER PUBLIC COMMENT WE WILL DISCUSS GOALS THAT ARE SUBMITTED BY THE COMMUNITY AND COUNCIL AND HAVE FULL DISCUSSION AND AGREEMENT AND THEN WE WILL HAVE PUBLIC COMMENT AFTER WE ARE FINISHED BUT GUARDING THE PROCESS FOR DIRECTION OF STAFF ON THE GOAL LAST YEAR WE MOVED GOALS FORWARD WITH UNANIMOUS SUPPORT SO TONIGHT WE NEED TO DECIDE IF WE SHOULD CONTINUE THAT APPROACH ONLY GOES WITH UNANIMOUS SUPPORT MOVE FORWARD WE DID THAT LAST YEAR AND IT PREVENTED US FROM HAVING 100 GOALS AND THEN OR WE CAN CONSIDER SUPPORTING GOALS TO HAVE THREE OR MORE COUNCILMEMBERS SUPPORT SO THAT'S ONE THING. AND THEN AFTER WE HAVE AFTER THE RULES HAVE BEEN PRESENTED AND DISCUSSED I'M GOING TO ASK IF THERE IS CONSENT OR THE THREE OR MORE IF WE HAVE THREE OR MORE AND WE WILL GO FROM THERE. IF ANY MEMBER OBJECTS WILL TAKE THE ROLL CALL AND FIGURE OUT WHERE WE ARE AT. MARY IS GOING TO DO LIKE LAST YEAR WHERE SHE WILL HAVE GOALS ON THE SCREEN AND AS WE GO ALONG SHE WILL CALL THEM CORRECT? NOT MISSTATING?

THAT'S CORRECT, THE SHEET YOU WILL SEE COME THE LAST ATTACHMENT IS ALL THE GOALS SUBMITTED FROM THE COMMUNITY AS FAR AS THEMES AND FROM CITY COUNCILMEMBERS WHO HAVE RECEIVED THEM ALREADY AND GOALS FROM CITY STAFF THAT ARE NEW OR HAVE BEEN CARRYOVERS FROM LAST YEAR AND RECOMMENDATION IS TO DO WHAT WE DID LAST YEAR AS WE WENT THROUGH EACH ONE AND THEN KEPT GOING THROUGH UNTIL WE GOT TO THE END AND AT THE VERY END THE DIRECTION WOULD BE FOR STAFF TO REVIEW GOALS FOR BUDGETARY ITEMS AND BRING THOSE BACK TO THE BUDGET PROCESS AND TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR FULL RENEWAL. SIMILAR TO HOW WE DID LAST YEAR.

THE FIRST QUESTION I HAVE FOR EVERYONE IS ARE WE IN AGREEMENT WE WILL DO LIKE WE DID LAST YEAR WITH UNANIMOUS? ALL FIVE IN AGREEMENT BECAUSE WE MOVE

FORWARD OR ARE WE HAVE A DIFFERENT THOUGHT? I GUESS I WILL OPEN IT UP TO ASK EVERYONE. Agenda Item Number 1

I DON'T KNOW HOW TO LIMIT IF WE DID BY THREES. IT SEEMS LIKE THAT BECAME ONEROUS FOR CITY STAFF, SO WE COULD START JUST THINKING OUT LOUD WE COULD START UNANIMOUS AND IF IT IS LIGHT OR WE FEEL WE CAN GO BACK OR HAVE THE TIME WE COULD GO DO THREE OF THEM?

I WOULD LIKE TO SEE UNANIMOUS VOTES PRIORITIZED AND THEN IF THERE'S TIME OR STAFF AVAILABILITY THAN OTHER VOTES COULD COME UP IN THE RANKS. PRIORITIZING UNANIMOUS VOTES TO ME IT IS SIGNIFICANT IF WE HAVE FIVE YES.

IF I RECALL CORRECTLY WE KEPT TRACK OF THE VOTES LAST YEAR AND WE WENT BACK TO THE FOUR. AM I REMEMBERING THAT TO THAT POINT?

WE WENT THROUGH AGAIN I CAN SHOW ON THE SCREEN ATTACHED AT THE END WE WENT TO THE TABLE SHOWING EACH VOTE EACH COUNCIL MEMBER SUPPORT OR NOT SUPPORT AND RETALIATE UP HOW MANY HAD UNANIMOUS SUPPORT AT THE END. WE DID UNANIMOUS LAST YEAR.

THEY SAY THEY WOULD LIKE TO REVISIT IF WE ARE LIGHT ON GOALS. I WAS SAYING IF WE KEEP TRACK OF THE NUMBER OF VOTES IF WE GO BACK TO THE ITEMS WITH FOUR VOTES THAT WOULD BE THE BEST PROCESS TO GO TO THAT FIRST UNANIMOUS.

THE GOALS ARE GETTING ACHIEVED THAN THE NEXT WOULD BE FOUR AND THEN THREE, TWO. THAT WOULD BE MY SUGGESTION.

YES THAT SOUNDS LIKE LAST YEAR. THAT IS WHAT WE DID LAST YEAR BECAUSE WE SURVIVED HER THAT AND WE WANT TO SURVIVE THIS.

WE WANT TO BE EFFICIENT AND NOT BE HERE UNTIL 10:00 AT NIGHT. JUST TO REITERATE WE WILL GO WITH UNANIMOUS AND IF FOR SOME REASON WE DON'T HAVE ENOUGH GOALS WE CAN REVISIT FOUR AFTER WE PUT TOGETHER WHICH I DON'T ANTICIPATE THAT

HAVE A QUESTION FOR MARY I THINK IT WAS THE SIXTH. ITEM HERE IN OUR PACKET YOU HAVE THE GOALS LISTED IN THE VOTES ONE OF THOSE WAS FOR THE MURAL WHICH IS ALREADY BUDGETED SO I WAS NOT SURE WHY THAT WAS GETTING VOTED ON AGAIN.

COMING BACK AS A CARRYOVER. THEORETICALLY THE GOALS WERE ONE YEAR SO WE SHOULD BRING IT BACK TO BE VOTED ON BUT IT IS A CARRYOVER SO AS WE GO THROUGH THEN WE WILL SHOW WHICH ARE CARRYOVERS BUT THAT IS BUDGETED, NOT DONE THIS YEAR WHICH IS WHY WE BROUGHT IT BACK SO IT IS RECOMMENDED FOR THE UPCOMING YEAR.

RIGHT AND I'M TRYING TO LOOK AND REFRESH MYSELF. THE CARRYOVERS ARE THE ONES AT THE END RIGHT? CARRYOVER PRIORITIES THEY ARE NOT CATEGORIES THEY ARE BOLDED IN THE ATTACHMENTS SO WE WILL PUT THEM ON THE SCREEN SO WE CAN SHOW WHICH SAYS TRANSPARENT. I WOULD RECOMMEND GOING LINE TO LINE SO IT IS EASIER AND MORE TRANSPARENT AND MORE EFFICIENT.

OKAY IF WE ARE IN AGREEMENT ON THAT THAT IS THE MAIN THING WE NEEDED. APOLOGIES I AM TRYING TO MAKE SURE IF THERE'S ANYTHING ELSE. AFTER THAT MARY TAKE OVER AND START PRESENTING.

AS YOU RECEIVED 108 PAGES THESE ARE THE GOALS RECENTLY THE COUNCIL WHEN WE TALK ABOUT BRINGING BACK IS A GOAL SESSION TO BRING THE CURRENT SIX GOALS WHICH WERE THE COMMUNITY VITALITY PUBLIC SAFETY INFRASTRUCTURE HIGH-PERFORMANCE ORGANIZATION LONG-TERM FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT. LAST YEAR WE HAD ABOUT 68 GOALS. WE COMPLETED SIX, 41 ARE EITHER COMPLETED BY THE END OF THE FISCAL YEAR OR THOSE RECOMMENDED TO BE CARRIED OVER. THIS YEAR WE DID SOMETHING DIFFERENT. WE DID COMMUNITY SURVEY SO WE SEND OUT A COMMUNITY SURVEY AND GOT 240 RESPONSES AND ATTACHED TO THE STAFF REPORT ARE THE RESPONSES THERE WERE STRONG THEMES AND THE THEMES WERE PRACTICAL NEAR-TERM OPTIONS FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY AND THEN THE ROADS LOCAL BUSINESS TRAFFIC AND PARKING HOMELESSNESS AND SAFETY AND DOWNTOWN VITALITY THOSE WERE THE THEMES THAT CAME OF THE 236 THERE WERE SOME OTHER MINOR ONES AND WE TOOK THE TOP THEMES AND BROUGHT THEM FOR CITY COUNCIL TO REVIEW. WE PUT THOSE IN THE TABLE AT THE END AND INCORPORATED COMMUNITY COMMENTS. WE REVIEWED THE CURRENT PRIORITIES AND GOALS FROM THIS YEAR. SOME

OF THOSE HAVE BEEN COMPLETED SOME WILL BE COMPLETED AND FOR THOSE WE NEED TO WORK ON WE NEED TO PUT THEM IN THE FORWARD YEAR, WE HAVE BROUGHT THOSE FORWARD SO TONIGHT'S ACTION IS TO REVIEW THE LAST ATTACHMENT, A COMBINATION OF COMMUNITY INPUT, CITY COUNCIL GOALS, CITY STAFF IS RECOMMENDING TO BE CARRIED OVER AND TO GET DIRECTION AS TO IF YOU WANT TO ADD ADDITIONAL TASKS NOT GOALS THERE ARE SIX KEY GOALS SO THESE ARE TASKS AND PRIORITIES OF THE COUNCIL MUST ADD TASK OR PRIORITIES IF YOU WANTED TO REMOVE ANY OF THE CURRENT PROPOSED AND THEN DIRECT STAFF AT THE END WHEN WE HAVE THE VOTE TAKEN AND AFTER PUBLIC COMMENT TO DIRECT US TO LOOK AT THE BUDGETARY IMPACTS AND THEN BRING THOSE BACK THROUGH THE BUDGET PROCESS AND TO BRING THE BACK AS FINAL ADOPTION OF THE GOALS WHEN WE HAVE THE BUDGET IMPACT. OKAY. FIRST WOULD BE IF THERE ARE QUESTIONS OF THE CURRENT GOALS OR DO WE WANT TO JUMP INTO THE LINE BY LINE? YOU HAVE ALL THE PAGES THE COMMUNITY COMMENTS YOU ARE PROVIDED THOSE ON THE WEBSITE FOR TRANSPARENCY. WE PROVIDED THE COUNCIL GOALS. I WOULD OPEN UP FOR ADDITIONAL COMMENTS. WE DID NOT GET ALL COUNCIL COMMENTS BUT THERE MAY BE GOALS ADDED THEN WE GO TO PUBLIC COMMENT AND THEN WE CAN COME BACK AND GO THROUGH LINE BY LINE ITEMS.

CAN I CLARIFY SOMETHING AND I APOLOGIZE IF YOU SENT IT ALREADY. WITH THE TOTAL SURVEY RESPONSES WHEN YOU PUT THEM IN THE GOALS WAS THAT IN ORDER OF PRIORITY?

IN ORDER OF THEME.

RIGHT. NOT BY THIS WAS THE ONE.

LOOK IN THE AGENDA REPORT HOW MANY RESPONSES TO THE TOP ONES, IT IS IN THE STAFF REPORT.

I SAW I WAS NOT SURE.

WE LISTED THEM UNDER THE GOALS SO FOR INFRASTRUCTURE WE PUT THEM AS ROADS AND TRAFFIC.

JUST WANTED TO MAKE SURE I WAS UNDERSTANDING PROPERLY. OKAY.

QUESTION. COULD YOU RESTATE TOP GOALS THE PUBLIC STATED? THERE WERE SIX OR SEVEN OR EIGHT.

SURE, LET ME GET BACK THERE REAL QUICK. SO IT WAS FISCAL SORRY THE TOP THEMES WERE NEAR-TERM, PRACTICAL AND NEAR-TERM SOLUTIONS AND FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY. AND THEN ROADS. TRAFFIC, PARKING, BUSINESSES, HOMELESS AND SAFETY AND DOWNTOWN VITALITY.

WHICH PAGE IS THAT ON? I AM LOOKING AT SO MANY LIST.

IN THE STAFF REPORT. IT IS JUST A RECAP OF WHAT WAS STATED. IT WAS A THEME THAT CAME OUT TO ALL OF THE RESPONSES. I DON'T HAVE THE EXACT PAGE IN FRONT OF ME WHERE I WROTE THAT BUT THOSE ARE THE THEMES WE ARE COMING THROUGH.

