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RECOMMENDATION(s):

That the city council receive the informational presentation regarding Fiscal Year 2025–26 crime statistics, calls for service, police activity, and the geographic distribution of reported incidents throughout the city.

PROCESS OF AGENDA ITEM:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

This report provides the city council and community with an overview of the Sebastopol Police Department's activities during Fiscal Year 2025–26 (July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026).

During the reporting period, the department responded to 19,018 computer-aided dispatch (CAD) incidents, averaging approximately 52 incidents each day. Police activity included emergency and non-emergency calls for service, criminal investigations, proactive patrols, traffic enforcement, suspicious circumstances, welfare checks, public assistance, and numerous other public safety responsibilities.

Reported crime remained relatively stable throughout the reporting period, with property-related offences continuing to represent the largest category of reported crime while crimes against persons remained comparatively low.

The report also examines geographic crime trends, transient-related calls for service, and the department's ongoing partnership with the Sonoma County Department of Health Services HEART. These analyses assist the department in identifying trends, directing resources, and implementing proactive policing strategies to address recurring public safety concerns.

Although crime statistics remain an important measure of community safety, they represent only one component of the department's responsibilities. Calls for service, proactive policing, community engagement, crisis intervention, and collaborative problem-solving continue to form a significant part of the department's daily operations.

BACKGROUND:

The city council requested an informational presentation summarizing crime statistics for Fiscal Year 2025–26, including maps illustrating the geographic distribution of reported incidents throughout the city.

This report has been prepared using information obtained from the Sebastopol Police Department's Records Management System (RMS) and Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) system as represented on the CitizenRIMS webpage, accessible by the public, for the period July 1, 2025 through June 30, 2026.

The report provides an overview of reported crime, calls for service, enforcement activity, transient-related incidents, and geographic trends observed during the reporting period. The information is intended to assist the city council and the community in understanding the department's workload, identifying emerging public safety trends, and demonstrating how operational data is used to support deployment decisions and proactive policing strategies.

In response to the city council's request, this report includes maps illustrating the geographic distribution of reported incidents. Due to the volume of incidents occurring during the fiscal year, the maps can only demonstrate overall patterns of police activity rather than identify individual addresses or specific crime hotspots.

It is important to recognize that higher concentrations of police activity are typically associated with commercial or downtown districts, transportation corridors, parks, civic facilities, and other locations with higher levels of pedestrian and vehicle activity. Consequently, higher call volumes do not necessarily indicate that an area is less safe but rather reflect locations where there is naturally greater demand for police services.

DISCUSSION:

Overall Police Activity

During Fiscal Year 2025–26, the Sebastopol Police Department responded to 19,018 computer-aided dispatch (CAD) incidents, averaging approximately 52 incidents each day. These incidents included emergency and non-emergency calls for service, criminal investigations, proactive patrols, traffic enforcement, suspicious circumstances, welfare checks, public assistance, and community engagement activities.

Analysis of CAD records indicates a combined total of approximately 13,219 hours spent responding to and investigating incidents on scene, averaging 41.7 minutes per incident from the time a call was received until it was cleared. This equates to an average of approximately 36 hours of active CAD incidents every day, handled by a total of two (2) officers per 12 hour shift.

While CAD duration does not represent individual officer work time in totality and to include all follow-up investigative work or work to present matters to the judicial system, it demonstrates the significant operational demand placed on department personnel throughout the fiscal year.

Calls for service remain the most accurate reflection of the department's workload. Officers routinely respond to incidents that do not involve criminal offences but nevertheless require police intervention to protect public safety, preserve the peace, assist vulnerable individuals, and resolve community concerns.

Operational Activity Summary

In addition to responding to calls for service, officers engaged in significant proactive enforcement and community policing activities throughout the fiscal year. These efforts are essential components of crime prevention, traffic safety, and maintaining a visible police presence throughout the community.

Business security checks remain an important proactive policing strategy and demonstrate the department's commitment to crime prevention and community engagement. Officers routinely conduct business checks during patrol to deter criminal activity, identify suspicious circumstances, and maintain positive relationships with local businesses. Likewise, proactive traffic enforcement contributes to roadway safety through education, enforcement, and voluntary compliance with California traffic laws.

These operational activities illustrate that the department's work extends well beyond responding to calls for service. A significant portion of an officer's day is dedicated to proactive policing, criminal investigations, crime prevention initiatives, traffic safety, and community engagement designed to reduce crime before it occurs and improve the overall quality of life within the City of Sebastopol.

Reported Crime

Reported crime during Fiscal Year 2025–26 remained generally consistent with expectations for a community the size of Sebastopol. Property-related offences continued to represent the largest category of reported crime, while crimes against persons remained comparatively low.

The Sebastopol Police Department investigates every reported criminal offence and continues to emphasize proactive patrol, visible policing, timely investigations, and strong partnerships with residents, businesses, and regional law enforcement agencies to deter criminal activity and improve community safety.

Geographic Distribution of Police Activity

Consistent with the city council's request, maps illustrating the geographic distribution of reported incidents are included with this report.

Police activity was concentrated within commercial or downtown districts, transportation corridors, parks, civic facilities, and other public gathering places where there are naturally higher levels of pedestrian activity, vehicle traffic, businesses, and community events. These maps are intended to illustrate general activity patterns rather than identify individual addresses or specific crime hotspots.

Higher concentrations of reported incidents should not necessarily be interpreted as areas experiencing higher

crime rates. Instead, they generally reflect locations with increased public activity and, consequently, greater demand for police services.

Transient-Related Calls for Service

Transient-related incidents continue to represent a significant operational demand on department resources. Officers routinely respond to calls involving suspicious persons, welfare checks, trespassing, disturbances, public intoxication, mental health-related incidents, camping-related complaints, quality-of-life concerns, and requests for assistance from residents, businesses, visitors, and other city departments.

Many of these incidents do not involve criminal conduct but nevertheless require officers to assess the circumstances, determine the appropriate course of action, resolve immediate public safety concerns, and coordinate assistance with partner agencies where appropriate.

Analysis of CAD data demonstrates that transient-related calls are concentrated within several recurring areas rather than being evenly distributed throughout the city.

Identifying these recurring locations assists the department in directing proactive patrols, identifying trends, coordinating with businesses and property owners, and deploying available resources where they are most likely to improve public safety and reduce repeat calls for service.

Partnership with Sonoma County Department of Health Services (DHS) – HEART & WCCS

Recognizing that many calls involving individuals experiencing homelessness are not solely law enforcement matters, the Sebastopol Police Department works collaboratively with the Sonoma County Department of Health Services (DHS) Homeless Engagement and Assistance Response Team (HEART). The City also contracts with West County Community Services (WCCS) to provide outreach and support services to individuals experiencing homelessness.

