SUMMARY

Administered by the California Strategic Growth Council (SGC), the **Community Resilience Centers (CRC)** and **Transformative Climate Communities (TCC)** programs fund community-led infrastructure and resilience projects. CRC focuses on upgrading facilities for climate disaster support, while TCC empowers disadvantaged neighborhoods with comprehensive development and anti-displacement strategies.

Key Program & Application Details

- **Applicant Eligibility:** California-based public agencies, Native American tribes, nonprofits, and special districts. Private shareholder corporations are not eligible.
- **Target Areas:** Projects must heavily benefit disadvantaged communities (DACs) identified through CalEnviroScreen.
- **Application Windows:** Both programs run on a competitive cycle closing in late summer, with all final applications due by **September 30** (TCC) and **September 25** (CRC Implementation Grants).

Grant Types & Funding

- **CRC (Round 2):** Offers implementation grants ranging from \$1 million to \$10 million over a six-year grant term. Planning grants are also available for pre-development work.

- **TCC (Round 6):** Awards approximately \$98.4 million across three distinct grant types:
 - **Planning Grants:** Support community-led scoping.
 - **Project Development Grants:** Fund pre-development to bridge planning and infrastructure.
 - **Implementation Grants:** Fund multi-faceted, coordinated neighborhood projects.

Technical Assistance (TA)

Both programs provide free application **Technical Assistance** to eligible applicants (with priority given to Tribal applicants and disadvantaged unincorporated communities).