ARE THOSE SINGLE-LINE ITEMS OR GROUPS? IS TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN ONE GROUP OR ARE THOSE SEPARATE?

THEY ARE GROUPED SO DEPENDING ON WHAT THE RESPONSE WAS TRAFFIC AND PARKING COULD BE PEDESTRIAN SAFETY, IT COULD BE SPEEDERS OR LIKE SIDEWALK INFRA STRUCTURE FOR PARKING THAT WOULD GO UNDER THE INFRASTRUCTURE. IF IT WAS RELATED TO SPEEDING AND ENFORCEMENT AND PUBLIC SAFETY.

OKAY. ALL RIGHT. GO AHEAD.

I HAVE THAT PROCESS I'M NOT SURE I WANT IT TO BE A GOAL.

YOU COULD HAVE IT REMOVED.

OKAY. SO DID YOU HAVE A COMMENT? GO AHEAD.

I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE OFF THE I HEART SEBASTOPOL SINCE WE HAVE THE 1/25 CELEBRATION. AND THAT IS A PROCESS THAT'S MOVING.

WE WILL START ON GOAL ONE AND AS WE GO THROUGH WE CAN MARK THEM OFF AND TAKE THEM OFF BUT JUST FOR THE SAKE OF EVERYONE BEING ON THE SWING PAGE FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF THE ITEM WE ARE TAKING ADDITIONAL INPUT FROM COUNCILMEMBERS IF YOU HAVE ANYTHING AND THEN WE'RE GOING TO GO OUT TO PUBLIC COMMENT. HOW ABOUT IF I GO THROUGH THIS GOAL ONE AND WE WANT TO ADD OR SUBTRACT DOES THAT WORK FOR YOU? AND THEN?

HAD ADDITIONAL GOALS THEN GO TO PUBLIC COMMENT.

SO I'M GOING TO START WITH GOAL NUMBER ONE COMMUNITY VITALITY. WE HAVE COUNCILMEMBER PRIORITIES PUBLIC INPUT ALL OF THIS. HAVE A COUPLE I WOULD LIKE TO ADD TO THIS SO I WILL ASK EVERYONE ELSE IF YOU HAVE ANYTHING TO ADD FIRST. NOTHING TO AND JUST TO REMOVE THE ITEM.

OKAY ALL RIGHT. AND THEN I WOULD LIKE TO ADD AND ONE THING IS SOME OF THESE THINGS FOR ME PERSONALLY WE HAVE SHORT-TERM AND LONG-TERM GOALS AND IDENTIFYING LONG-TERM THAT IS A LITTLE AMBIGUOUS. SO I DON'T KNOW WHAT WOULD BE THE BEST WAY TO IDENTIFY THAT.

THESE GOALS ARE ONE YEAR SO IF THERE LONG-TERM I WOULD RECOMMEND WE CREATE A SEPARATE LIST. AND THEN COME BACK AND REVIEW THOSE LONGER THAN WHEN YOU PROCESS WE SHOULD HAVE A SEPARATE DOCUMENT.

I WILL PUT THEM OUT AND WE CAN DECIDE. TWO THINGS THINKING ABOUT A LOT AS I DRIVE AROUND TOWN. ONE IS IMPROVING THE CITY WELCOME SIGNS THEY LOOK PRETTY DATED SO THAT WAS ONE THING I WAS THINKING. THOSE ARE THE TWO THINGS I WANT TO ADD FOR COMMUNITY VITALITY DOES ANYONE HAVE ANY ADDITION TO THIS LIST HERE OKAY. GOAL NUMBER TWO, PUBLIC SAFETY. IF ANYONE HAS ANYTHING YOU WOULD LIKE TO ADD OR REMOVE FROM THIS ONE. SURE, GO AHEAD.

SO IF WE HAVE NORMAL THINGS LIKE POLICE AND HEART PROGRAMS ARE ALREADY DOING WE DON'T NEED TO PUT THEM INTO GOALS

I DON'T SEE IT ON HERE THAT'S WHY I'M ASKING.

IT IS HERE BUT THIS IS THE FORM.

ON LONG-TERM FINANCIAL SUSTAINABILITY. GOAL FIVE ITEM 3.

GOAL FIVE NOT GO THROUGH.

EVEN THOUGH IT WAS INFRASTRUCTURE WE DID TRY TO PUT IT THE LONG-TERM FINANCIAL STABILITY FOR NOT JUST THE ENTERPRISE FUND BUT IT IMPACTS GENERAL FUND SO WE PUT IN UNDER LONG-TERM FINANCIAL STABILITY OR SUSTAINABILITY. WE CAN MOVE IF THE COUNCIL LIKES TO BUT IT IS HERE FOR CONSIDERATION.

YOU VOLUNTEERED FOR THE JOB MAKE THE HARD CALLS AND CITIZENS WILL SUPPORT YOU. I LOVE THAT COMMENT. I WANTED TO SAY THANK YOU. TO WHOEVER WROTE THAT.

OKAY. WE JUST WENT THROUGH PUBLIC.

YES WE CAN.

I WANT TO COMMENT ON THE APPLE BLOSSOM TRAIL PARTICULARLY. SOME HISTORY THERE THAT THE GROUP, THE GROUP THAT PUT THIS PROJECT TOGETHER WAS CALLED THE SEBASTOPOL TRAIL MAKERS. THERE ARE OTHER SIGNS IN FRONT OF THE COMMUNITY CHURCH ON 116 COMING IN THAT'S A SLOWDOWN SEBASTOPOL OR SOMETHING. YOU TALKING ABOUT THOSE SIGNS TOO?

THOSE ARE THE ONES THAT WE HAVE DONE WAY BACK WHEN, WHEN THIS CAME THROUGH. THROUGH THE COUNTY. AFRICA THE PROGRAM THAT IT CAME THROUGH. IT WAS A SAFETY PROGRAM WE DID THE POLICE DID THOSE SIGNS.

THOSE ARE DIFFERENT.

TALKING ABOUT THE WELCOME SIGNS.

THAT INCLUDE THE NUCLEAR FREE ZONE?

THAT WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT BEFORE.

JUST WANT TO BE CLEAR.

I DON'T WANT TO VOTE ON THIS I WILL SAY SOMETHING I DON'T WANT TO VOTE ON I WILL THROW IT OUT THERE. I THINK WE NEED TO LOOK AT SIGNS THROUGHOUT BUT WE ARE NOT VOTING ON THAT.

RIGHT THAT HAS BEEN A TOPIC IN THE PAST. FOR THE WELCOME SIGN GO AHEAD.

I DO NOT SEE THE NEED TO UPDATE THE WELCOME SIGNS BECAUSE THEY WILL BE SUBSTANTIAL COST WITH THAT BUT I DO SEE EVIDENCE FOR THE NEED FOR THE BENCHES.

WE WILL DO THOUGH SEPARATELY. I THINK THE WELCOME SIGNS LOOK LIKE THEY'RE FROM THE 70s AND IT WOULD BE NICE TO HAVE SOMETHING A LITTLE MORE SPRUCED UP IN MY OPINION. THE FIRST THING PEOPLE SEE WHEN THEY COME HERE SO THAT'S WHY I WAS THINKING IF WE ARE LOOKING AT DOWNTOWN VITALITY IT WOULD BE NICE OF PEOPLE. I SAW SOMETHING.

I LIKE THE SIGNS THE WAY THEY ARE SO THAT'S JUST ME.

I AM GOING TO CALL, COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

YES

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON

YES, WILLING TO LOOK AT IT.

COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN

NO I LIKE THE 70s VIBE.

VICE MAYOR MAURER

NO.

MAYOR McLEWIS

YES.

THAT WAS THREE NEXT WOULD BE THE BENCHES.

YES AND I THINK THIS HAS COME UP BEFORE JUST SOME OF THE BENCHES ARE PRETTY RATTY AND SPLINTERED AND EVERYTHING ELSE SO THERE'S A LOT OF WAYS TO GO WITH THIS. THERE'S DIFFERENT ART ORGANIZATIONS THAT DO BENCHES. I THOUGHT IT WOULD BE NICE IF WE COULD START LIKE THE TRASH CANS DOWNTOWN MAYBE TO START STAFF CAN IDENTIFY WHAT IT WILL COST AND THEN FIGURE OUT WHAT IS FEASIBLE AND BRING IT BACK. MAYBE IT IS STAGGERED IS A PROJECT. THAT'S WHAT I WAS THINKING.

STAFF HAS ALSO BEEN WORKING WITH THE CHAMBER OF COMMERCE AND MAIN STREET TO SUBMIT A GRANT TO THE MAIN STREET PROGRAM WE DON'T HAVE DESIGNS YET BUT THAT WOULD BE SOMETHING COMING BACK. THAT IS A \$10,000 GRANT IF WE GET IT. SO IS THEIR SUPPORT TO REVIEW THE BENCHES, THIS WOULD BE COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

I WOULD LIKE TO LEAVE IT TO THE GRANT.

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON

YES I THINK WE NEED THEM IN THE GRANT MORE THAN \$10,000.

COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN

YES I SUPPORT RELYING ON GRANTS IS LIKE THROWING DUST IN THE WIND SO I WANT TO NOT COUNT ON THAT.

VICE MAYOR MAURER

YES BECAUSE SOME OF THE BENCHES ARE DANGEROUS IN SUCH BAD SHAPE.

MAYOR McLEWIS

YES.

THAT WOULD BE 4-1.

I WILL CHANGE MY VOTE. IS THAT OKAY? CAN WE DO THAT?

YES. THANK YOU ALL.

NOW I WANT TO UNDERSTAND SINCE WE HAVE PUBLIC INPUT FROM THE SURVEYS DO YOU WANT US TO GO THROUGH THAT LINE BY LINE JUST LIKE WE'RE DOING WITH GOALS? YES DEFINITELY.

NUMBER WHATEVER IT IS ON FIVE PRESERVE LOCAL CHARACTER SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESS AND AVOID CHAIN STORES ACCORDING TO RESPONSES.

I WOULD PROBABLY RECOMMEND FOR THIS EVEN THOUGH THESE WERE SPECIFIC, TO PRESERVE LOCAL CHARACTER AND SUPPORT SMALL BUSINESSES. I THINK THAT INCORPORATES OTHER COMMENTS THAT HAVE BEEN MADE AND BY DOING THAT WE COULD LOOK WORKING WITH THE DOWNTOWN ASSOCIATION AS A TASK. YOU KNOW WE ARE LOOKING AT COMING BACK WITH IMPROVEMENTS AND THINGS LIKE THAT SO THIS IS HOW I SEE PRESERVING LOCAL CHARACTER AND SUPPORTING SMALL BUSINESSES.

OKAY. DOES ANYONE HAVE OTHER QUESTIONS? SORRY VICE MAYOR.

SO WE HAVE, WE DO HAVE THE BUSINESS ORDINANCE THAT ADDRESSES CHAIN STORES ECONOMIC GARDENING THAT IS COMING LATER UNDER A DIFFERENT HEADING. SO I DON'T REALLY SEE A PROJECT WITH THIS. I MEAN I COULD SAY YEAH, I WANT TO PLEDGE TO PRESERVE LOCAL CHARACTER BUT THAT WOULD BE MORE OF A KIND OF IDEOLOGY THING. I DON'T SEE A PROJECT HERE.

I WOULD AGREE AND THE THEMES ARE BUILT INTO A LOT OF THE TASK AND PRIORITY OTHERWISE BUT WE WANT TO SHOW YOU WHAT THIS WAS AND IF THERE WAS SOMETHING SPECIFIC THE COUNCIL WANTED TO PICK UP BUT I WOULD AGREE SUPPORTING SMALL BUSINESSES IS IN THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, HE TO HAVE THE BUSINESSES. PRESERVING LOCAL CHARACTER LIKE I SAID WORKING WITH THE STREAMLINING OF ORDINANCES AND THINGS LIKE THAT. WE WANTED TO MAKE SURE YOU WERE AWARE OF THE PUBLIC COMMENTS. WHAT THEY WERE.

WE SUPPORTED THE CHAMBER WITH THE MAIN STREET SPONSORSHIP SO THAT SHOULD BE WHAT WE TALK ABOUT SUPPORTING SMALL BUSINESS DOWNTOWN.