When appropriate, officers request HEART assistance for individuals who may benefit from housing navigation, behavioral health services, medical care, substance use treatment, identification assistance, or connections to other available community resources. Depending on the circumstances, HEART personnel may respond alongside officers or conduct follow-up outreach after the initial police response.

Through the fiscal year, HEART continued to provide direct operational support to the Police Department by responding to officer requests for assistance, conducting proactive outreach, and connecting individuals experiencing homelessness with housing, behavioral health, medical, and other support services. The city also contracts with West County Community Services (WCCS) to provide outreach and housing navigation services.

According to WCCS, these reported figures represent an increase in the number of individuals served compared with the previous fiscal year and reflect ongoing outreach, housing navigation, coordinated entry, and interagency collaboration activities undertaken during the reporting period.

Racial and Identity Profiling Act (RIPA)

The Sebastopol Police Department is committed to providing fair, impartial, and professional policing in accordance with the requirements of California's Racial and Identity Profiling Act (RIPA). The department collects and reports stop data to the California Department of Justice as required by law, promoting transparency, accountability, and public confidence in policing practices.

Review of the department's RIPA data indicates that the demographic characteristics of individuals stopped by officers are generally consistent with the community served and do not identify any significant or unexpected trends requiring operational or policy changes. Additionally, the department's reported data relating to perceived gender identity and sexual orientation is generally consistent with statewide RIPA reporting patterns published by the California Department of Justice. The Chief of Police will continue to monitor RIPA data as part of ongoing commitment to constitutional policing, procedural justice, and continuous improvement.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The information presented in this report demonstrates that the responsibilities of the Sebastopol Police Department extend well beyond the investigation of criminal offences. While reported crime statistics remain an

important indicator of community safety, they represent only one component of the department's overall workload.

During Fiscal Year 2025–26, the department responded to 19,037 calls for service, investigated 830 criminal cases, made 318 arrests, conducted 1,097 traffic stops, completed 6,910 business security checks, issued 1,160 citations, and issued 652 parking citations. Collectively, these statistics reflect the diverse range of responsibilities undertaken each day to protect life, safeguard property, preserve the peace, and provide assistance to residents, businesses, and visitors.

Overall, the data indicates that reported crime remained relatively stable throughout the reporting period. Crimes against persons continued to occur infrequently, while property-related offences represented the largest category of reported criminal activity. The department will continue to focus on proactive patrol, foot patrols, timely investigations, crime prevention initiatives, visible policing, and traffic enforcement to deter criminal activity and maintain a safe community.

Under the current leadership of the department, the Sebastopol Police Department has adopted a proactive policing philosophy that emphasizes offender accountability while balancing prevention, education, problem-solving, and community engagement. During Fiscal Year 2025–26, misdemeanor custodial arrests exceeded the department's average over the previous three fiscal years by approximately 45%, reflecting an increased emphasis on taking appropriate enforcement action whenever criminal conduct meets the legal threshold for custodial arrest.

While custodial arrests represent only one measure of police activity, they demonstrate the Chief of Police's commitment to addressing criminal behaviour promptly and consistently while continuing to exercise professional discretion through warnings, citations, referrals, diversion opportunities, and other alternatives whenever those options are lawful and appropriate.

The department's operational workload is also significantly influenced by incidents that do not involve criminal offences. Officers routinely respond to suspicious circumstances, welfare checks, persons in crisis, neighbourhood disputes, parking complaints, traffic-related incidents, and requests for public assistance that require a police response but do not result in criminal charges. These calls consume a substantial amount of officer time and remain an essential component of the department's commitment to protecting public safety and maintaining community confidence.

Transient-related calls for service continue to represent one of the department's most significant recurring operational demands, representing an estimated 25 percent of police workload. Analysis of CAD data demonstrates that these incidents are concentrated within identifiable commercial corridors, parks, civic facilities, and public gathering places rather than being evenly distributed throughout the city. Identifying these recurring locations allows the department to direct proactive patrols, engage with businesses and property owners, implement problem-oriented policing strategies, and focus limited resources where they are most likely to improve public safety and reduce recurring calls for service.

Recognizing that many transient-related incidents involve underlying behavioural health, substance use, housing instability, or other social service needs, the department maintains a close operational partnership with the Sonoma County Department of Health Services HEART. During the reporting period, HEART directly supported 73 police calls for service, conducted 61 proactive engagements, accepted 17 verbal referrals, enrolled 11 individuals into services, placed 8 individuals on shelter waitlists, assisted 5 individuals into shelter, and successfully housed 3 individuals. The department has found HEART to be an effective operational partner due to its timely communication, coordinated responses, and regular follow-up with officers.

The city also contracts with West County Community Services (WCCS) at an annual cost of approximately \$40,000 to provide outreach and housing navigation services. WCCS has reported significant annual activity,

including services to 303 individuals, 77 permanent housing placements, and 34 shelter placements.

The department continually evaluates crime statistics, calls for service, geographic trends, and recurring problem locations to guide deployment decisions, identify emerging public safety concerns, prioritize proactive enforcement activities, and allocate available resources where they will have the greatest operational impact. This data-driven approach enables supervisors to make informed operational decisions while ensuring police services remain responsive to the changing needs of the community.

It is important to recognize that the effectiveness of a police department cannot be measured solely by reported crime statistics or arrest numbers. Community safety is influenced by proactive patrol, officer visibility, traffic enforcement, crime prevention initiatives, community engagement, employee professionalism, effective leadership, strong interagency partnerships, and early intervention before criminal activity occurs. Many of these activities are not reflected in traditional crime statistics but nevertheless require a significant investment of departmental resources and contribute substantially to maintaining public safety and public confidence.

Police services today extend well beyond traditional law enforcement. Modern policing requires officers to respond to a diverse range of public safety issues, many of which involve crisis intervention, behavioral health, homelessness, traffic safety, conflict resolution, and collaborative problem-solving rather than criminal enforcement alone. The statistics presented in this report illustrate not only the volume of work performed by the Sebastopol Police Department, but also the diversity, complexity, and professionalism of the services provided to the community each day.

The Sebastopol Police Department remains committed to providing professional, fair, transparent, and accountable police services while continually evaluating operational data, investing in employee training and development, strengthening community partnerships, and enhancing public safety. As community needs continue to evolve, the department will remain focused on balancing enforcement, prevention, education, and collaborative problem-solving to ensure residents, businesses, and visitors continue to receive responsive, effective, and compassionate public safety services.