SO WE COULD CROSS THIS OFFER NOW IF COUNCIL IS TO COME BACK TO LOOK YOU CAN DO THAT IF YOU DON'T FEEL THE REST OF THE GOALS SUPPORT THIS.

CAN WE VOTE YES FOR THE IDEA? DOES THAT OBLIGATE YOU TO TASK?

WE WOULD BRING BACK THE TASK'S WE DO HAVE THE BUSINESS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, THE MAIN STREET PROGRAM FOR BENCHES.

MORE OF A PHILOSOPHICAL DISCUSSION.

OKAY ALL RIGHT. MOVING ON NUMBER SIX TRAFFIC PARKING AND STREET CONFIGURATION CONCERNS. ANYONE HAVE ANY COMMENTS ON THAT?

THIS ONE ALSO WE ALREADY HAVE A ROADS PROGRAM WE HAVE BEEN WORKING ON AND WE WILL CONTINUE TO WORK BECAUSE WE HAVE AGREED TO USE MEASURE NEW FUNDS FOR THIS. I ALSO PROPOSED A TRAFFIC AD HOC COMMITTEE SO THOSE ARE PROJECTS PROPOSED AS OPPOSED TO THIS BIGGER CATEGORY. I JUST DON'T KNOW WHAT TO DO WITH THAT.

I THINK LOOKING AT SOME OF THE ACTUAL FEEDBACK PEOPLE WERE ASKING LET'S SEE FOR CROSSWALKS, AND THEN ENFORCEMENT OF SPEEDING AND THAT TYPE OF STUFF SO I DON'T KNOW IF THAT FALLS UNDER THAT BUT THAT COULD BE PART OF THE DISCUSSION, GO AHEAD.

IT WAS PRESENTED BY THE CONSULTANT WHEN WE TALK AWAY ONE WAY VERSUS TWO-WAY STREETS. A STATE LAW REQUIRES RED CURBING AT CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS THAT WAS KIND OF ADDRESSED IN THAT BUT SINCE THAT IS SO FAR OUT MY QUESTION IS WHAT ARE WE DOING ABOUT THAT STATE LAW AND THE RED CURBING SO WE ARE IN COMPLIANCE WHICH REALLY GOES TO THIS GOAL WHICH INCLUDES PARKING BECAUSE WE WILL LOSE PARKING WHEN WE CURB STATE LAW SLOTS SO IS THAT ON THE LISTED THIS YEAR?

DO WE HAVE THE POLICE CHIEF?

WE DON'T BUT PUBLIC WORKS COULD ADDRESS THAT.

IT GOES TO SAFETY AS YOU ARE PULLING OUT THE RED CURB YOU CANNOT SEE.

THAT'S WHY STATE LAW HAS COME IN AND GOING ON TO THIS, THIS COULD FALL UNDER SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION AND PDA THE PRIORITY DEVELOPMENT AREA WHICH WE ARE CURRENTLY DOING BECAUSE THAT ADDRESSES YOU KNOW THE DOWNTOWN PORTION.

TO FOLLOW UP WITH COUNCILMEMBER HINTON. STATE LAW HAS BEEN MENTIONED SO WHAT RISK ARE WE, WHERE ARE WE WITH RISK IF WE DON'T HAVE ANYTHING IDENTIFIED TO MOVE TOWARD WHATEVER THE STATE LAW REQUIREMENT IS ON THE ISSUE? HAVE TO DO A LITTLE RESEARCH ON THE TIMELINE AND I CAN GET BACK TO YOU. I BELIEVE WORKS HAS INFORMATION AS FAR AS STREET PARKING. WHERE IN COMPLAINTS PUBLIC WORKS STAFF PAINTED THE CURBS AT THE END OF LAST YEAR.

I REMEMBER THEM AT THE POST OFFICE AS IT CHANGED THE WHOLE PARKING OPTIONS. OKAY SO WITH THIS, LOOKING UNDER HERE WHERE IT WAS KIND OF CONDENSED AND WHAT PEOPLE WERE ASKING THOSE WERE THINGS PEOPLE WERE ASKING FOR WHEN IT CAME TO TRAFFIC SO DOES ANYONE HAVE ANYTHING SPECIFIC? OTHERWISE GO AHEAD. ACTUALLY WHEN I WAS GETTING EMAILS AND I WAS MAYOR ABOUT THE SLOWDOWN SIGNS I MIGHT HAVE SENT YOU SOME OF THOSE TOO. WHILE WE ARE WAITING FOR THE SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION GRANT AND ALL THE MEDICAL MONEY THAT IS SUPPOSED TO COME FROM THAT COULD WE NOT EXPLORE LIKE PERIODICALLY PUTTING UP SLOWDOWN FLASHING THINGS I CAN REMEMBER THE TERMINOLOGY, BUT THE SIGNS WE COULD PUT UP.

THE SLOWDOWN SEBASTOPOL CAT.

THAT OR THE ONE BY BURBANK THAT FLASHES WITH SPEED?

MORE LIKE WHEN I GOT SOME EMAIL FROM SOMEONE WHO'S PET WAS INJURED YOU SAID MAYBE YOU WOULD LOOK INTO IT.

WE TALKED TO THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH THE SLOWDOWN CAT AND IT WAS RECOMMENDED NOT TO PUT IT ON MAIN STREET IN THE AREA. BUT YES WE HAVE SLOWDOWN SEBASTOPOL, THE CAT OR THE RADAR SIGNS TO SLOW DOWN SO WE CAN PUT THE RADAR OUT MORE OFTEN MORE FREQUENTLY.

I AM INTERESTED TO FIGURE OUT THE PRICING TO PERIODICALLY PUT IT UP AS A REMINDER THIS IS NOT THE INDY 500 FREEWAY.

RELATED TO THAT, I THINK THERE IS DIFFERENT LIGHT FLASHING AND I FIND IT WHEN YOU'RE DRIVING IN THE MIDDLE OF WHEN IT IS STILL DARK WHEN IT IS THE POLICE THE RED WHITE AND BLUE FLASHING I HAVE ALWAYS THOUGHT MAYBE THAT WAS AN ACCIDENT AND IT IS ONE OF THE FLASHING LIGHT VERSIONS AND WE NEVER USED IT BEFORE BUT I RECENTLY SAW WITHIN THE LAST FEW MONTHS IS GOING DOWN PETALUMA AVENUE I FREQUENTLY GO TO WORK AT 5:30 IN THE MORNING AND IT GIVE YOU IS THERE AN ACCIDENT AND THAT SEEMS LIKE NOT THE RIGHT MESSAGE SO I WANT TO TALK ABOUT THE LIGHT FLASHING BECAUSE THERE IS A DIFFERENCE. I DON'T KNOW IF YOUR POLICY OR POLICE HAVE BEEN DECIDING WHICH LIGHTS TO USE AND I THINK THAT WILL SEND THE WRONG MESSAGE. THIS IS EMERGENCY VEHICLES AND IT IS NOT. WE DO NOT HAVE A POLICY BUT I WAS NOT AWARE. LIEUTENANT CAN YOU ADDRESS THAT PLEASE?

REFERRING TO THE RADAR TRADER THERE IS THE RED AND BLUE FLASHING LIGHTS GOING ABOVE THE SPEED LIMIT. SO THAT IS CONCERN. LOOKS LIKE IT IS MORE THAN IT IS I DON'T KNOW IF THAT IS A SETTING ON THE TRAILER TO BE ADJUSTED WE CAN LOOK INTO THAT TO SEE.

DOES IT ON A FLASH WHEN YOU'RE GOING OVER THE SPEED LIMIT?

WHEN YOU EXCEED THE SPEED IT IS SET TO. SO MORE STREET 25 MILES PER HOUR IF YOU EXCEED THAT I DON'T KNOW IF THERE'S A WINDOW IN THERE. WHEN YOU GO ABOVE THAT'S WHEN THE LIGHTS FLASH AT YOU. IT HAS YOUR SPEED TO TELL YOU HOW FAST YOU ARE GOING.

GO AHEAD.

1 MILE OVER FLASHES AND I THINK IT'S NOT WITH THE PREVIOUS FLASHERS WE HAVE HAD IN TOWN DO. SO I DON'T KNOW IF WE CAN TALK ABOUT IT TONIGHT BUT I'D PREFER TO SET AT FLASHING SLOWDOWN BUT IT MAKES IT LOOK LIKE IT IS AN EMERGENCY VEHICLE. WHEN YOU'RE COMING OVER THE HILL ALL OF A SUDDEN 126 IT'S LIKE WHAT'S HAPPENING UP AHEAD?

WE CAN LOOK INTO IT AND SEE IF THERE'S TOLERANCE IT DOES NOT FLUSH UNTIL FIVE OVER.

OR A DIFFERENT COLOR NOT EMERGENCY VEHICLE COLOR. I THINK IT SENDS THE WRONG MESSAGE.

I SUPPORT THAT AND I WANT TO GENERALLY SUPPORT THE ITEM EVEN THOUGH WE HAVE TWO OTHERS THAT SEEM TO COORDINATE.

I WANTED TO ADD TO THIS A COUPLE YEARS AGO ON MY STREET WE HAD THIS BIG INITIATIVE TO SLOW PEOPLE DOWN BECAUSE EVERYONE CUTS THROUGH AND DRIVES FAST. THE POLICE OFFICER WHO CAME AND SPENT A COUPLE HOURS TALKING ABOUT OPTIONS WAS ONE OF THOSE WITH THE FLASHING LIGHT IN FRONT OF BURBANK BUT THEY TOLD US TO PONY UP THE MONEY THAT THE CITY DOES NOT PAY FOR THAT SO I DON'T KNOW. JUST PUTTING IT OUT I DON'T RECALL THE COST AT THE TIME. WE WANT TO DRAW STRAWS TO SEE WHO'S HOUSE IT SAT IN FRONT OF OR WHOSE YARD IT WAS IN SO WE DECLINED THE OPTION. I KNOW THAT IS A OPTION. JUST FOR PEOPLE WONDERING IN THE PUBLIC WE SPENT A GREAT DEAL OF TIME ON THAT ONE OF MY NEIGHBORS GO AHEAD.

TAKE A STRAW VOTE ON ALLOCATING STAFF RESOURCES ENOUGH TO BRING BACK WHAT ARE OPTIONS FOR THE DIFFERENT SLOWDOWN THINGS WE HAVE GOING ON IN THE CITY TO GET AN IDEA BECAUSE I DON'T KNOW PEOPLE EMAIL WHAT ARE YOU DOING? I DON'T EVEN KNOW WHAT TO SAY.

I WOULD RECOMMEND MOVING OUT OF COMMUNITY VITALITY PUTTING IT IN PUBLIC SAFETY AND THEN WE WOULD HAVE DIRECTION TO REVIEW THE OPTIONS. SO MOVING TO WHAT I STATED TO PUBLIC SAFETY, IS THERE SUPPORT? COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

VICE MAYOR MAURER?

YES CAN YOU REPEAT?

TO MOVE TRAFFIC PARKING STREET CONFIGURATION CONCERNS TO PUBLIC SAFETY WITH DIRECTION TO REVIEW THE OPTIONS FOR THE RADAR SIGNS FOR SLOWING DOWN TRAFFIC. MAYOR McLEWIS  
YES.

THE ITEM IS UNANIMOUS.

THANK YOU SO MUCH. LET'S MOVE ON IN THE INTEREST OF TIME WE ARE AT ONE HOUR AND WE ONLY MADE IT TO NUMBER SEVEN.

THIS IS IN FOR SUCH REPAIRS PLENTY OF ROADS AND SIDEWALKS THIS IS AGAIN COULD BE MOVED TO THE ROAD SECTION FOR INFRASTRUCTURE OR PUBLIC SAFETY AS FAR AS SIDEWALK YOU KNOW COULD BE PEDESTRIAN ENFORCEMENT PEOPLE USING THE SIDEWALKS. SO

COULDN'T SIDEWALKS BE ABOUT CLEANING SIDEWALKS TAKING CARE OF THE GENERAL PREPARE FOR VITALITY DOWNTOWN IS THAT WHY IT ENDED UP THERE?

IT WAS MORE ABOUT SAFETY BUT WE COULD CHANGE IT. INCLUDE FOR DOWNTOWN CLEANLINESS TO INCLUDE CLEANING THE SIDEWALK.

THAT'S QUITE ASSUMED. THAT IS PART OF PUBLIC WORKS I BELIEVE. THEY ARE DOING THAT ALREADY.

CORRECT. I WOULD RECOMMEND SINCE RESTRICTOR REPAIR IS WITHIN INFRASTRUCTURE ALREADY ONE OF THE TASKS IS TO REMOVE THIS AND INCLUDE CLEANING SIDEWALKS AS PART OF THE NORMAL ROUTINE.

THAT WOULD BE THE DAILY VALUES INC. INC.

YES THE DAY TODAY VALUES.

CONCERN FOR TIME AND PROCESS. WE ARE GETTING TO LOT THAT HAVE A LOT OF OTHER STUFF GOING IT SEEMS LIKE WE'RE GETTING INTO REDUNDANCY PRETTY HARD. WONDERING IF WE CAN AVOID THAT AND KEEP GOING WITH MORE SPECIFIC ONES BECAUSE THESE SEEM LIKE NORMAL TASKS.

TRYING TO ENTER THEM SO DOWNTOWN CLEANLINESS SAFETY AND HOMELESSNESS THAT WAS SOMETHING THAT CAME UP IN THE PUBLIC. ANYONE HAVE COMMENTS OR THOUGHTS?

THIS IS WHERE THE HEART PROGRAM POLICE PATROLS QUITE A FEW DIFFERENT THINGS IN HERE TO INCREASE THE DOWNTOWN CLEANLINESS AND SAFETY POLICE PATROLS DOWNTOWN WITH PERSONNEL AND A DISCUSSION ABOUT DOING FLOWER BASKETS FOR THE DOWNTOWN WORKING WITH THE CHAMBER THE INSTALLATION OF THE GARBAGE

TAKING OUT THE OLD AND THE NEW GARBAGE CANS THAT IS WITH THE GOAL WHEN INCORPORATE.

THAT IS A MOUTHFUL.

WE NEED TO PARSE THIS OUT AND BE EFFICIENT AT THE SAME TIME. LET'S SEE. GARBAGE CANS IS ONE.

GARBAGE CANS, WORKING WITH THE CHAMBER ON BEAUTIFYING DOWNTOWN.

SO WE ARE VOTING ON THE PERSONNEL? THAT IS TYPICALLY A BUDGET.

I WANT TO BRING UP I DID A FAIR AMOUNT OF WORK WITH THE TRIBES DO WE KNOW IF WE COULD GET THIS FUNDED BY ONE OF THE LOCAL TRIBES IT IS \$2000 AND I THINK THEY HAVE THE MONEY. IF WE WERE TO ASK THEM. I WANT TO THROW IT OUT THERE. I AM IN FAVOR.

THAT IS 5-0. NEXT ONE IS THE FESTIVE ACTIVITIES AND HOLIDAY EVENTS SO LAST YEAR WE DID A LOT OF ACTIVITY FOR HALLOWEEN AND CHRISTMAS DECORATION. THINGS LIKE THAT, WE WOULD LIKE TO CONTINUE THAT AND ONE OF THE THINGS WE WOULD BE WORKING WITH HIS PUBLIC WORKS WORKING ON LOOKING AT HOW MUCH IT WOULD COST TO INSTALL ELECTRICITY IN THE LIGHTS DOWNTOWN RATHER THAN HAVING SOLAR

CAN I COMMENT ON THAT

THIS HAS BEEN A ONGOING ISSUE FOR YEARS BACK IN 2018 AND 2017 THAT WAS AN ISSUE THEN AND WE TRIED SOLAR AND THIS PAST WINTER WE HAD SOLAR AND THEN THEY WERE NOT WORKING BECAUSE IT WAS SO DARK SOME DAYS THINGS WERE NOT LIGHTING UP AND SOME BUSINESSES WERE UPSET BECAUSE SOME HAD LIGHT, SOME DID NOT AND IT WAS ALL SURROUNDING THE LACK OF ELECTRICITY. SO I WHOLEHEARTEDLY SUPPORT EXPLORING THIS BECAUSE OF THE LAST EIGHT YEARS LISTENING TO ALL THE CHALLENGES WITH THAT. I REMEMBER DANTE WOULD GET ON ME YOU KNOW WE DON'T HAVE POWER SO I WANTED TO SAY THAT LISTENING TO THE BUSINESS THIS PAST WINTER AND CHALLENGES WITH THAT IT MEANT A LOT TO THEM I WAS SURPRISED HOW UPSET PEOPLE WERE. SO I AM SUPPORTIVE BECAUSE OF THAT.

OKAY GO AHEAD.

SORRY.

TO FOLLOW UP IT WOULD BE PUBLIC WORKS EXPLORING ELECTRICITY OUTSIDE ELECTRICAL OUTLETS SO THEY HAVE THE WHOLE OUTSIDE.

WHAT IT WOULD BE IN OUR OUR LIGHTS DOWNTOWN AND CITY LIGHTS IS TO PUT IN ELECTRICAL IN THE TOP OF THE LIGHTS SO IT'S NOT JUST FOR BUSINESSES IT IS TO HAVE THE TREES TO HAVE THEM LIT BECAUSE WE TRIED TO HAVE THEM LAST TIME AND IT DID NOT WORK VERY WELL. NOW IF WE HAD THAT HOLIDAY DECORATIONS ON THE POLLS AS WELL.

VICE MAYOR MAURER YES

MAYOR McLEWIS YES.

THAT IS 5-0. NEXT WAS A REQUEST FROM THE PUBLIC ARTS COMMITTEE, THEY WOULD LIKE TO RETURN TO MONTHLY MEETINGS RIGHT NOW THEY ARE EVERY OTHER MONTH I BELIEVE. AND THEY DO NOT FEEL LIKE THAT IS WORKING TO GET SOME OF THE PROJECTS DONE SCULPTURE CALL FOR THE MURAL.

DIDN'T WE CHANGE THAT DUE TO THE BUDGET?

WE DID CHANGE THAT DUE TO THE BUDGET. WE WERE USING THE PLANNING DIRECTOR AT THE TIME, WE HAVE NEW PLANNING STAFF SO THE PLANNING TECH PERSON COULD DO IT DURING THE DAY IT WOULD NOT BE OVERTIME WE COULD LIMIT IT THE SECOND MEETING WOULD BE LIKE THE WORK PLAN SO THE FIRST MEETING WOULD BE PUBLIC ART SECOND WOULD BE THE WORK PLAN MY UNDERSTANDING BASED ON A CONVERSATION WITH THEM IT WOULD BE LIMITED STAFF. SIMILAR TO THE CLIMATE ACTION COMMITTEE.

CAN I ASK HOW LONG MEETINGS ARE?

USUALLY ONE HOUR, 1 1/2 HOURS. THEY ARE EXPLICIT. MAYBE TWO HOURS AT THE MOST BUT THEY DON'T GO BEYOND THAT.

THINKING FROM THE STAFF PERSPECTIVE DOESN'T IT MAKE MORE SENSE TO LENGTHEN THE MEETING SO THEY CAN GET MORE WORK DONE THEN TO ADD NEW MEETINGS? JUST TO MAKE SENSE FOR ORGANIZING?

DEPENDING ON WHAT TIME MEETINGS ARE SCHEDULED IT COULD RUN INTO OVERTIME IF THEY GO AFTER HOURS.

BECAUSE OF THE TIME IT IS SCHEDULED? I DON'T UNDERSTAND WHY WE NEED TO DO OR INCREASE FREQUENCY IF WE ADDED A HALF HOUR GO AHEAD.

LIKE TO INCREASE THEIR HOURS AND LET IT BE FLEXIBLE SO THEY COULD ADD TO THIS OR HAVE ANOTHER BECAUSE SOMETIMES SOMETHING JEFF TO COME BACK WITH IN A MONTH IT WILL BE FORGOTTEN OR AT LEAST THAT'S ME. NEXT MONTH YOU KNOW I FEEL LIKE THAT IS REASONABLE. IF WE CAP HOURS IS KIND OF NICE BUT I WOULD BE FOR LIMITED INCREASE.

I'M SORRY GO HAVE.

I WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE WORK PLAN. I DON'T THINK I HAVE EVER SEEN A WORKPLAN. I DON'T THINK I HAVE SEEN A GOAL I AM NO FOR ALL OF THIS UNTIL THEY DECIDE TO AGENDA IS SOMETHING TO LET US KNOW WHAT IS THE PLAN, WHAT ARE THEY DOING AND BY WHEN?

I WILL TELL YOU THIS IS THE FIRST YEAR THEY HAVE DONE IT. I INSTITUTED IT FOR THE PLANNING COMMISSION WHO ALREADY DOES THERE'S BUT WE'RE DOING ONE FOR DESIGN REVIEW CLIMATE ACTION AND PUBLIC ARTS COMMITTEE SO THEY WILL BE COMING TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR REVIEW OF THE WORK PLANS, THEY'RE WORKING ON THAT NOW SO THIS IS THE FIRST YEAR THESE COMMITTEES OTHER THAN PLANNING COMMISSION HAS DONE A WORKPLAN.

I WILL SAY NO UNTIL I SEE THE WORKPLAN.

I WOULD LIKE TO SUPPORT THE REQUEST. THEY USE TO MEET HERE AT THE YOUTH ANNEX AND THEY HAVE MOVED TO CITY HALL SO I KNOW THAT SAVED SOME COST THERE. THEY KNOW BEST IN TERMS OF FREQUENCY OF THEIR MEETINGS SO I WOULD LIKE TO SUPPORT THE REQUEST AND IF THEY NEED TO CANCEL THEY CAN JUST CANCEL BUT THAT DOES NOT MEAN YOU HAVE TO MEET EVERY MONTH IF NOT NECESSARY BUT IT SEEMS TO ME THEY WERE MEETING FOUR TIMES PER YEAR?

I BELIEVE IT USED TO BE QUARTERLY.

TO ME THAT'S NOT ENOUGH.

SO WE COULD BRING THIS BACK WHEN THEY HAVE WORK PLANS DONE.

I AM NO UNTIL WE HAVE A BETTER IDEA. IN THE INCHES OF TIME TURN TO GO TOOK SPIDER THIS. WE HAVE ONE NO VOTE IS NOT UNANIMOUS SO WE NEED TO START MOVING QUICKLY THROUGH THIS OTHERWISE WE WILL BE HERE UNTIL MIDNIGHT.

A QUICK VOTE. COUNCIL MEMBER CARTER?

NO.

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON NO COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN NO VICE MAYOR MAURER YES MAYOR McLEWIS NO.

I WANT TO SHOW YOU ON THE PAGE THERE ARE ITEMS WE TOOK OUT OF THE GOALS FROM LAST YEAR AND THEIR PART OF THE DAILY VALUES WE ARE DOING SO SUPPORTING COMMUNITY EVENT THROUGH SPONSORSHIPS IS A COMING FOR THE CITY COUNCIL WE ARE BRINGING IN POLICY ON THAT, CONTINUE CLEANUP AND GRAFFITI AND CLEANING OF SIDEWALKS AND WETLAND ACKNOWLEDGMENT SO SOME OF THOSE GOALS FROM LAST YEAR ARE THE TASK WE PULLED OUT AS DAILY. SECOND IS PUBLIC SAFETY THIS IS WHERE ONE OF THE ITEMS CAME OUT AS THE TRAFFIC FOR THE TRAIL CORRIDOR SAFETY FROM COUNCILMEMBER CARTER I BELIEVE.

YES I GUESS THIS IS MY OPPORTUNITY TO PITCH IT. THE CORRIDOR TRAIL SAFETY NEEDS TO BE A LOT BETTER BECAUSE MY KIDS USE IT AND IT FEELS UNSAFE AS PART OF US AND IT HAS SOMETHING COME I DON'T WANT TO SPECULATE TOO MUCH I THINK IT IS INCREDIBLY IMPORTANT FOR ACTIVE TRANSPORTATION NEAR SEBASTOPOL.

GO AHEAD.

HOW MUCH OF THE TRAIL IS OURS VERSUS THE COUNTY?

I WOULD BE TALKING ABOUT THE CITY.

USUALLY THE POLICE OFFICERS KNOW.

LIEUTENANT YOU HAVE OTHER INFORMATION WHEN UNDERSTANDING IS THE COUNTY RIGHT AWAY. MOST OF BLACKBERRY ALONG THE TRAIL IS COUNTY MAINTAINED WITH SOME SPACE OUTSIDE WE COULD LOOK TO MAINTAIN. WE HAVE THE AREA AROUND THE TRAIL LOOKING AT LINE OF SIGHT.