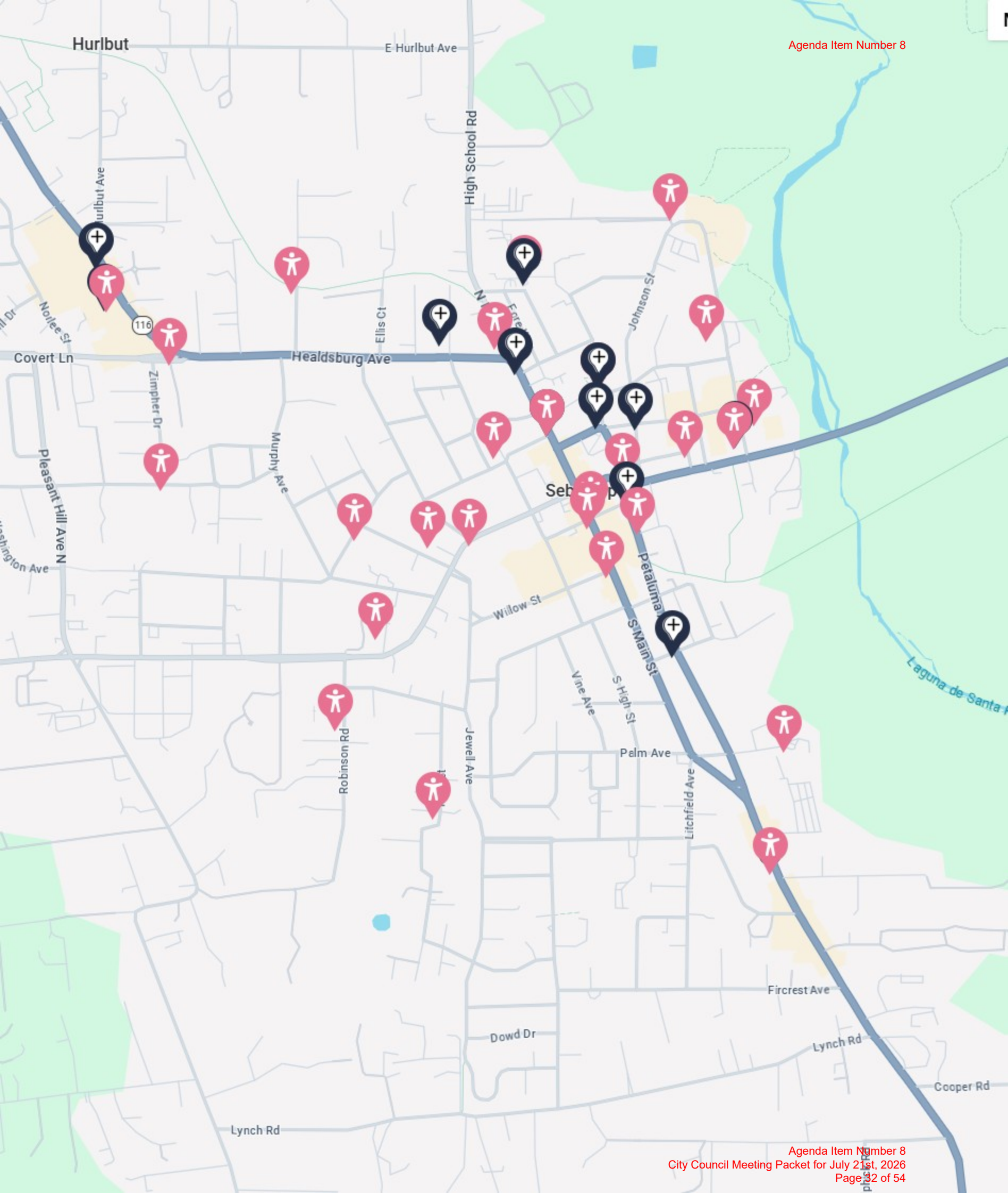

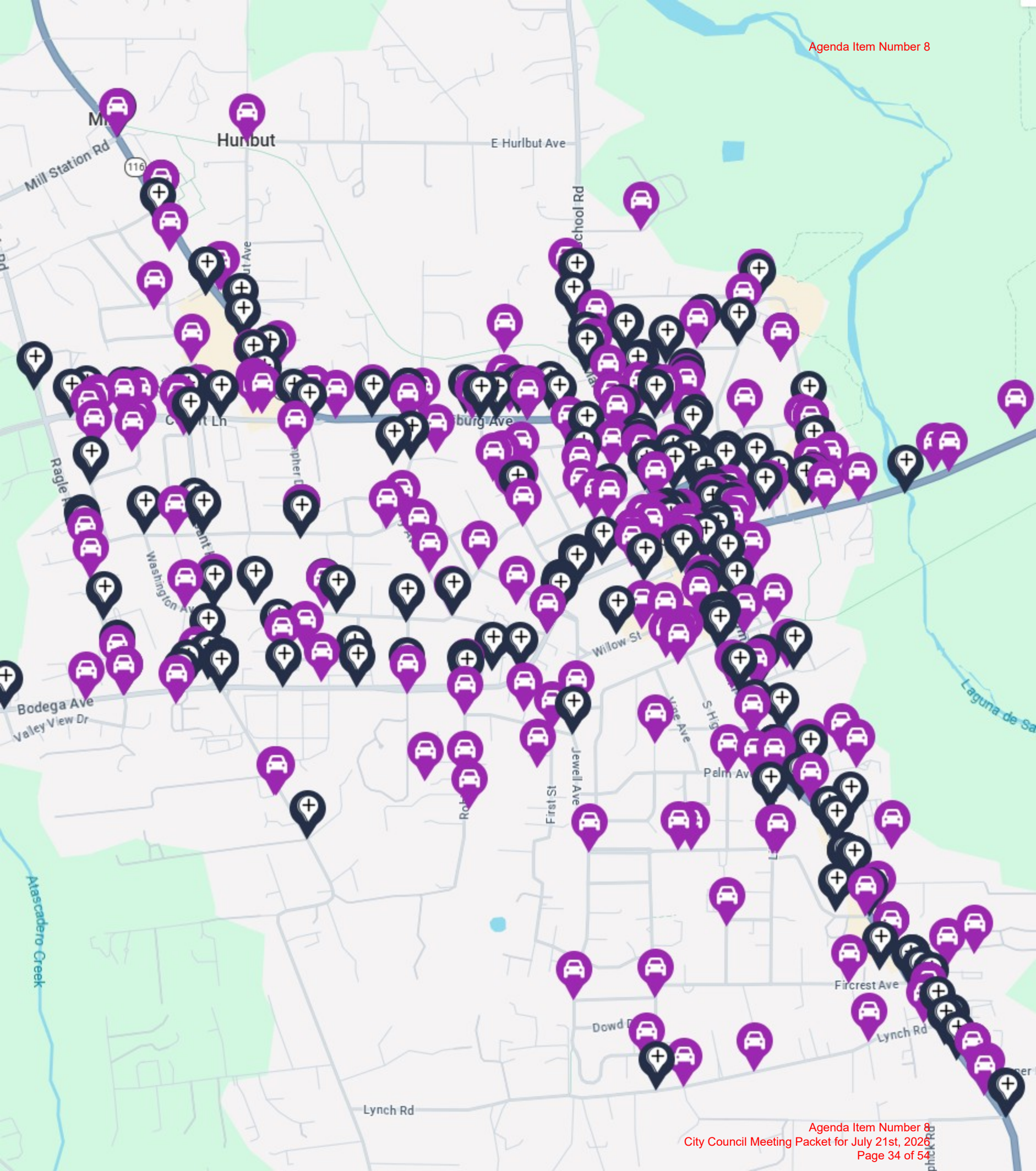
Property Crime Map