THAT'S NOT WHAT WAS EXPLAINED TO ME IN THE PAST. I WANT TO CLARIFY I WAS TOLD VEGETATION ON ONE SIDE CLOSEST TO THE CITY AT LEAST IN PART OF THE AREA IS OURS. I WANT TO MAKE SURE BECAUSE I HAVE HEARD DIFFERENT.

AS FAR AS VEGETATION AND MAINTENANCE THAT IS NOT MY PURVIEW THE AREA WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS THAT WE ENFORCE GOES WHEN YOU AT THE TRAIL

BEHIND THE HOTEL IT GOES DOWN TO THE LONGEST BRIDGE, THE SECOND BRIDGE THE LONG WOODEN BRIDGE SO AS FAR AS THE COUNTY RIGHT AWAY VEGETATION IT'S A DIFFERENT ISSUE FROM THEIR PERSPECTIVE.

SO WHAT WAS EXPLAINED TO ME BY DANTE AND OTHER FOLKS WAS THE SPACE ON THE SIDE WHERE THE TRUCKING COMPANY YOU KNOW BEHIND THE FEED STORE AND ALL OF THAT, THE WHOLE AREA. THEY SAY THAT IS ALL OF OURS ALL THE WAY TO THE TRAIL. THAT IS ABSOLUTELY OURS. THE AREA ALONG THE TRAIL AS YOU LOOK AT LINE OF SIGHT WERE BLACKBERRY AGAINST THE TRAIL IT IS A CORRIDOR ALONG THE TRAIL SO THAT PROPERTY IS.

I WANT TO BE CLEAR THAT IS AN AREA THAT UNTIL THE LAST YEAR WAS REALLY NEGLECTED FOR A LONG TIME AND IT IS A DUMPING GROUND.

IT IS A PRIORITY TO MAINTAIN THOSE AREAS.

GOT IT. SO I DON'T WALK BECAUSE I DON'T FEEL SAFE.

THINGS ARE ORGANIZED WITH VOLUNTEERS TO CLEAN UP THE AREA. AND, I ALSO HAVE AN AGENDA ITEM ABOUT THE CARE OF THE WETLANDS AND I'M NOT SURE IF THAT IS WITHIN THE WETLANDS BUT MAYBE THE TWO MAYBE THERE COULD BE SOME KIND OF PLAN.

I'M GOING TO PUT MY OWN THING IN THERE. IT REQUIRES EARTHMOVING EQUIPMENT. I HAVE SEEN IT BACK THERE BEFORE AND PUBLIC WORKS WAS THERE LAST YEAR WITH THEM TRYING TO CLEAN OF VEGETATION AND FURNITURE.

IT FEEDS TO THE LAGUNA'S IT IS PART OF THE LAGUNA. MEETING WITH FOLKS FROM THE FOUNDATION TOMORROW TO WALK THE AREA TO WALK ALONG OTHER THINGS TO TALK ABOUT WHAT WE COULD DO IN TERMS OF MAINTENANCE I KNOW THERE ARE GRAZING OPTIONS WE CAN DO POTENTIALLY TO KEEP THEM OUT OF THE WATERWAY THEY ARE EFFECTIVE AT THINGS LIKE BLACKBERRIES SO I WILL HAVE MORE INFORMATION ON THAT SHORTLY. WE ARE LOOKING AT WAYS TO MAINTAIN THE AREA AND BE COMPLIANT.

A PIECE OF INFORMATION. I HAD SOMEONE EMAIL ME SEVERAL MONTHS AGO SHE IS PART OF THE PROGRAM WITH THE GRAZING AND SHE LIVES IN DOWNTOWN SEBASTOPOL. I CAN REFER HER TO YOU BECAUSE SHE HAS VOLUNTEERED TO HELP.

I WANTED TO UNDERSTAND HOW THAT WOULD WORK LOGISTICALLY WITH THE FOUNDATION AND OBLIGATIONS AROUND THE WETLAND SPACE AND PRICING.

I WILL FORWARD THE INFORMATION TO YOU AND YOU CAN TAKE IT FROM THERE. WHO ELSE HAD A COMMENT? ARE WE SUPPORTIVE?

COUNCIL MEMBER CARTER YES.

MEMBER HE YES.

COUNCILMEMBER? VICE MAYOR.

BUDGET DEPENDENT.

OKAY THAT IS 5-0. NEXT IS SIMILAR TO THE ONE WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT. INCREASING FOOT PATROL DOWNTOWN BASICALLY TO FOCUS ON KEEPING DRUGS OUT OF TOWN. YOU WERE ALL SUPPORTIVE ON THE LAST ONE.

I WAS SAYING WE ARE AT 22 AND WE HAVE A LOT OF GOALS. WE ARE NOT GOING TO MAKE IT. JUST CURIOUS. MOVING FASTER?

MOVING AS FAST AS PEOPLE HAVE COMMENTS.

WE ARE GOING TO RUN OUT OF TIME.

GO AHEAD.

MICROPHONE IS NOT ON.

FOOT PATROL I DON'T KNOW WHAT THAT MEANS BECAUSE IS IT SOLELY RELATED TO HOMELESS ISSUES AND INTOXICATION AND DRUG USE? IF SO WE HAVE HEART AND WE HAVE LESS COUNTY SERVICES. IF THAT'S WHERE THAT'S GOING THEN YES I AM INTERESTED IN HAVING STAFF TIME SORT THAT OUT BECAUSE I AM THE HOMELESS LIAISON TO THE COUNTY PROGRAMS AND WHILE THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS HAS SAID THE PROGRAM WILL BE CONTINUED I STILL DON'T KNOW HOW THAT MATCHES UP WITH WHAT WE ARE PAYING WEST COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICES. I DON'T KNOW IF THEY'RE LOOKING EFFORTS OR IF ONE IS DIFFERENT FROM THE OTHER BUT I WOULD LIKE TIME AND A STAFF REPORT TO FLUSH THIS OUT BECAUSE I AM IN THE MIDDLE OF IT AND I AM NOT CLEAR.

PERSONALLY I AM SUPPORTIVE OF MORE FOOT PATROL SO WE CAN MOVE ON. GO AHEAD. SORRY I THOUGHT YOU WERE DOING THUMBS UP.

I GENERALLY AGREE.

YES THAT COMES BACK FOR THE BUDGET, THE CONVERSATION INFORMATION FOR HOMELESSNESS. THIS IS ALSO MORE ABOUT WE HAVE HAD COMPLAINS ABOUT THEFT, COMPLAINS ABOUT GRAFFITI, SO ONE OF THE OPTIONS IS COMMUNITY POLICING TO HAVE THEM IN THE COMMUNITY NOT SPECIFICALLY JUST HOMELESSNESS, BUT LOOKING AROUND THE PLAZA BEING IN THE COMMUNITY MEETING WITH HIS MRS. THINGS LIKE THAT.

I AM SUPPORTIVE BECAUSE THE POLICE CHIEF WAS SUPPOSED TO COME BACK IN APRIL. THIS IS APRIL TALKING ABOUT THE CITIZEN PROGRAM, INCREASING COMMUNITY POLICING AND I HAVE NOT SEEN ANYTHING. INCREASING FOOT PATROL IF IT IS RELATED TO THE CITIZEN PROGRAM ACADEMY COMMUNITY POLICING I AM YES IF NOT I AM NO. THE ITEM IS COMING BACK. IT HAS BEEN ON THE AGENDA.

IT KEEPS GETTING PUSHED.

FOR THIS INCREASING FOOT PATROL?

IT IS NOT SOMETHING WE'RE DOING. IT KEEPS GETTING PUSHED BECAUSE IT IS NOT FINISHED.

INCREASING FOOT PATROL COUNCILMEMBER CARTER? YES COUNCILMEMBER HINTON I'M NOT SURE ABOUT INCREASING I WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE PLAN IF IT COMES BACK I WILL SAY YES TO COMING BACK.

COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN

SIMILAR TO COUNCILMEMBER HINTON I'M INTERESTED IN SEEING A PLAN TO ADDRESS ALL OF IT I'M NOT INTERESTED IN RECEIVING SOMETHING THAT'S LIKE INCREASE MY BUDGET BECAUSE I WANT TO SEE MORE OFFICERS WALK UP AND DOWN MAIN STREET. GO AHEAD.

QUICK QUESTION ABOUT GENERALITIES AND SPECIFICS. KEEPING GENERAL COMING BACK WITH THINGS THAT ADDRESS A LOT OF SPECIFIC CONCERNS?

IF WE SAY YES TO THE TASK OF INCREASING FOOT PATROL FOR HOMELESSNESS AND COMMUNITY POLICING THE COUNCIL IS IN SUPPORT WE WILL AS A TASK BRING BACK REQUEST LIKE I SAID COMMUNITY SERVICE VOLUNTEER PROGRAM WHERE WE ARE WITH THAT. AS PART OF THE BUDGET WE HAVE SEPARATE ITEMS FOR CONTRACTS FOR HOMELESSNESS SERVICES. I WOULD NOT GET TOO SPECIFIC BUT I DO BELIEVE KEEPING THIS AS A PRIORITY IS GOOD AND WE CAN BRING BACK RECOMMENDED ACTION BY THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WHEN THEY BRING THE REPORT BACK. HAVING SAID THAT COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

VICE MAYOR MAURER

YES

MAYOR McLEWIS

YES. I WANT TO POINT OUT THIS CAN MERGE WITH NUMBER FIVE AND NUMBER THREE UNDER PUBLIC INPUT.

YES THAT IS CORRECT AND THESE ARE NOT BEING APPROVED TONIGHT. WE WILL BE BRINGING THESE BACK BUT THESE ARE PRIORITIES COMING BACK. SPECIFIC TASKS WILL BE COMING BACK. I WANT TO MAKE THAT CLEAR. YES NUMBER THREE AND NUMBER FIVE WOULD BE THE SAME SO WE HAD FIVE. TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT AND SPEED CONTROL WE TALKED ABOUT HAVING STAFF COME BACK WITH THE RADAR SIGN FOR ONE AND ALSO WAYS OF INCREASING VISIBILITY AND TRAFFIC ENFORCEMENT IN THE CITY.

YES.

VICE MAYOR MAURER AND MAYOR McLEWIS THERE WE GO. FOR PUBLIC SAFETY THIS IS COMMENTS FOR THE PUBLIC ABOUT SATISFACTION WITH CURRENT SERVICES. THIS IS NOT A TASK OR ANYTHING LIKE THAT.

WE CANNOT VOTE ON THAT?

NO JOKES.

SO THE NEXT ONE IS PRIORITIZE PUBLIC SAFETY THROUGH PROGRAMS AND INITIATIVES FOR THE COUNCIL PREPARE FOR MAJOR DISASTERS. THIS IS FINALIZING EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN. CONDUCTING TRAINING FOR CITY COUNCIL AND CITY STAFF AND ESPECIALLY FOR STAFF REPORTING TO THE EEOC RELATIVE TO THE ITEM 12 BELOW REGARDING COUNTY FREE TRAININGS. I WOULD RECOMMEND KEEPING THIS AS A PRIORITY SO WE CAN FINALIZE THE ACTION PLAN. COUNCILMEMBER CARTER YES COUNCILMEMBER HINTON YES COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN YES VICE MAYOR MAURER YES MAYOR McLEWIS YES. OKAY THE NEXT ONE IS THE ONE WE JUST DISCUSSED. WHERE WE ARE ON THE VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS SO THIS IS SIMILAR TO THE ITEM THE ITEMS ABOVE SO WE HAD FIVE ON THAT SO WE DON'T NEED TO GO BACK THROUGH. SHOW THAT AS A FIVE. THE NEXT ONE WAS EXPLORING EVALUATING INDUSTRY BEST PRACTICE AND PUBLIC SAFETY DELIVERING MODELS IDENTIFYING POTENTIAL OPPORTUNITIES TO ADOPT AND EXPAND CAPACITY PUTTING FOCUSING ON STAFFING STRATEGIES, LIMITING RELIANCE ON OVERTIME. MS. IS A CONTINUED BASICALLY FOR RECRUITMENT PURPOSES AND BEEN DOING ACTIVE RECRUITMENT. I WOULD AGREE TO CARRY OVER ALL OF THESE IN THE INTEREST OF SAVING TIME RATHER THAN GOING ONE BY ONE SINCE THERE ARE ALREADY GOALS IF THERE'S SOMETHING SOMEBODY DOES NOT WANT TO HAVE HAPPEN MAYBE WE COULD PULL IT OUT.

I AGREE I WAS THINKING THE SAME THING.

OKAY I WILL GO AHEAD AND READ THE REMAINING ONES CARRIED OVER. EXPLAIN WAS TO ADDRESS HOMELESSNESS PURSUING AT NO ADDITIONAL COST OR LOW COST SOLUTIONS TO HOMELESSNESS CREATING ORDINANCE. WORKING WITH THE COUNTY ON RESOURCES AND THE SAFE PROGRAM. UPDATING FINALIZING EMERGENCY OPERATIONS WHICH WE JUST DISCUSSED, CONTINUING TO WORK WITH THE COUNTY ON COMMUNITY ORDINANCE RESPONSE TEAM COUNTY FREE OFFERINGS GETTING THE INFRASTRUCTURE FOR THE EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER DOWN AT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. WE HAVE DONE THE FEASIBILITY STUDY NOW WE COME BACK WITH THE BUDGET FOR THE GENERATOR ITSELF. THE COALITION OF THE HOUSING KEEPING THE COUNTY AGENCY REVIEW OF NONPROFIT OR CHANGING THE LEAD AGENCY WE DO HAVE COUNCILMEMBER ON THE COMMITTEE SO THESE ARE CONTINUATIONS IF THERE ARE ISSUES.

QUESTION ON THE SAFE PROGRAM CAN YOU DEFINE THE PROGRAM?

THERE HAS BEEN NO MOVEMENT ON THAT MOVING FORWARD. SO WE CONTINUE TO REVIEW BUT IT IS EXTREMELY EXPENSIVE.

I THOUGHT IT WAS MILLIONS OF DOLLARS.

IT IS SO WE CONTINUE TO REVIEW PROGRAMS BUT IT IS NOT RECOMMENDATION TO MOVE FORWARD WITH IT. I WILL SEE NO ISSUES SO I BELIEVE WE NEED TO GO INTO INFRASTRUCTURE.

OKAY. NUMBER THREE. FOR ANYONE FOLLOWING THE LONG.

DO YOU WANT ME TO READ THEM?

FIRST IS THE APPLE BLOSSOM TRAIL. FROM VICE MAYOR MAURER. <sup>Agenda Item Number 1</sup>  
YES THANK YOU. THIS TRAIL HAS A DEFINITE PLAN WHICH HIT A FEW ROADBLOCKS WITH RESISTANCE AT THE LUTHER BURBANK FARM WITH RESISTANCE AT THE BURBANK HOUSING AND WE HAVE RESOLVED THE PROPERTY WE HAVE RESOLVED AND GOTTEN BY FROM LAGUNA FARM FOLKS SO THEY AGREED AND THE WAY WE DID THAT IS THE PATH WOULD GO AROUND THE FARM SO THERE IS A ACCESS ROAD. INSTEAD OF GOING THROUGH THE FARM IT GOES AROUND AND THEY AGREED TO THE PLAN. AND THEN THE OWNERS OF THE CEMETERY, THE OWNERS OF THE CHURCH HAVE ALL AGREED THAT THE TRAIL COULD GO THROUGH THE PROPERTY. SO THAT I WAS THERE A COUPLE WEEKS AGO AND I AM LOOKING SO THE SENIORS AT THE BURBANK HOUSING A FEW OF THEM WERE OPPOSED, BUT WHEN I LOOKED AT IT SO THERE IS A ONE-WAY ROAD SO IT COMES IN A TWO-WAY ROAD AND WHERE THE ONE-WAY STARTS YOU COULD PUT A SMALL BIKE PATH AND IT ONLY GOES LIKE 30 FEET OR SOMETHING. AND I WOULD TAKE IT TO THE PARKING LOT WHICH WOULD TAKE YOU TO THE ACCESS ROAD. SO BICYCLES OR PEOPLE WALKING WOULD NOT GO AROUND THE WHOLE PROPERTY. THEY WOULD GO THROUGH ONTO THE BIKE PATH AND BACK THE SAME WAY. I HAVE NOT DISCUSSED THIS WITH THEM. I DO INTEND TO SEE IF I CAN GET THEM TO BUY IN ON THAT BECAUSE IF YOU ALLOW CARS TO GO TO THE FARM YOU SHOULD ALLOW BICYCLES. THEY ARE NOT LOSING PARKING, NOTHING LIKE THAT. SO I AM HOPING THEY WILL AGREE THAT WOULD BE A GOOD SOLUTION BECAUSE YOU ARE DIRECTING BICYCLES AND PEDESTRIANS RIGHT ALONG THE ROAD NOT GOING ALL AROUND THE PROPERTY. SO I AM WILLING, I AM WILLING TO MEET WITH THE BURBANK PEOPLE AGAIN TO SEE IF I CAN GET THEM TO BUY IN. OTHERWISE THERE WOULD BE NO RESISTANCE.

SO PART OF THE GOAL IS WE HAVE TO SPEND \$35,000 FOR A FEASIBILITY STUDY. IS THAT ALL OUR EXPENSE BECAUSE I UNDERSTAND DEVELOPING THE TRAIL IS GOING TO BE.

WE ARE NOT APPROVING A BUDGET. THAT WAS A ESTIMATE PROVIDED. IF THE COUNCIL WANTS TO REVIEW WHAT THIS WOULD BE TO BRING IT BACK FOR THE BUDGET THAT'S WHAT THE GOAL IS TONIGHT, NOT APPROVING THE STUDY JUST US TO BRING BACK BECAUSE WE NEED TO DETERMINE WHAT IT IS, IF IT IS 35.

35 REFERS TO THE DESKTOP STUDY.

I AM NOT DONE. I HAVE ANOTHER. BECAUSE THE BUDGET COMMITTEE FOLKS ARE BROWN ACTED ON THE ISSUE I WOULD ONLY FEEL COMFORTABLE SUPPORTING THIS IF THIS CAME BACK TO FULL COUNCIL BEFORE RECOMMENDATION WAS MADE BY THE BUDGET COMMITTEE SO WE COULD SEE WHAT IT IS GOING TO COST TO SUPPORT THE ITEM. NOT JUST HAVE IT GET IN THE BUDGET I WANT TO HAVE IT IN ADVANCE IN A SEPARATE AGENDA ITEM IF WE MOVE FORWARD ON THIS BECAUSE I HAVE HEARD AS REPRESENTATIVE WE GOT IT IN AND THEY CONTINUE TO SAY IT IS A ASPIRATIONAL GOAL SO I HAVE A LOT OF HESITATION THAT THE CITY WOULD PUT MONEY OUT FOR SOMETHING THAT COULD NOT BE ACCOMPLISHED AND I KNOW MAYBE THERE IS NO GUARANTEE BUT I DON'T WANT TO SPEND MONEY AND HAVE IT JUST BE AS A FORMER COUNCILMEMBER SET ANOTHER STUDY SITTING ON THE SHELF.

35,000 COMES FROM -- SHE HAD A PROPOSAL FOR THE DESKTOP THAT'S WHAT YOU RECOMMENDED AS A FIRST STEP SO THAT WAS THE QUOTE FROM THE PROPOSAL.

YEAH, KEEP IN MIND WE MAY TAKE THE PROJECT IN STEPS ANYWAY. I WOULD SUPPORT LOOKING AT IT.

SO THE COUNCIL COULD EITHER SUPPORT STAFF LOOKING TO BRING IT BACK TO YOU COULD TAKE IT OFF THE GOAL AND BRING IT BACK IS A SEPARATE AGENDA ITEM.

HAVE A QUESTION IF THIS IS GOING TO STAFF TO ASSESS THIS WHO IS ASSESSING THIS? IS THIS ONE OF THE CONSULTANTS WE PAY A LOT OF MONEY FOR, WHO IS IT? IS IT THE ENGINEER?

I WOULD HAVE TO ASK. OUR PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR WOULD BE DOING IT.

SO YOU ALREADY HAVE SOMETHING? SORRY IT'S PLAYING MUSIC OUT THERE

YEAH. TONY HAD GOTTEN PRICING TO LOOK AT THE FEASIBILITY OF THE APPLE BLOSSOM TRAIL LAST YEAR. TO LOOK AT WHERE THE PRIVATE PROPERTY

INTERSECTIONS ARE. WITH THE TRAFFIC FLOW IS AND IF IT IS A FEASIBLE ALIGNMENT TO MOVE FORWARD AND \$35,000 WAS THE PRICE LAST YEAR. THE FIRST STEP WOULD BE TO LOOK AT THAT IN LIGHT OF THE REALIGNMENT TO SEE IF ANYTHING NEEDS TO CHANGE FROM WHAT SHE ASKED THEM TO PRICE AND THEY GOT SOME NEW PRICING TO DO THE

FEASIBILITY. TO DO THE FIRST STEP. WE COULD BRING THAT TO THE COUNCIL FOR REVIEW.

HAVE THE SAME THOUGHT. IT WOULD NEED TO COME BACK TO US.

WHEN YOU SAY THAT MY MIND GOES BLAH, BLAH, BLAH. IT WAS NEVER BUDGETED. NEVER IN THE BUDGET, WE NEVER AGREED. WAS A PIE IN THE SKY WHAT IT COULD BE SO YOU GO TO W TRENDS AND SEE IF THAT'S THE COST AND THEN IT WOULD COME BACK FOR THE COUNCIL WE HAVE TO DECIDE IF WE WANT TO SPEND.

THAT'S CORRECT SHE ASKED FOR PROPOSAL OF WHAT THE COST WOULD BE SO I CAN REVISE PRICING AND BRING IT TO YOU FOR FURTHER EVALUATION.

I AM OKAY IF WE WANT TO CHANGE THE VOTE, BRINGING THIS BACK TO COUNCIL. INSTEAD OF HAVING IT BE A GOAL BUT THE GOAL WOULD BE TO BRING TO COUNCIL. THE GOAL WOULD BE TO BRING BACK AGENDA.

PUTTING IT ON THE GOAL LIST OR WE HAVE COUNCILMEMBERS AGREEING THAT WILL BRING BACK AN ITEM? THAT'S THE QUESTION I HAVE.

I'M SORRY GO AHEAD.

I SUPPORT THIS AS A GOAL. I HAVE HEARD COMMUNITY INPUT WITH A LOT OF CALLS AND EMAILS. I SUPPORT IT AS A GOAL BUT FOLLOWING THE THOUGHT BECAUSE THE BUDGET BROWN ACTED I WOULD PUT WHEREVER WE ARE DIRECTING STAFF TO DO TO BRING BACK TO US FOR CONSIDERATION MAKING SURE WE ARE NOT LOCKED INTO SOMETHING WE COULD PUSH OFF THE EXPENSE ONTO SOMEONE ELSE.

OKAY I AM OF THE SAME THOUGHT.

I AM IN FULL SUPPORT OF THE FULL COUNCIL KNOWING EVERYTHING ABOUT THIS YES. LEAVING IT AS A PRIORITY WITH A SEPARATE AGENDA ITEM COUNCILMEMBER CARTER YES

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON

YES FOR THE GOAL.

COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN

YES FOR THE GOAL

VICE MAYOR MAURER

YES

MAYOR McLEWIS

YES FOR THE GOAL COMING TO THE FULL COUNCIL.

NEXT ITEM IS THE TRAIL DEVELOPMENT.

OKAY WHAT I AM ASKING FOR IS ABOUT 10 HOURS OF TIME TO GET THIS SINCE MOST OF THE TRAIL I SEE THIS AS LARGELY PART OF THE STATE AND COUNTY. I WOULD LIKE TO GET IT INTO PARKS AND OPEN SPACE WITH THE COUNTY SO IT MUST BE INITIATED WITH THE CITY SO I'M LOOKING 5 TO 10 HOURS OF THEIR TIME TO START.

GO AHEAD.

SORRY. PROBABLY BECAUSE I'M GETTING TIRED WHAT DID YOU SAY?

I HAD THE SAME THING I DID NOT UNDERSTAND.

WHY PAY MONEY TO CONVINCING A COUNTY TO OPEN SPACE TO DO YOU THINK THEY WOULD BE MANDATED ANYWAY.

I HAD THE SAME QUESTION.

THE PROJECT I HAVE TALKED TO AGRICULTURE AND OPEN SPACE IN THE PROJECT MUST BE INITIATED WITH US. WE HAVE A VERY SMALL PORTION IN SEBASTOPOL AND A LARGE AMOUNT IN THE COUNTY.

WHAT PROJECT?