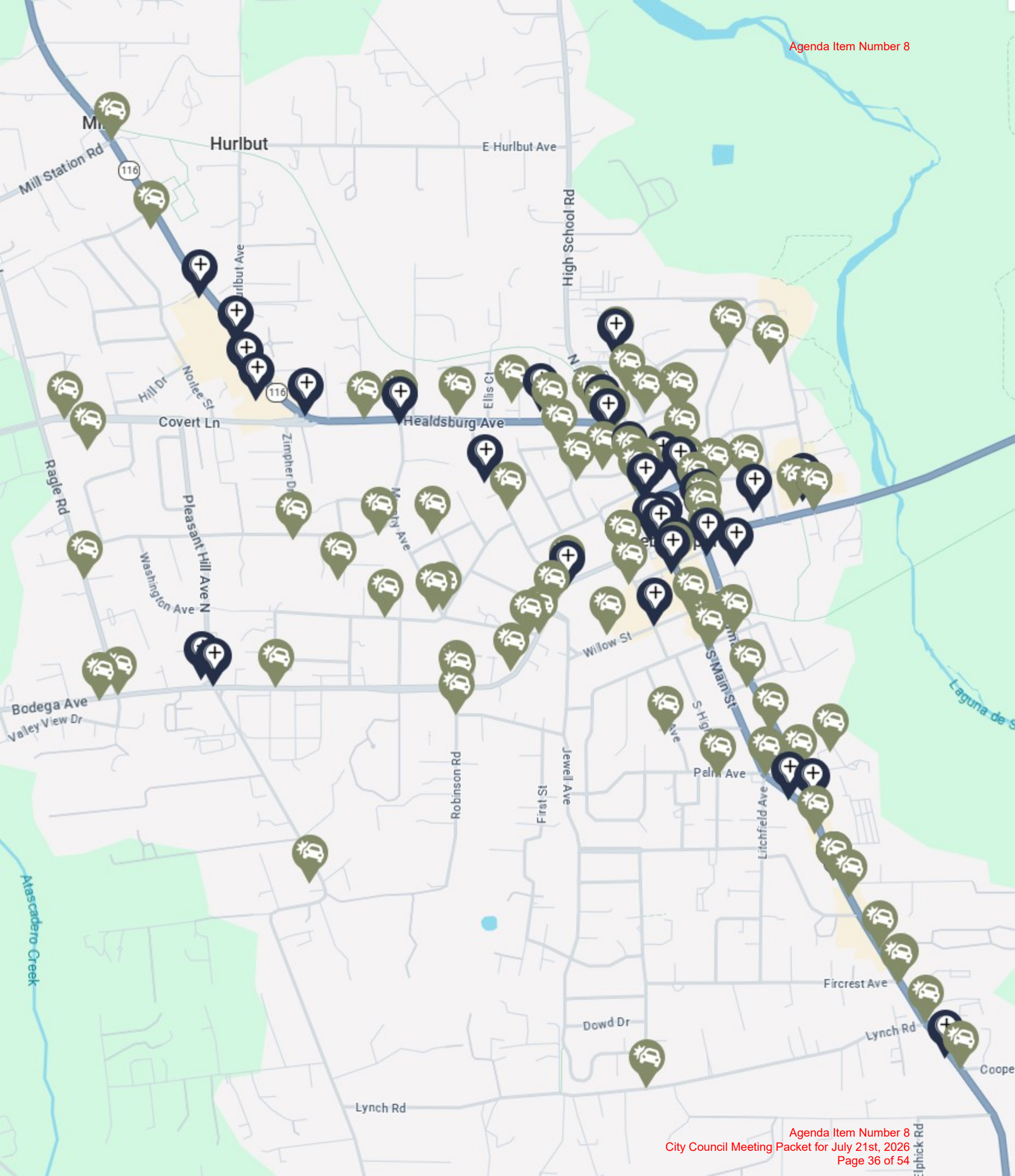
Crimes Against Persons Map



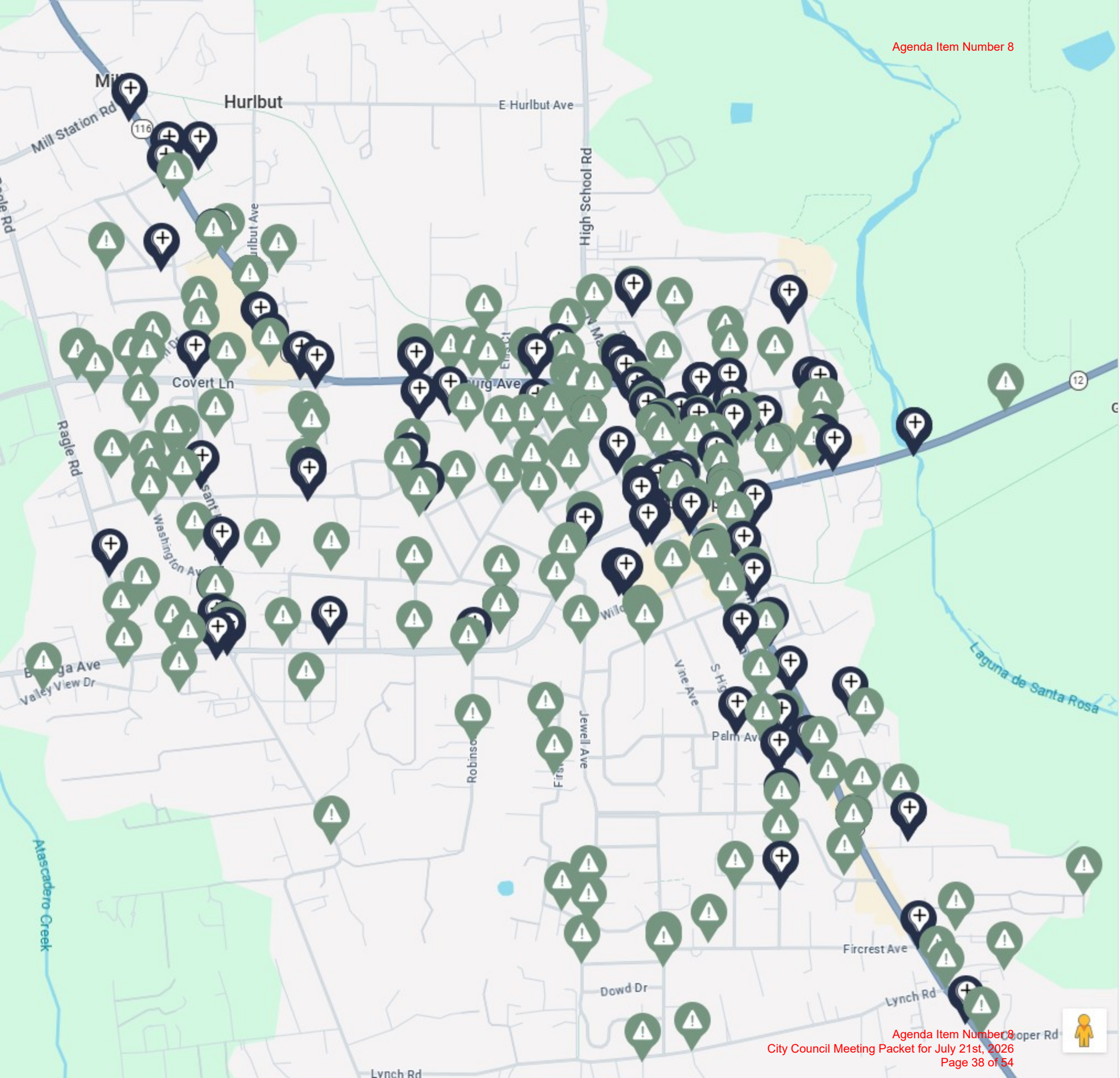