UNDERSTAND WHERE WHAT YOU WANT TO DO OTHER THAN A BATHROOM UPGRADE? THAT IS THE NEXT ITEM.

I WANT TO BUILD THE TRAIL.

POSSIBLE BATHROOM UPGRADE. THAT'S WHAT I'M TRYING TO UNDERSTAND.

THE BATHROOM A SEPARATE, LAGUNA WETLANDS. THIS IS TOTALLY DIFFERENT.

I SEE, NEVERMIND. OKAY I SEE WHAT YOU ARE SAYING.

THIS WAS SPLIT PER VICE MAYOR MAURER EARLIER.

AT TWO

AT 22'S. GO AHEAD.

DO I NEED TO ELABORATE FURTHER? 10 HOURS OF TIME TO PUT THIS IN THE COUNTY'S QUEUE.

I WILL DEFER TO COUNCILMEMBER HINTON.

AS I SAT ON THE BOARD SIX YEARS I'M CURIOUS WHERE THE INFORMATION HAS COME FROM AND IF IT HAS BEEN VERIFIED. I DON'T THINK THAT'S HOW THE PROCESS WORKS. I DID ATTEND MEETINGS EVERY MONTH SIX YEARS ON AGRICULTURE AND OPEN SPACE. I JUST WANT TO DO THE ASK. WE HAVE REPRESENTATIVES, THREE FROM THREE CITIES AND THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS. I WOULD BE FINE WITH SOMEBODY VERIFYING BUT I DON'T THINK THAT'S HOW IT WORKS.

LET'S TAKE AND HOW IT WORKS OUT I'M JUST ASKING FOR 10 HOURS.

NOT APPROVING STAFF TIME TONIGHT, WE ARE PROVING THE GOAL. WE WILL BRING THE TASK BACK FOR COUNTY TO COME BACK TO DISCUSS STAFF TIME. THE ITEM TONIGHT IS THIS A PRIORITY AS A WHOLE FOR THE COUNCIL TO REVIEW THE TRAIL DEVELOPMENT AND WE WOULD BRING A TASK BACK.

GO AHEAD.

MY FEEDBACK ON THIS IS WHERE SUPPORTING THE OTHER TRAIL MOSTLY IN OUR CITY AND I WOULD LIKE TO STAY ON THE TRAIL LANE AT THIS POINT. THAT'S WHAT I SAID. MOST OF THIS IN THE COUNTY.

I ALREADY KNOW. CAN WE JUST TAKE A VOTE.

COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

AT A QUESTION.

I SUPPORT THE TRAIL DEVELOPMENT BUT I THINK WITH THE BUDGET CONSTRAINTS IT IS PROBABLY BETTER TO JUST DO ONE RATHER THAN BOTH BUT I WOULD REALLY SUPPORT COUNCILMEMBER CARTER TO WALK TO THE COUNTY AND I WORK WITH YOU ON THIS WE COULD REALLY CLEARLY DEFINED THE TRAIL AND THEN TRY TO GET BY FROM DIFFERENT STAKEHOLDERS. I THINK APPLE BLOSSOM TRAIL IS FURTHER ALONG.

I WILL ASK THE QUESTION TO KEEP THIS ON AS A PRIORITY. COUNCILMEMBER CARTER

NEXT IS PRIORITIZED WETLANDS PRESERVE INCLUDING POSSIBLE BATHROOM UPGRADE. SORRY ABOUT THAT EARLIER.

I WOULD LIKE TO REPRESENT THIS BECAUSE IT IS MY ITEM BUT I WOULD LIKE TO FIND WHERE I DID THE RIGHT UP BECAUSE IT WAS NOT ANYWAY IT IS REALLY TO WORK WITH STAFF TO LOOK AT THE LAGUNA WETLANDS. NOT A STUDY AT ALL BUT TO WALK. WHERE DOES IT NEED CARE? BECAUSE TO ME IT SEEMS IT IS NOT YOUR TASTE AND IT IS NOT CARED FOR AS MUCH AS IT COULD BE. AND THEN TO TALK WITH STAFF ABOUT CONNECTING WITH LITTLE LEAGUE IN TERMS OF HAVING A UPGRADE TO THE BATHROOM BUT BABY STEPS TO FIND OUT OF THE BATHROOM CAN BE OPEN DURING THE DAYTIME BECAUSE THERE IS NOT A BATHROOM IN THE LAGUNA WETLANDS PRESERVE. PEOPLE COME HIKING THERE IS NOT A BATHROOM AND THERE SHOULD BE A BATHROOM THAT'S OPEN DURING THE DAYTIME HOURS. THIS REQUEST FOR THIS IS JUST TO START THE PROCESS OF HAVING DISCUSSION WITH STAFF TO SEE WHAT IS NEEDED AND IT COULD BE A LONG-TERM GOAL FIRST SHORT-TERM TO IDENTIFY NEEDS OF BETTER CARE FOR THE LAGUNA AND THEN FIGURING OUT ISSUES WITH THE BATHROOM COULD BE UNFOLDED AND I'M WILLING TO DO THE WORK ON THAT. WITH STAFF.

WOULD YOU LIKE ME TO EXPLAIN YOUR GOAL? WORK WITH CITY STAFF TO PRIORITIZE CALLS OF THE LAGUNA WETLANDS PRESERVE INCLUDING WORKING WITH LITTLE LEAGUE ON THE POSSIBILITY OF UPGRADING THE EXISTING BALLFIELD BATHROOM. BETTER OVERALL CARE OF THE LAGUNA WETLANDS. DAYTIME ACCESS TO PUBLIC BATHROOMS IN THE NEAR SHORT-TERM AND THEN WITHIN BUDGET WORKING WITH STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS SUPPORTING THE BATHROOM UPGRADE IF POSSIBLE.

WHY DOESN'T THIS FALL UNDER WHAT THE LAGUNA FOLKS WHY DOES IT FALL TO THE CITY?

IT IS WITHIN CITY BOUNDARY.

I UNDERSTAND BUT WE HAVE A ORGANIZATION THAT IS DEDICATED, NOT PROHIBITED FROM COMING TO THE CITY ARE THEY? JUST ASKING.

I THINK THE ISSUE IS TRYING TO REMEMBER FROM WHEN MY KIDS PLAYED BALL THE BALL PEOPLE KEEP THE BATHROOM OPEN WHEN THERE IS BALLGAMES SO IT WAS CLOSED.

I WILL SPEAK TO THAT. WHEN IT WAS OVER AND WE HAD TRANSIENTS GOING TO THE BATHROOM IN THE SINK AND ALL OF THAT SO THAT'S WHY IT IS LOCKED.

THAT IS FOR THE BALL KIDS AND I GUESS VICE MAYOR MAURER IS SUGGESTING EXPANDING OR REMODELING THAT WERE HAVING IT IN ADDITION.

STARTING WITH DISCUSSION ABOUT WHAT CAN BE DONE. GO AHEAD.

SO, AS I UNDERSTAND FIRST IS GOING TO BE TO TALK ABOUT SHARED GOALS AROUND WHATEVER IT IS YOU WOULD LIKE TO DO TO HELP THE AREA IS THAT WHAT YOU ARE THINKING? I DON'T WANT THIS TO BE ANOTHER SOCCER FIELD LIKE IT SEEMS THERE'S A NATURAL PARTNER AND IF THAT'S NOT THE FIRST STEP I AM NOT CLEAR ON WHAT WE'RE DOING.

I HAVE SPOKEN WITH THEM IN THEIR OPENING TO PARTNERING WITH THE CITY ON DIFFERENT PROJECTS. IN THIS PARTICULAR CASE I THINK IT IS THE CARE OF THE WETLANDS. WHAT WAS HIS NAME BRENT REED SAID HE WAS TALKING ABOUT USING GOATS IN THE LAGUNA TO HELP CARE FOR IT. SO THEY HAVE IDEAS BUT I THINK IT NEEDS TO BE COMMUNICATED WITH STAFF.

CAN I SAY PHILOSOPHICALLY I AM SUPPORTIVE BUT REALISTICALLY I AM NOT BECAUSE WE HAVE AN ORGANIZATION WITH A LIMITED BUDGET KNOWING THE BATHROOM ISSUE LIGHT IT ENDED UP LOCKED UP IN THE FIRST PLACE FOR THE SAKE OF MOVING ON I AM NOT SUPPORTIVE TONIGHT OF THAT.

WE HAVE ONE NO COUNCILMEMBER CARTER?

WE SUPPORTING YES.

COUNCILMEMBER ZOLLMAN

I AM VERY UNCLEAR ABOUT WHY WE CANNOT WORK WITH A PARTNER.

VICE MAYOR MAURER YES

MAYOR McLEWIS NO.

CREATION OF TRAFFIC AD HOC COMMITTEE.

THIS IS ANOTHER ONE OF MY I'M PROPOSING THIS AS A RESPONSE TO THE SURVEY AND ALL THE PUBLIC OUTCRY ABOUT TRAFFIC. AND I KNOW IT IS A CHALLENGE THE TRAFFIC WE HAVE IN SEBASTOPOL THERE WERE THINGS THE CITY HAS DONE IN THE PAST WHERE THE CITY ASKS TO PUT A SIGN UP ON OCCIDENTAL ROAD DIRECTING PEOPLE TO GO TO SANTA ROSA INSTEAD OF COMING TO TOWN. THE SAME COULD BE HAPPENING JUST A SIMPLE SIGN. MAYBE NOW CALTRANS MIGHT BE WILLING TO DO THAT SINCE THEY ARE PRIORITIZING SAFETY RATHER THAN SPEED SO I DON'T KNOW. I DON'T KNOW WHAT CAN BE DONE BUT I THOUGHT IT WOULD BE A GOOD SHOWING IF THE TRAFFIC COULD ADDRESS TRAFFIC AND PARKING ET CETERA. I KNOW THE CITY ALREADY HAS TRAFFIC COMMITTEE SO THIS WOULD BE ADDING TO COUNCILMEMBERS AND I KNOW THAT IS A BIG ASK SINCE WE HAVE LIMITED STAFF, BUT.

WHAT COMMITTEE IS THAT?

WE HAVE A STAFF COMMITTEE THAT WE TALK ABOUT WHEN ISSUES COME UP. NOT A COUNCIL COMMITTEE JUST DEPARTMENT HEADS.

OKAY GO AHEAD.

I WILL NOT REALLY SUPPORT IT BECAUSE I SUPPORT THE IDEA THROUGH AN EXISTING CHANNEL.

WE HAVE ONE NO.

CAN I MODIFY?

GOTCHA.

CAN I MODIFY? CAN WE ASK THE EXISTING TRAFFIC COMMITTEE TO SEE IF THEY CAN GET A SIGN ON OCCIDENTAL DIRECTING PEOPLE TO GO TO SANTA ROSA? INSTEAD OF COMING THROUGH TOWN?

WE CAN MAKE A ASK BUT THE LAST TIME WE MADE THE ASK THEY SAID NO BUT WE CAN MAKE THE ASK AND REPORT BACK COME BACK AND REPORT BACK TO THE COUNCIL

WHAT THERE WAS BECAUSE THE CONCERN WAS DIVERTING TRAFFIC AND ROAD MAINTENANCE AND COST TO TAKE CARE OF THEIR OWN ROADS.

HOW MANY YEARS AGO DID YOU MAKE THE ASK?

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE AT LEAST 10 YEARS.

I WOULD SUPPORT MAKING THAT ASK.

I'M NOT SUPPORTIVE OF A AD HOC COUNCILMEMBERS AND EVERYTHING. WE HAVE OTHER COMMITMENTS.

SO WE ARE CLEAR COUNCILMEMBER CARTER ?

IF I AM VOTING ON THE COMMITTEE, NO.

COUNCILMEMBER HINTON

SO NUMBER FOUR ROADS AND POTHOLES INTO THE CONTINUING PRIORITIES OF RESURFACING AND POTHOLES. PARKS AND PUBLIC SPACE INCLUDING SOME OF THE COMMENTS I HAD READ WERE REGARDING ADA PATHWAY MAKING IT MORE ACCESSIBLE BUT THERE IS ALSO SOMETHING ABOUT EVENTS AND THINGS LIKE THAT.'S WE HAVE THESE IN PRIORITIES?

I HAVE SOMETHING TO ADD.