Traffic Related Incident Map

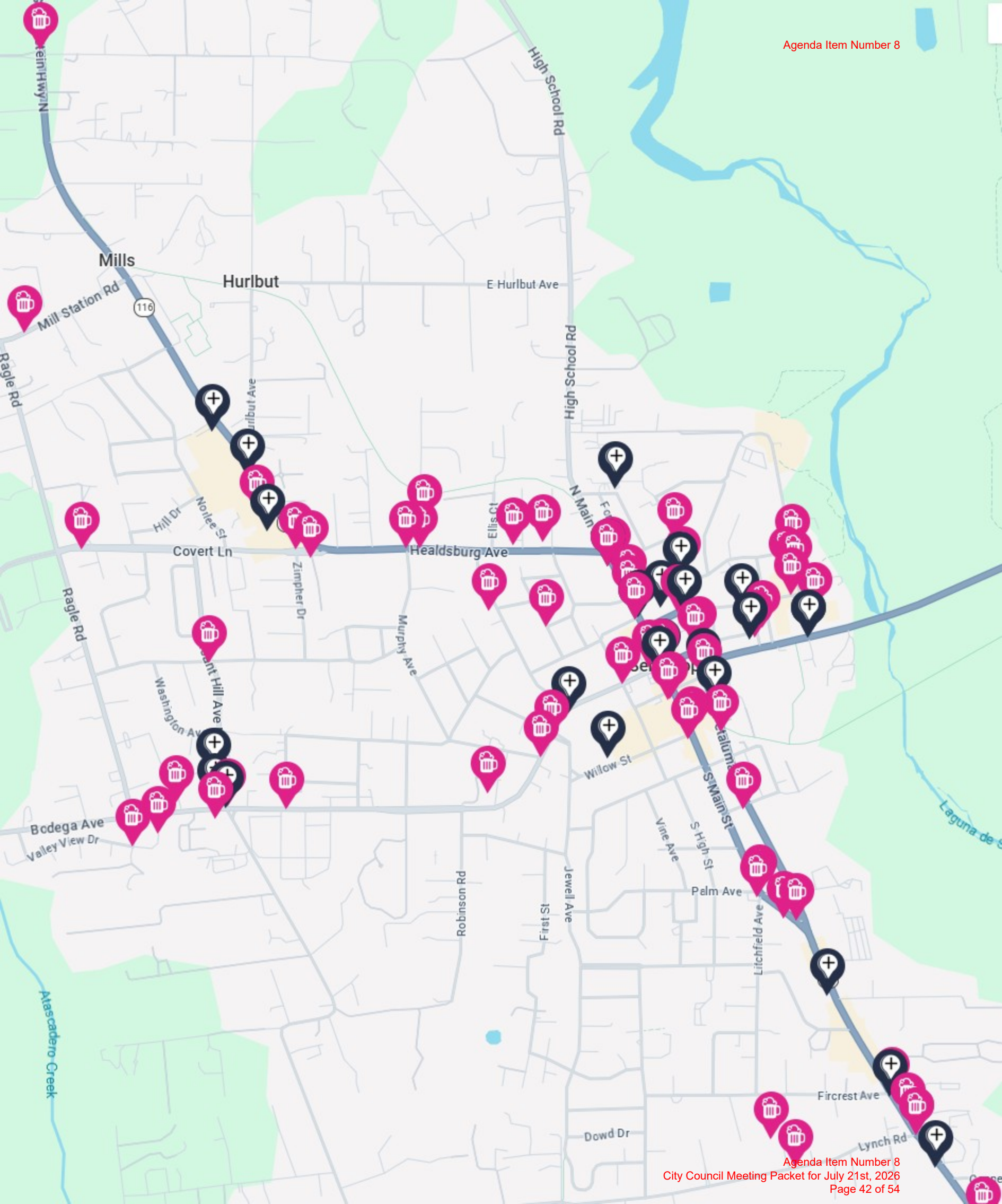
Suspicious Person/Vehicle Map



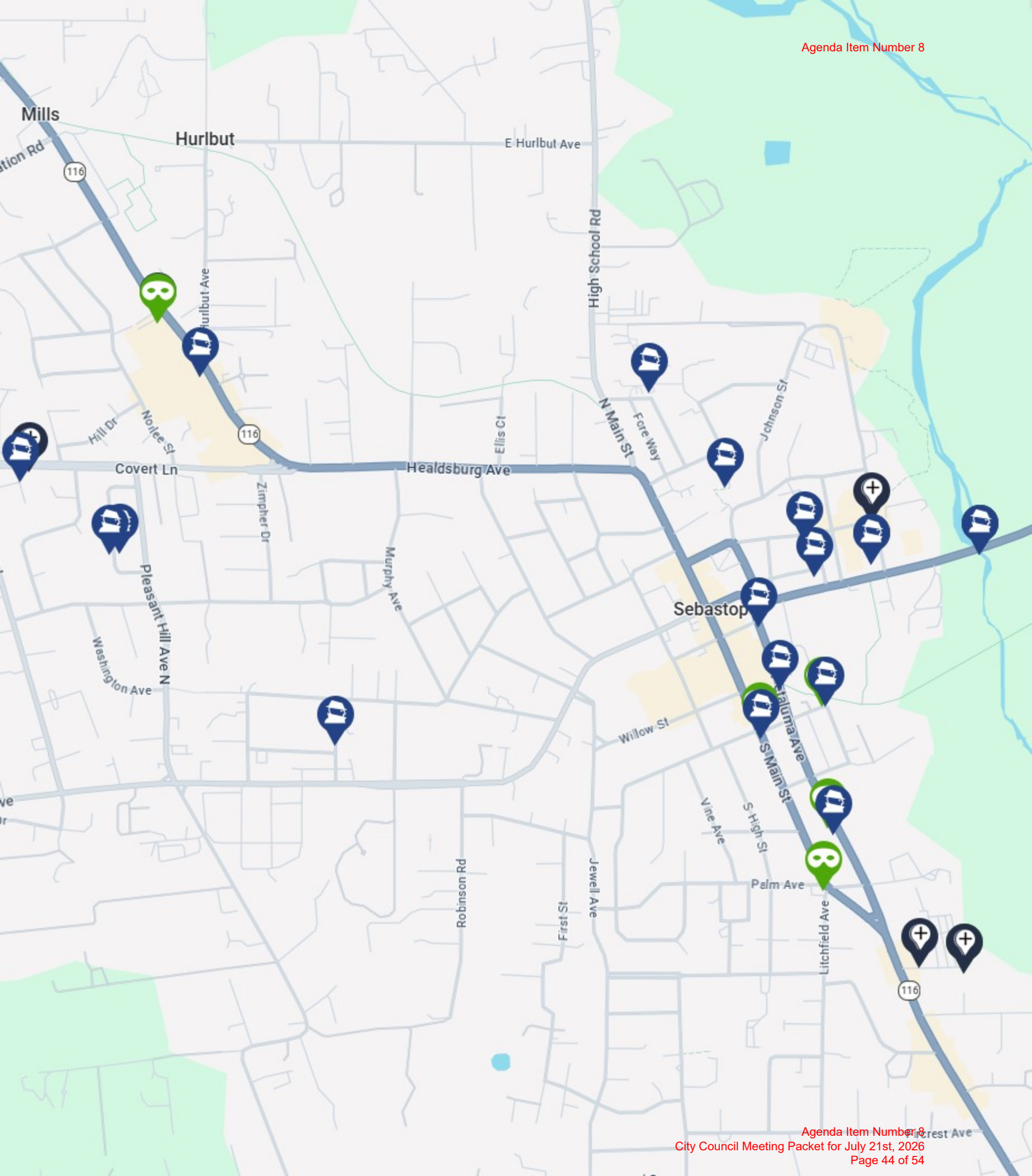
Disturbance Calls Map