BIKE AND INFRASTRUCTURE TRAILS SO THE TRAILS WE JUST DISCUSSED. BIKE FOR STRUCTURE WE INCLUDE THOSE INTO PROJECTS WHEN WE HAVE SOME SO THOSE ARE THE PRIORITIES SO I WOULD SAY THESE ARE BEING REVIEWED AS WE GO THROUGH PROJECTS. SIDEWALK AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY WE DID DISCUSS THIS AND THEN WATER AND SEWER AND FOR STRUCTURE WAS HIGH AND AGAIN THIS WOULD BE INCORPORATED INTO OUR WASTEWATER PLANTS, THE WELL UPDATES. THOSE ARE ALREADY MERGED. MY RECOMMENDATIONS TO ACCEPT FOUR, FIVE, SIX, SEVEN AND EIGHT PRIORITIES. I NEEDED TO CLARIFY SOMETHING.

I AGREE.

I WANT TO CLARIFY SOMETHING FIRST. WITH THE PARKS AND PUBLIC SPACES ONE OF THE QUESTIONS I HAD IS ABOUT COMPLETING THE ADA SIDEWALK IN THE PARKS IS THIS WHERE THE PRIORITY NEEDS TO BE PUT IN?

I BELIEVE THAT'S ON THE WORK PLAN.

THAT'S WHAT I WANT TO CLARIFY.

DO YOU KNOW THE COMPLETION ON THAT? THE ADA PATHWAY? THE FULL SUMMER?

FOR THE WHOLE SHEBANG.

THAT'S WHAT I WANT TO MAKE SURE.

CURRENTLY THERE DESIGNING PHASE 2 FROM THE BATHROOM TO THE CENTER FOR THE ARTS PARKING LOT AND WE STOPPED THEM THERE IN DEFERENCE TO WHAT'S GOING ON WITH THE PROJECT BECAUSE WHERE THE ALIGNMENT WOULD CONTINUE THE REST OF THE WAY WOULD HAVE TO BE RIPPED OUT IF WE DO PHASE 1.

CORRECT ME IF I'M WRONG WE HAVE NO ESTIMATE FOR WHEN THAT IS FINISHED.

CORRECT? SO MY CONCERN IS REGARDLESS OF THAT WE HAVE PEOPLE WITH ADA ISSUES THAT NEED TO GET TO THE PARK REGARDLESS OF OUR TIMING SO PERSONALLY I WANT TO ADVOCATE WE NEED TO FINISH THAT. IT IS SOMETHING WE SHOULD BE DOING REGARDLESS.

WE ARE COMPLETING TO THE ADA STALL SO FOLKS A DRIVE TO THE STALL WILL HAVE FULL ACCESS TO THE PARK FROM WHERE WE STOPPED PHASE 2.

EITHER WAY I THINK AND THE OTHER QUESTION IS ABOUT FINISHING THE FENCE. THE HOLE SHEBANG.

WE WERE DOING THE FIRST PHASE DON'T BELIEVE WE HAVE BUDGETED FOR THE SECOND.

WE HAD SOME PRELIMINARY BUDGETING THAT I PULLED OUT FOR THIS MEETING AND TO CUT BUDGETS TO DO THE NEXT PHASE FOR THE SAME REASON. IT WOULD BE \$100,000 AND

IF WE ARE POTENTIALLY REMOVING THAT IN THE NEXT COUPLE YEARS THE COUNCIL CAN MAKE THAT CHOICE.

WE DON'T KNOW THAT'S A COUPLE YEARS BECAUSE WE HAVE BEEN SAYING THAT FOR A DECADE OR HOWEVER LONG. I AM PERSONALLY ADVOCATING FOR THOSE TWO THINGS BECAUSE I THINK WE NEED TO GET THESE THINGS DONE AND THE FENCING WITH THIS URBAN LEGEND OF FINISHING THE PROJECT PERSONALLY I WOULD WANT TO ADVOCATE. WE WANT THE PARK TO LOOK NICE NOW NOT 20 YEARS FROM NOW. I DON'T KNOW IF ANYONE IS WITH ME ON THAT BUT THAT IS WHAT I WANT TO CLARIFY BECAUSE I WAS NOT SURE IN THAT PIECE WHETHER OR NOT.

JUST GENERAL.

NOT SURE WHICH PART YOU'RE TRYING TO PULL OUT.

I'M NOT TRYING TO PULL OUT ANY I'M TRYING TO GET CLARIFY DETAIL ON ADVOCATING FOR US TO MAKE CERTAIN WHATEVER ADA NEEDS TO BE FINISHED IT IS FINISHED.

IT IS ON THE LIST.

IT'S NOT.

ADA WALKWAY AND IVES PARK NUMBER 16.

THAT'S PHASE 2 THE CENTER FOR THE ARTS PORTION SO IF WE DO IT THE REST OF THE WAY WE WOULD WANT COUNCIL DIRECTION TO DO THAT MAY OR MAY NOT CONFLICT WITH THE PROJECT.

WHERE WE LOOKING? YOU ARE LOOKING UNDER THE HIGH-PERFORMANCE. HIGH-PERFORMANCE ORGANIZATION.

CITY STAFF ITEM 16.

ITEM 16 UNDER.

REVISED CARRYOVER PROJECTS NUMBER 16.

WHY DO I NOT HAVE? I HAVE IT GOING UP TO 14. AND THEN I HIT NUMBER FOUR. LET ME LOOK I'M SORRY JUST TRYING TO GET THIS IN ORDER. SO IT IS NUMBER 16. THE QUESTION I HAVE IS PERSONALLY I WANT TO EDUCATE WEATHER UNDER PUBLIC INPUT OR HERE IT'S JUST THE TOPIC IN GENERAL. I WANT TO MAKE SURE WE GET IT DONE TO ITS COMPLETION AND THE FENCE DONE TO COMPLETION REGARDLESS BECAUSE IT IS A URBAN LEGEND IN MY MIND. JUST ASKING.

IS THEIR SUPPORT FOR CITY STAFF TO RETURN WITH ADDITIONAL INFORMATION AS TO THE COST FOR FINALIZING THE PATHWAY AND FENCING FOR ADDITIONAL SECTIONS? GO AHEAD.

ITEMS NINE THROUGH 17?

RIGHT NOW WE ARE ON THE PARKS AND PUBLIC SPACES. ONE OF THEM COULD MERGE WITH NUMBER 16 THE ADA WALKWAY AND PARK.

SOME OF THEM ARE DUPLICATES.

HERE OR NUMBER 16 BUT THE REQUEST UNDERSTANDING IS TO LOOK AT COMPLETING THE ADA PATHWAY AND FENCING REGARDLESS OF WHERE WE ARE WITH THE CREEK RIGHT NOW THE GRANT APPLICATION AND THE APPLICATION. THAT'S MY UNDERSTANDING.

I FEEL LIKE WE ALREADY VOTED AND DISCUSSED THIS AT A COUNCIL MEETING NOT LONG AGO. SO, WE ARE UNDOING THAT VOTE?

ON THE PROJECT ITSELF?

WE AGREE TO SUBMIT APPLICATIONS FOR THE PROJECT AND I DON'T KNOW. THAT'S WHY WE APPROVED PART OF THE FENCE ABOUT THE EXTRA 100,000 THAT WAS JUST DISCUSSED SO I DON'T KNOW. TO SUPPORT THIS I WOULD HAVE TO UNDERSTAND WHERE WE ARE AT. I DON'T HAVE ENOUGH INFORMATION. I FEEL LIKE WE DID ADDRESS THIS IN THE LAST SIX MONTHS.

WE DID WITH THE CONCEPT WE WERE APPLYING FOR THE GRANT PUTTING IN THE UPPER PORTION OF THE FENCING. WE HAVE DONE THE ADA PATHWAY AND WHAT I AM HEARING FROM THE MAYOR IS THAT IT DOES NOT APPEAR WHEN THE GRANT APPLICATION COMES THROUGH OR IF IT'S COMING THROUGH. MY UNDERSTANDING IS SHE IS REQUESTING WHAT I AM HEARING TONIGHT IS REGARDLESS OF WHERE THE GRANT IS IS TO LOOK AT CONTINUING THE FENCE ALL THE WAY THROUGH AS ONE ITEM.

YEAH I MEAN WE JUST, WE RECEIVED EMAILS ABOUT PEOPLE FALLING AND BREAKING THEIR ARMS. WE RECEIVED EMAILS LIKE THAT IN THE PAST SO THAT'S WHY ESPECIALLY WITH THE ADA IT SEEMS TO ME THAT IS OUR RESPONSIBILITY. I'M SORRY, GO AHEAD.

I SUPPORT THE GRANT PROJECT AND THAT DOES TAKE TIME TO APPLY FOR THESE AND COME BACK. I AM NOT READY TO SAY GO AND SPEND A BUNCH OF MONEY ON OFFENSE THAN MIGHT BE GETTING TAKEN OUT BECAUSE YOU'RE CHANGING THE ROUTE OF THE CREEK AND SAME WITH THE ADA PATHWAY. I WANT TO STAY IN THE LEGAL BOUNDS WHATEVER WE ARE SUPPOSED TO DO AND MAKE SURE THAT HAPPENS. NOT IN CONFLICT WITH THE GRANT SO THAT'S MY OPINION.

AND THE ADA SIDEWALK? THOSE ARE SEPARATE.

I AM UNCLEAR ON HOW WE ARE VOTING BECAUSE I WANT TO VOTE TO SUPPORT THE IVES AND A LOT OF THAT STUFF NOW WE ARE SPLITTING AND I'M KIND OF LOSING IT. ITEMS FOUR, FIVE, SIX, SEVEN AND EIGHT I AM NOT HEARING SUPPORT FOR THE FENCING. CONTINUING THE FENCING SO THAT IS NOT INCLUDED IN WHAT WE ARE SUPPORTING THE POTHOLES WE HAVE TALKED ABOUT PARKS AND PUBLIC SPACES DOING THE ADA WHERE WE HAVE DONE THE PATH ALREADY. BIKE IF A STRUCTURE ENTRAILS AS WE DO PROJECTS, PEDESTRIAN SPACING WE CONTINUE TO DO THAT AND WE HAVE SUSTAINABLE TRANSPORTATION AND THE PDA AND THE WATER SEWER MASTER PLANS COMING FORWARD. THAT IS WHAT YOU WOULD BE SUPPORTING RIGHT NOW AND WE WILL COME BACK WHEN WE COME TO NUMBER 60 FOR THE ADDITIONAL PATHWAY REQUEST IS WHAT I AM HEARING. IS THEIR SUPPORT FOR THESE ITEMS THAT I JUST STATED BECAUSE THEY'RE BUILT INTO THE STRUCTURE AND PUBLIC WORKS. SO THE NEXT ITEMS ARE CARRYOVERS. GRANT FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES LOOKING AT THAT, CITY ASSET MANAGEMENT WE ARE LOOKING AT FOR INVENTORIES. ROADWAY SYSTEMS, TRACKING ORDERS MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES INSPECTION PROGRAMS DELIVERING CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND PLUMMETING THE PROJECTS BRINGING CIP TO THE COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL, STORM DRAIN PLAN FROM THE CREEK PIPELINE THE CUSP GRANT, THE ROTARY CENTENNIAL PLAN WHICH THE ROTARY IS DOING AT THE PARK, THE FUNDING PLAN CYCLE CYCLE TWO AND ADA WALKWAY AND IVES PARK SO THIS IS JUST TO COMPLETE WHAT WE CURRENTLY HAVE BECAUSE WE DID NOT KNOW IF IT WOULD BE COMPLETED BY JUNE 30 OR IS THIS THE NEW SECTION? ITEM NUMBER 16 ADA WALKWAY AND THE IVES PARK.

AS A GOAL I AM NOT SURE IT WAS DEFINED. WE HAVE COMPLETED THE FIRST SECTION, SECOND WAS CURRENT YEAR CIP WHICH WILL BE DONE BY JUNE 30 AND THE DIRECTION IS WHETHER OR NOT TO DO IT PAST THE HANDICAP STALL.

BRIGHT AND I THINK WHEN THIS CAME ON WE WERE NOT SURE IF WE WOULD HAVE IT DONE BY JUNE 30 WHICH IS WHY WE PUT IT ONTO CARRYOVER.

WE WILL NOT HAVE IT COMPLETELY CONSTRUCTED BY JUNE 3, DESIGNED AND IN CONSTRUCTION.

OKAY THAT'S WHY IT IS A CARRYOVER. KNOW WE ARE TALKING A NEW PATHWAY? EVERY TIME I ASK ABOUT THIS WAY DOING THE SECTION AND THAT SECTION.