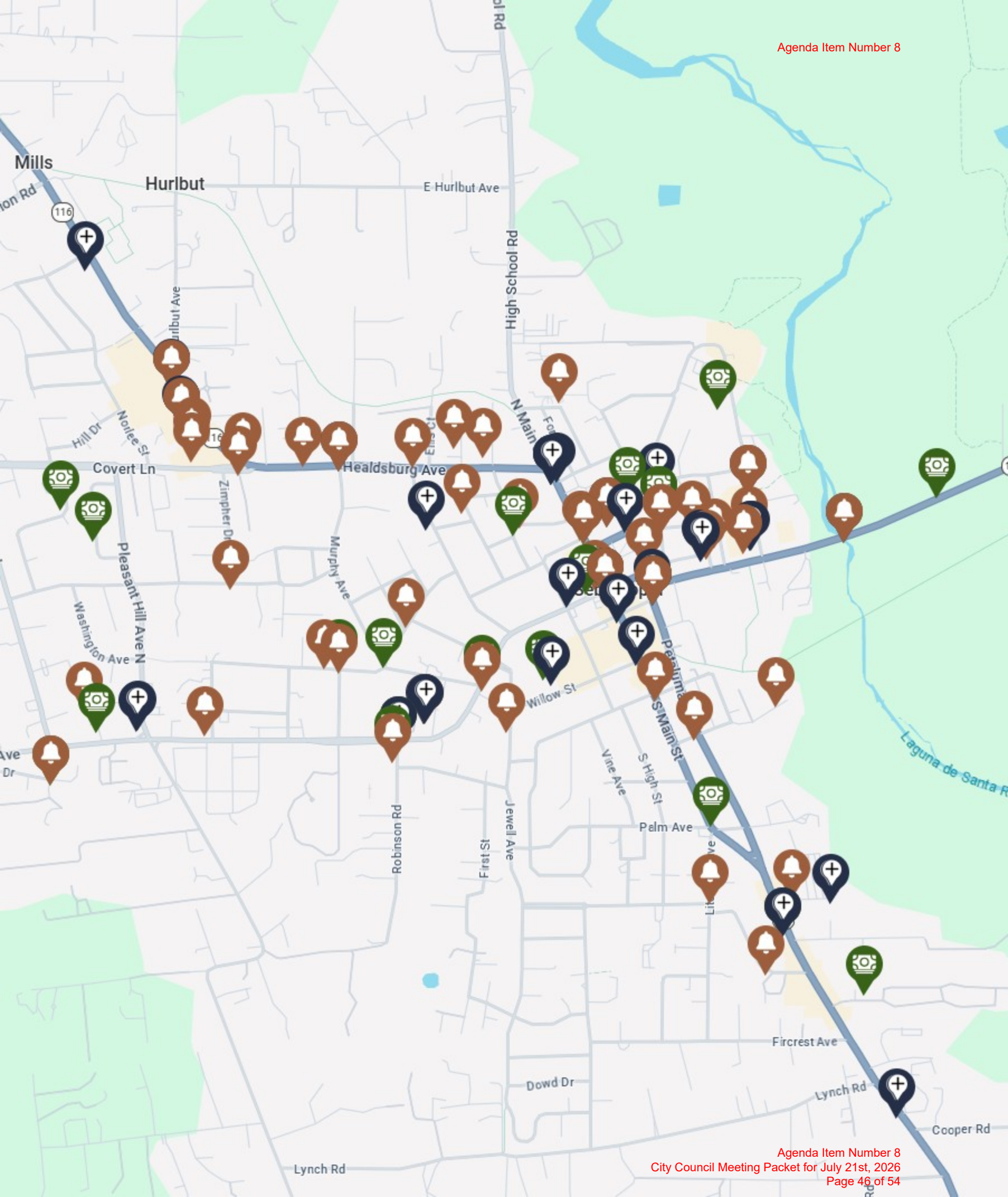

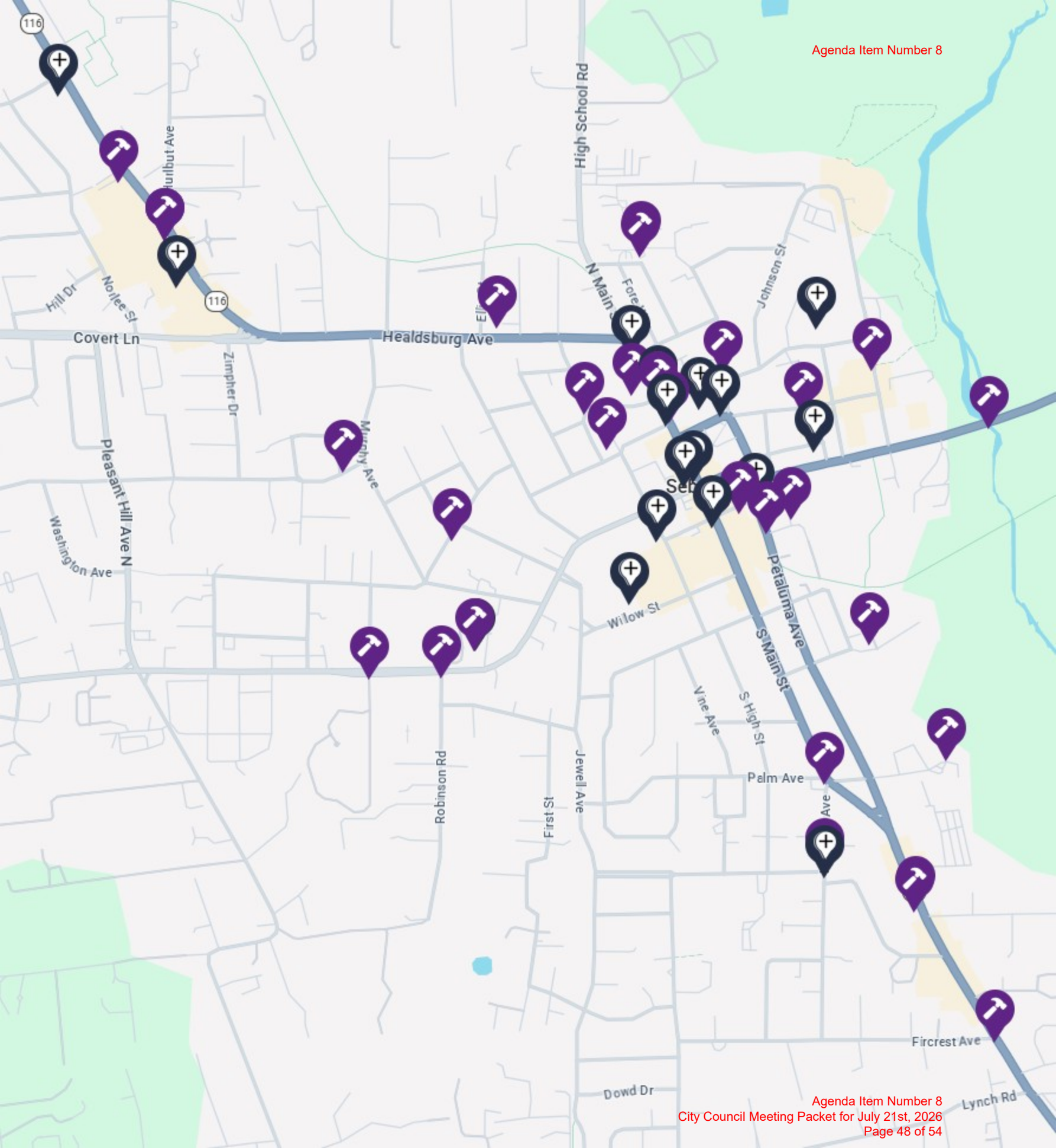

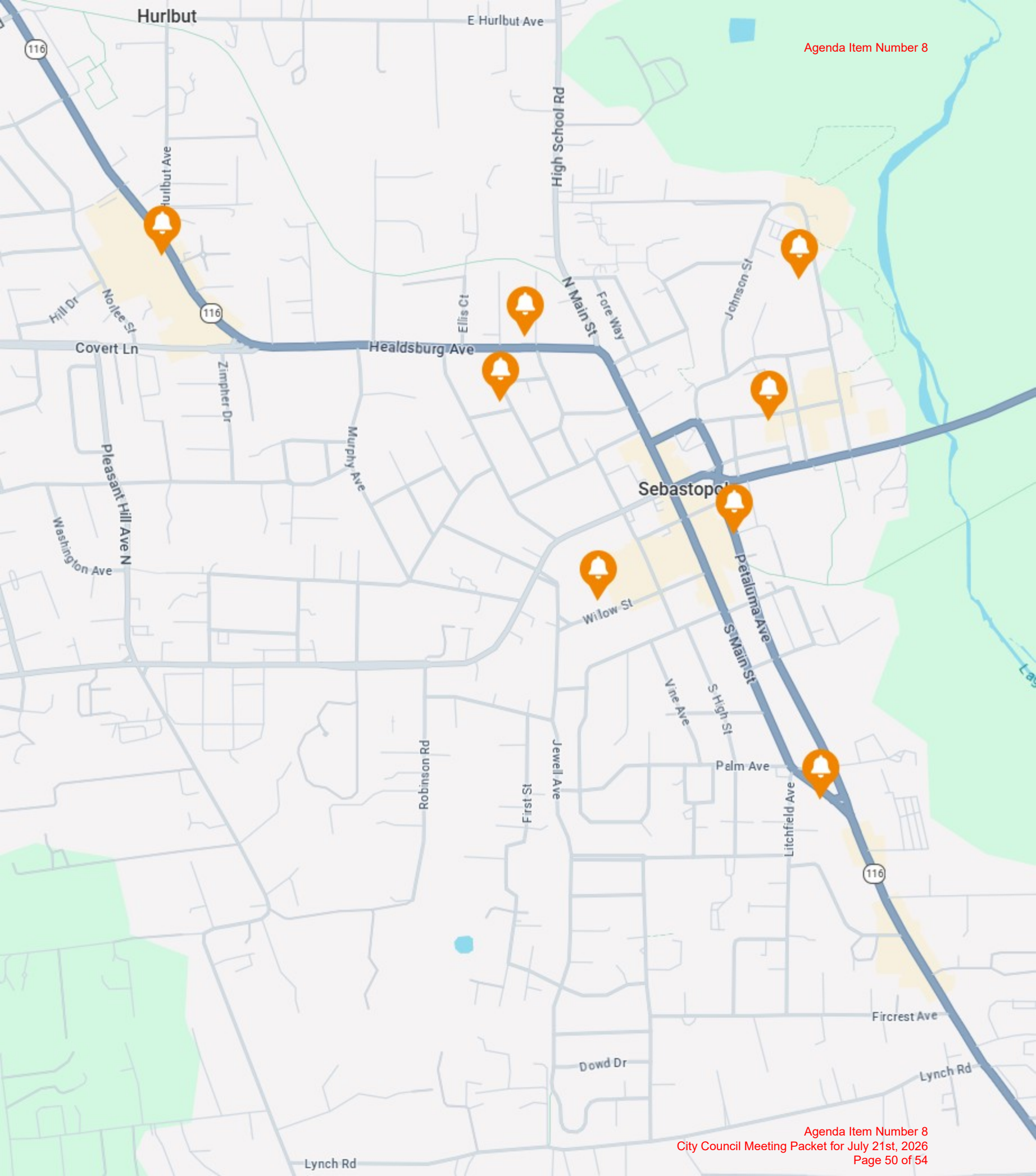

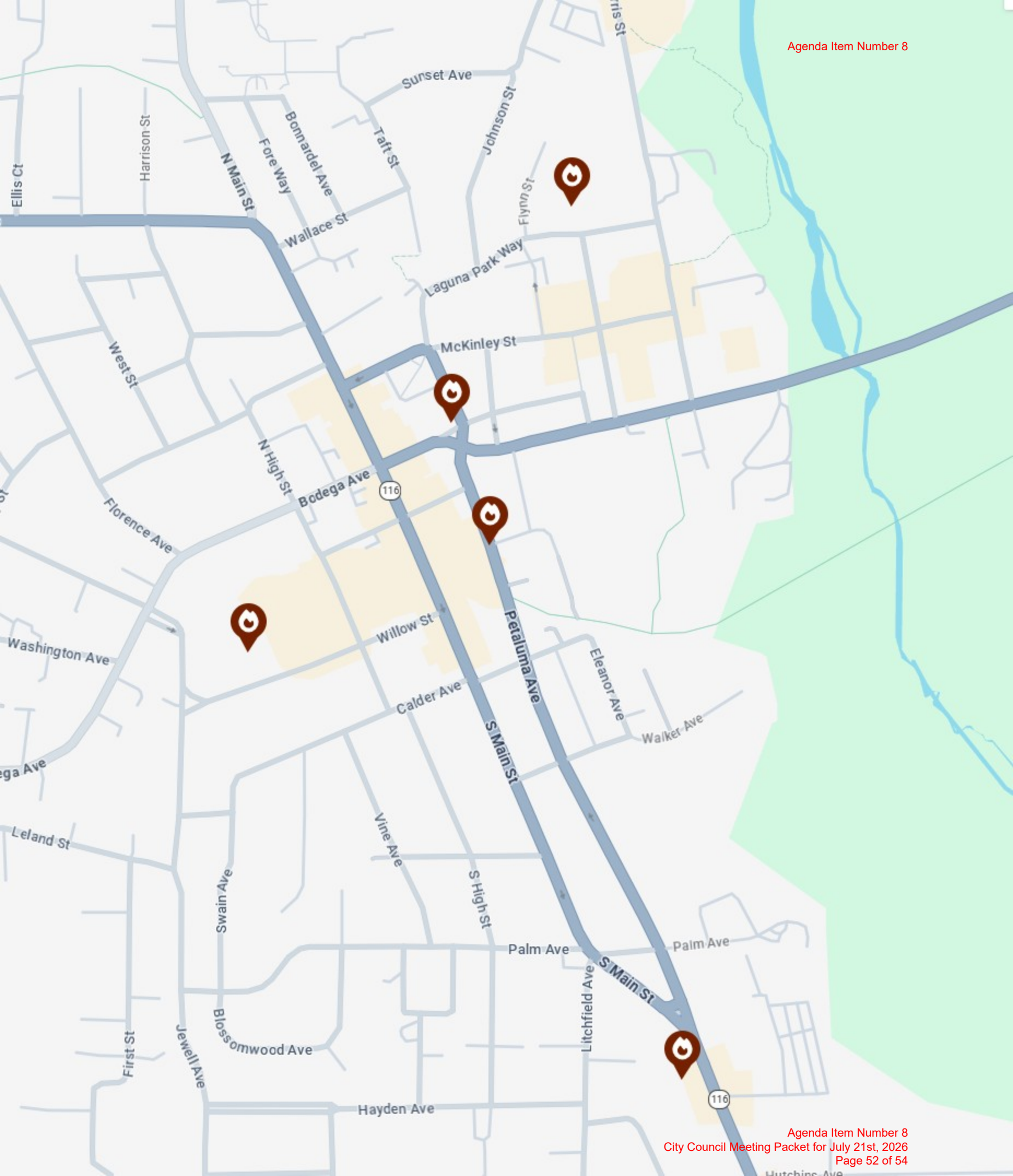

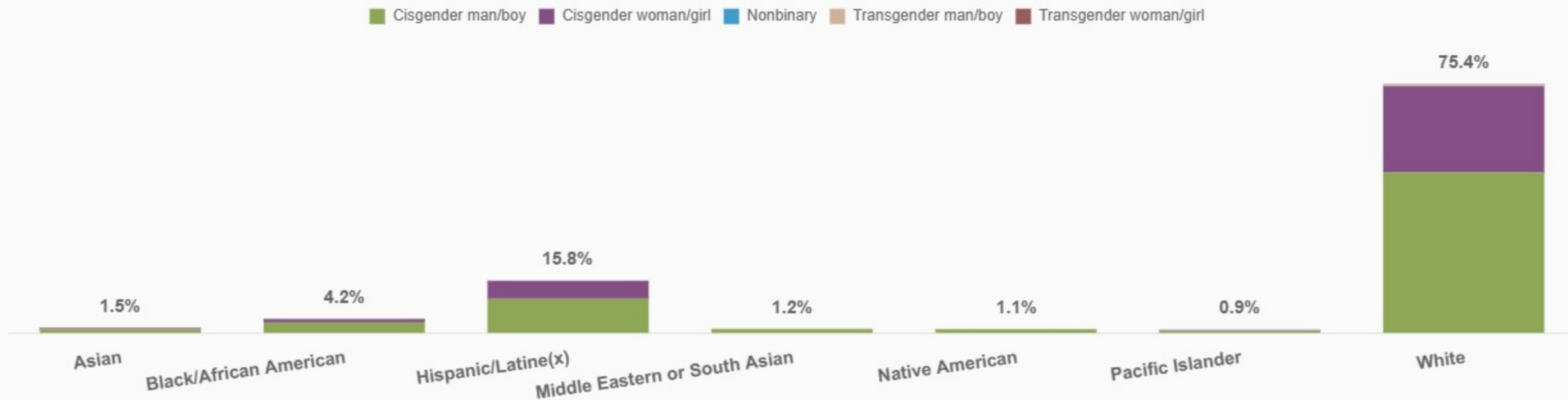
